This has reference to your letter dated October 12, 2023, seeking for confirmation if your recommendations regarding planned improvement and layout were incorporated in the design of the CDO Coastal Road Project, particularly at the Gusa – Puerto Section.

Please be informed that the required vertical clearance and dimensions of the receiving facility, as set by your office, were already considered in our design concept for the Project. Please note however, that the alignment of the proposed viaduct was transferred 42 meters farther from the sea side (*see Figure 3*), just outside the property line of the Gothong Port. Thus, your causeway/ pipe trestle could be lengthened and your proposed location of the mooring dolphin may have to be transferred.

It is informed further that the alignment of the CDO Coastal Road for sections that are not yet funded, including the section fronting your property, is still indicative in nature, which could be subjected to revision depending on what suits the actual site condition.

Attached is the conceptual plan for the section fronting your property, for your reference.

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


Figure 1. PDOC proposal based on old alignment




Figure 2. PDOC proposal based on old alignment (if vertical clearance requirements are not met)

All commitments, mitigating measures and monitoring requirements, contained in the Environmental Performance Report and Management Plan (EPRMP) for the EXISTING AND EXPANSION OF FUEL/OIL STORAGE AND SUPPLY TERMINAL PROJECT particularly in the Environmental Management Plan/ Environmental Monitoring Plan, including any modifications and/or additional information as approved by the EMB, shall be instituted to minimize any adverse impact of the project to the environment throughout its implementation, which shall include among others to wit:

- 1. Conduct an effective Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Program to inform and educate all stakeholders, especially its contractors, workers, and local residents about the mitigating measures embodied in its EPRMP, the conditions stipulated in this Certificate and the environmental and human safety features of the project for greater awareness, understanding and sustained acceptance of the project. The program shall be submitted to EMB-Region 10 on an annual basis:
- 2. Implement a Comprehensive Social Development Program (SDP) and submit a separate report together with the Compliance Monitoring Report (CMR) to the EMB-Region 10 on a semi-annual basis;
- 3. In support of the National Greening Program, mitigation of Greenhouse Gases (GHG) emissions and production of engineered lumber made of bamboo to answer the national demands of lumber materials, the proponent shall plant at least 25 hills of giant bamboo and 25 other tree species in available spaces of the project site or in coordination with the concerned DENR Office for available planting area. The tree planting plan shall be submitted to EMB-Region 10 within three (3) months from the issuance of this ECC after which a quarterly compliance progress report shall be included in the quarterly SMR;
- 4. Install a Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC's) emission control equipment;
- 5. The project proponent shall designate a Pollution Control Officer (PCO) who should be accredited by EMB to take charge on the environment-related aspects of the project in addition to the monitoring requirements as specified in the Environmental Management Plan (EMP)/Environmental Monitoring Plan (EMoP) such as but not limited to the following:
 - a. Monitoring actual project impacts vis-à-vis the predicted impacts and management measures in the EPRMP;
 - b. Regular submission of semi-annual ECC Compliance Monitoring Reports provided with supporting documents pursuant to the guidelines set forth in DAO 2003-30 (IRR of P.D. 1586)
 - c. Ensure that all permits/clearances from other concerned government agencies are secured and in place relative to the implementation of the project;

- d. Submit quarterly environmental monitoring report using the prescribed format of the Self Monitoring Report (SMR) pursuant to DAO 2003-27
- e. In case of abandonment of the project, submit abandonment Plan three (3) months prior to the abandonment activities. It shall include rehabilitation measures/clean-up, costs, remediation of areas possibly contaminated with toxic/hazardous substances and presentation of options on the proposed alternative projects in the area.
- 6. Measures to minimize soil erosion, siltation, and turbidity of affected water body during construction and operation shall be undertaken;
- 7. Noise, dust emission, and other forms of nuisance emitted during project implementation shall be adequately controlled/isolated within the project site. Dump trucks loaded with filling materials shall be covered with tarpaulin canvas or jute sacks to prevent dust and spillage along road routes;
- 8. Waste materials generated during construction and installation shall be disposed of properly and never to be dumped on any land or waterbody;
- 9. Plant's facility shall be established attaining the appropriate fire-safety distance, setbacks, and buffers between structures and boundaries. Adequate fire-fighting facilities (e.g. fire-hydrants, sprinkler systems) shall be provided for the project;
- All Effluent from the project operation shall conform with the standards set in DAO 2016-008 for, TSS, Oil & Grease, Benzene, Toluene, Ethylbenzene, Xylene, & Benzo (a) pyrene;
 - 11. All domestic wastewater generated from the office, canteen, warehouse & other buildings shall be channeled to the Domestic Wastewater Treatment Facility which effluent shall conform which standards set in DAO 2016-08 for BOD, TSS, Ammonia, Ph, Nitrate, Phosphate Oil and Grease, Surfactants and Fecal Coliform ;
 - 12. The operation of Tank Farm project shall be checked regularly to prevent leakage of petroleum products and may cause fire accident and other similar incidents;
 - 13. Further, the proponent shall immediately inform the EMB-10 of said incident and of the remedial measures undertaken within twenty four (24) hours from its occurrence;



Greetings from the Department of Information and Communications Technology 10!

DICT 10 is currently implementing the Cagayan de Oro Government Network (CDO GovNet) Project which aims to connect at least 98 government offices within the city comprising National Government Agency and Local Government Unit offices using Fiber Optic Technologies to the Internet. The project will enhance the digital landscape of government offices in the city which shall eventually improve the governance notwithstanding that this is among the priority of the Marcos' Administration which is Digital Connectivity.

Based on the plan, Fiber Optic Cable will traverse via JR Borja Bridge. While securing the applicable permits for the project, it was made known that a Right of Way issue along JR Borja Bridge is becoming a constraint due to its ownership. Neither DPWH X nor LGU CDO has legal authority to issue permits; however, in a joint meeting held last March 26, 2024 with DPWH X, LGU CDO and DICT 10, DPWH X endeavors to take necessary actions to institutionalize the ownership of the bridge to LGU CDO.

We understand that the official transfer may take some time but we seek the immediate resolution of this issue to meet our expected target of activating the Internet connectivity to the offices by the end of June 2024. In the exigency of service, it is in this regard that we seek the approval of the City Mayor and the CDO City Council to allow the passing of our Fiber Optic Cable along JR Borja Bridge. It is important that we are able to pass through the bridge for us to provide the needed connectivity from District 1 to the beneficiary offices in District 2. Having negligible weight versus the bridge construction, we believe that our Fiber Optic Cable will possess no harm to its structural integrity.


At the onset, the said subdivision project has been affected and/or distorted by the flood control project of the government which specifically erased the saleable residential lots 9-10 in block 7 including a portion of road lot 5. As a result, the adjacent residential blocks 4, 5,6,11 are still unsold; the remaining portion of road lot 5 and road lot 7 can no longer be used as ingress and/or egress; and block 8 which the open spaces are located have been wrongly used due to presence of structures or nuisances.

In view of the foregoing and to the present circumstances, the application for consolidation by CD Corporation can be approved without the consent of the **Homeowners Association/Homeowners** of the project - for it has already been secured and/or subsumed during the commencement and completion of the flood control project in line with Section 22 of Presidential Decree (PD 957). In similar manner, the owner/developer shall replace/relocate the open space(s) as form part and parcel of the agreement or memorandum of agreement between the homeowners association and CD Corporation which will be replaced/relocated in Block 04, Lots 1,3,5 and 7 – said replacement/relocation and agreement are in cognizant with Presidential Decree (PD) 1216.

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# 2 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ROAD SAFETY IN THE CITY OF 3 CAGAYAN DE ORO, IMPOSING PENALTIES TO OFFENDERS, AND 4 APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

5 WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has identified that road traffic injuries
6 are among the top three (3) causes of death for those aged 5-24 years old;

WHEREAS, in the Philippines, the number of road crashes in the Philippines has
been steadily increasing since 2006, with road crashes being among the leading causes
of death of children in the country;

WHEREAS, the Cagayan De Oro City Police Office – Traffic Enforcement Unit
 recorded high numbers of road crashes resulting in death, injuries, and damage to
 property, with 5,882 road crashes in 2019, 49 of which resulted in deaths, 1,666 crashes
 that led to physical injuries, and 4,167 resulting in damage to property, with 49 road
 crashes involving children;

15 WHEREAS, while the City Government of Cagayan de Oro has adopted 16 ordinances designed to promote road safety, it recognizes the need to improve the 17 enforcement of existing road safety ordinances and introduce new interventions to 18 further reduce the number of road crashes in the City;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro recognizes that road safety
is a shared responsibility, and that those who design and regulate the roads have as
much responsibility in preventing road injury and deaths as those who use the roads.

## 22 NOW, THEREFORE,

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BE IT ORDAINED by the 20th City Council (Sangguniang Panlungsod) of Cagayan
 de Oro in session assembled that:

# 25 ARTICLE I - GENERAL PROVISIONS

26 SECTION 1. Title - This Ordinance shall be known as the "Road Safety
 27 Ordinance of Cagayan de Oro City."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Principles - It is the policy of the City to ensure the safety of all road users within the territorial jurisdiction of Cagayan de Oro City and to promote public health, safety and convenience. Toward this end, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro adopts the Safe System approach to road safety and recognizes the following principles:

- a. The five (5) road safety pillars, *i.e.* (1) Road Safety Management; (2) Safer Roads
  and Mobility; (3) Safer Vehicles; (4) Safer Road Users; and (5) Post-Crash Response,
  must be strengthened to ensure that road crashes resulting from common human
  error do not result in death or serious injury;
- B. Road safety is a shared responsibility between those who design and regulate the road and those who use the road;
- c. Road safety is a multi-sectoral public health issue that requires the participationof all sectors, including the private sector and civil society organizations;
- 41 d. Road design and setting of speed limits must take into consideration the need to
  42 protect vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, bicycle riders, and motorcycle
  43 riders; and
- e. Known effective interventions must be maximized in order to significantly reducethe number of road crash injuries and fatalities in Cagayan de Oro City.

46 SECTION 3. Interpretation - Words and phrases not defined in this Ordinance
47 shall be given their plain or customary meanings unless the context requires otherwise.
48 All words, phrases, and provisions shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent
49 with the purpose and spirit of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. Coverage - This ordinance shall apply to all road users within or
 passing through Cagayan De Oro City, including but not limited to motor vehicles,
 bicycles and other modes of transportation, the drivers and owners thereof, and
 pedestrians, other private individuals, public officers, public and private entities.

54 SECTION 5. Definition Of Terms - As used in this Ordinance, the following
 55 words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section:

- Alcoholic beverage shall refer to any drink or liquid that contains alcohol that is
  capable of use as a beverage, including, but not limited to, distilled spirits wine,
  beer and other fermented liquors.
- 59 b. **AUVs** shall refer to Asian Utility Vans or vehicles commonly known as FX.
- 60 c. **Blood Alcohol Concentration Level or BAC** shall refer to the measure of the 61 amount of alcohol in a person's blood.
- 62 d. Child or Children shall refer to persons aged 0 to twelve (12) years of age.
- e. Child Restraint System or CRS shall refer to a device capable of accommodating
  a child occupant in a sitting or supine position. It is so designed as to diminish the
  risk of injury to the wearer, in the event of a collision or of abrupt deceleration of
  the vehicle, by limiting the mobility of the child's body.
- 67 f. City shall refer to Cagayan de Oro City created under Republic Act No. 521 (1950).
- 69 g. City Council shall refer to the Cagayan de Oro City Council.
- h. **City Government** shall refer to the City Government of Cagayan De Oro.
- 71 i. City Streets shall refer to roads within the City, roads that connect to the
  72 National and City Roads, and roads that provide inter-barangay connections to
  73 major City infrastructure without traversing national roads, within the jurisdiction
  74 of Cagayan De Oro City, not otherwise designated as National Roads, Barangay
  75 Roads, and Crowded Streets.
- **Crowded streets** shall refer to streets with heavy pedestrian traffic, including all 76 į. streets within a five hundred (500)-meter radius of the perimeter of schools, public 77 transportation terminals, markets, government buildings, churches and other 78 places of worship, recreational places, facilities frequented by the youth, parks, 79 shopping malls, movie houses, hotels, restaurants, and other public places as may 80 be determined by the city. In case of linear strips of crowded areas, the reckoning 81 point for the five hundred (500)- meter radius shall be the first and the last crowded 82 public place. 83
- k. Dangerous drugs and other similar substances shall refer to drugs listed in the
  schedules annexed to the 1961 Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, as amended
  by the I 972 Protocol, and in the schedules annexed to the 1971 Single Convention
  of Psychotropic Substances as enumerated in its attachment which is an integral
  part of Republic Act No. 9165, otherwise known as the "Comprehensive Dangerous
  Drugs Act of 2002» and those that the Dangerous Drugs Board created under the
  same Act may reclassify, add to or remove from the list of dangerous drugs.
- 91 1. Designated Driver shall refer to a person who is designated as the responsible
   92 driver of a vehicle, who by such designation is required to refrain from consuming
   93 alcoholic beverages, in order to safely drive home his/her companions who have
   94 consumed alcoholic beverages.
- 95 m. **Distracted driving** shall refer to the use of mobile communications or 96 entertainment devices by drivers while driving, whether in motion or temporarily

- 97 stopped at a red light, including the use of mobile communications devices or98 electronic entertainment or computing devices, and other similar acts.
- 99 n. **Driver** shall refer to any person operating a motor vehicle.
- 0. Driving under the influence of alcohol- shall refer to the act of operating a motor vehicle while the driver's Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) level has, after being subjected to a breath analyzer test, reached 0. 05% or such level of intoxication as established jointly by the Department of Health (DOH), the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) and the Department of Transportation (DOTr).
- p. Driving under the influence of dangerous drugs and other similar substances shall
   refer to the act of operating a motor vehicle while the driver, after being subjected
   to a confirmatory test as mandated under Republic Act No. 9165, is found to be
   positive for use of any dangerous drug.
- q. Field of view shall refer to the forward view directly through the windshield, rear
  and side views, through the other vehicle windows, as well as the indirect view
  using the side and rear-view mirror provided by the vehicle mirror system.
- r. Fitting service shall refer to the service provided by Type 1 and Type 2 fitters and fitting stations on the proper use and installation of child restraint systems;
- s. Fitting stations shall refer to any agency, office, organization, or institution that
  offers fitting services through a duly trained fitter. A fitting station may be
  stationary or fixed at a location designated for the purpose, such as in the motor
  vehicle inspection area, or mobile to move from place to place to provide fitting
  services in different locations.
- t. Greenway shall refer to a road, street, or path with ample greenery and share
  where private motorized transport is not allowed, and which shall serve as a
  recreational space or a public park in order to encourage active transport such as
  walking and cycling;
- u. Impoundment- shall refer to the act of placing a motor vehicle in a designated impounding area or holding lot by an authorized law enforcement officer.

- w. Lead Office shall refer to the department or agency of the City Government of

   City of Cagayan de Oro, and For Other Purposes";
- Motor Vehicle shall refer to any vehicle propelled by any power other than 135 у. muscular power using the public highways, but excepting road rollers, trolley cars, 136 street- sweepers, sprinklers, lawn mowers, bulldozers, graders, fork-lifts, 137 amphibian trucks, and cranes if not used on public highways, vehicles that run 138 only on rails or tracks, and tractors, trailers and traction engines of all kinds used 139 exclusively for agricultural, horticultural, or livestock raising operations. It shall 140 also refer to private cars, private and public utility jeepneys, private and public 141 utility mini-buses, passenger jeepneys, trucks of all kinds, motorcycles, and 142 tricycles, vans, electric motorcycles, electric cars, and other modes of 143 transportation as may be determined by the Road Safety Working Group. 144
- 145 z. Temporary Operator's Permit or TOP shall refer to the receipt issued by a duly
   146 deputized LTO officer upon confiscation of a driver's license due to a violation of
   147 this Ordinance or any other ordinance of the City Government. The TOP shall serve
   148 as a Temporary Driver's License, valid for five (5) days from the date of issuance.

- aa. Traffic Code shall refer to Cagayan de Oro City Ordinance No. 10551-2007
   entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Traffic Code of the City of Cagayan de
   Pro, Amending Pertinent Provisions of the Codified Ordinance of the City of
   Cagayan de Pro, and For Other Purposes";
- bb. Owner shall refer to the person in whose name the motor vehicle is registered, as indicated on the Certificate of Registration issued by the LTO. The President, in case of corporations or the highest official in case of government agencies shall be considered the owner of motor vehicles registered in the name of corporations or government agencies. In case of failure to present the Official Receipt or Certificate of Registration of the motor vehicle, the driver shall be presumed to be the owner of the motor vehicle.
- 160 cc. **PUVs** shall refer to public utility vehicles.
- 161 dd. Road shall refer to any public highway, street, thoroughfare, alley, boulevard, and
   162 the like within Cagayan De Oro City.
- 163 ee. Transport Network Vehicles or TNVs shall refer to privately owned vehicles
   164 accredited by Transport Network Companies licensed by the Land Transportation
   165 Franchising and Regulatory Board.
- 166 ff. Tricycle shall refer to a motor vehicle for hire duly registered with the Land
  167 Transportation Office (LTO) composed of a motorcycle with not more than two (2)
  168 cylinders or 500cc engine capacity, fitted with a single-wheeled side car or two169 wheeled cab, closed van or open cart, whether powered by gasoline or electricity.
- gg. Trisikad refers to bicycle with sidecar used for ferrying or transporting passengers, goods, things or cargoes for a fee.
- hh. **TCT** refers to the Traffic Citation Ticket.

# 173 ARTICLE II - ROAD SAFETY

**SECTION 6.** *Lead Road Safety Office; Designation* – The Roads and Traffic Administration (RTA), as created under the Traffic Code, is hereby designated as the lead department/office in all road safety-related activities of Cagayan de Oro City. However, as the workload of the Lead Office Department increases due to the massive implementation of the requirements set forth under the Road Safety Ordinance as well as the maintenance of its equipment and facilities, the RTA may be allowed to create a new division mainly to handle the entire scope of Road Safety activities.

181 SECTION 7. Mandate - The Lead Department/Office is hereby tasked to
 182 oversee, enforce, and implement the Road Safety Ordinance of Cagayan de Oro City
 183 and all other initiatives and activities related to or arising from road safety laws, policies,
 184 and programs of the City.

185 SECTION 8. Functions and Powers - The Lead Department/Office, in addition to
 186 other functions under other ordinances, orders, or policy issuances, shall have the
 187 following functions:

## 188 A. Enforcement

- a. Enforce this Ordinance through coordination with local and national agencies and law enforcement officers, through the apprehension of offending persons/motor vehicles, issuance of Traffic Citation Tickets (TCTs), and the resolution of protests, without prejudice to the authority of the RTA to enforce traffic rules and regulations;
- b. Assign traffic law enforcement officers in sufficient number for the effective enforcement of this Ordinance within the City;

Coordinate with the LTO, Cagayan De Oro City Police Office (COCPO), other 196 С. PNP Unit, barangay officials, and other deputized traffic law enforcement 197 officers to harmonize deployment and field operations within the City; 198 Train traffic law enforcement officers for the enforcement of this Ordinance, d. 199 in coordination with the LTO; and 200 Cause the installation of road signs as provided hereunder. 201 e. Β. **Planning and Coordination** 202 Serve as Chair of the Road Safety Working Group (RSWG); 203 a. b. Convene the Road Safety Working Group once every quarter or oftener as 204 205 necessary; Spearhead the development of the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action 206 С. Plan and the review and updating thereof every five (5) years, in coordination 207 with the Members of Road Safety Working Group; 208 Conduct regular planning and coordination meetings with relevant offices d. 209 and agencies to discuss and coordinate on issues related to road safety; 210 Act as depository of local laws, rules, and regulations related to road safety, 211 e. 212 including resolutions adopted by barangays and other local offices or 213 agencies; f. Periodically review road safety laws and regulations and submit 214 recommendations to the City Council to improve the road safety in the City; 215 Conduct capacity-building trainings, seminars, and workshops on road 216 g. safety; 217 Coordinate with the LTO for integration with the LTO information technology h. 218 system in relation to the uploading of information on drivers and owners who 219 fail to settle fines and other penalties under this ordinance. Where integration 220 with the LTO information technology system has not yet been established, 221 the Lead Department/Office shall submit a quarterly report to the Regional 222 LTO containing the relevant information; and 223 Submit an annual budget plan for road safety to the City Council. 224 i. **C**. Monitoring and Evaluation 225 Collect road crash data, including road crash fatalities, injuries and other 226 а. relevant information and submit such data, annually, to the City Mayor and 227 the Committee on Public Utilities (Roads and Traffic Management) of the City 228 Council: 229 b. Monitor the implementation of the Cagavan De Oro City Road Safety Action 230 Plan in coordination with the Road Safety Working Group and submit an 231 232 annual report to the City Mayor and the Committee on Public Utilities (Roads and Traffic Management) of the City Council; 233 Monitor the implementation of this Ordinance; and 234 C. Conduct periodic evaluations of the impact of this Ordinance and the d. 235 236 Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan on the number of road crashes, road crash injuries and fatalities, and other outcomes as may be determined 237 by the Road Safety Working Group. 238 Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Campaign and Other Tasks D. 239 240 Conduct public information, education, and communication (IEC) campaigns a. 241 on the enforcement of this Ordinance, the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety 242 Action Plan, and road safety in general, in accordance with an IEC plan to be

developed by the Road Safety Working Group which shall include activities

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- to promote the City's road safety advocacy through different media including
  but not limited to maximizing the City Government's website and social
  media platforms to promote the City's road safety advocacy;
- b. Coordinate with the Department of Education (DepEd) for the integration ofroad safety into the curriculum of schools within the City;
- c. Perform other tasks as may be assigned by the City Mayor for the purpose ofimplementing this Ordinance; and
- d. Develop and circulate a manual of local safety ordinances for the guidanceof traffic law enforcement officers.

SECTION 9. Road Safety Working Group (RSWG) Creation, Mandate – There
 is hereby created the Road Safety Working Group (RSWG), which shall develop, monitor,
 and evaluate the implementation of this Ordinance and the Cagayan de Oro City Road
 Safety Action Plan.

- 257 SECTION 10. Composition The Road Safety Working Group shall be composed258 of the following members:
- 259 a. Chairperson Committee on Public Utilities (Roads and Traffic Management), City260 Council;
- 261 b. City Administrator's Office;
- 262 c. City Budget Office;
- 263 d. City Legal Office;
- e. City General Services Office (Procurement, Acquisition and Awards Division);
- 265 f. City Engineer's Office;
- 266 g. Office of the Building Officials;
- 267 h. City Planning and Development Office;
- 268 i. City Disaster and Risk Reduction and Management Department;
- 269 j. Roads and Traffic Administration
- 270 k. Cagayan De Oro City Police Office;
- 271 l. President, Liga ng mga Barangay;
- 272 m. Land Transportation Office;
- 273 n. Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board;
- o. Xavier University Ateneo De Cagayan;
- 275 p. University of Science and Technology of Southern Philippines
- 276 q. Department of Public Works and Highways, Region 10;
- 277 r. Department of Education; and
- 278 s. Transport groups, associations and advocacy groups representing PUJ Operators
  279 & Drivers, Motorela Operators & Drivers, Motorcycle Riders, Cyclists, Commuters,
  280 Persons with Disabilities, and the like.

The Road Safety Working Group may invite and call on the participation of the following offices as necessary in the Road Safety Working Group regular meeting, with respect to technical matters falling within their jurisdiction and/or areas of expertise, such as:

- 285 a. Peace and Order Council;
- 286 b. Community Affairs Office;
- 287 c. Philippine National Police; and
- 288 d. Highway Patrol Group.

The Road Safety Working Group may coordinate with other local departments and national government agencies as necessary for the implementation of this Ordinance and the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan.

292 Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance and every quarter 293 thereafter, the Road Safety Working Group shall be convened.

SECTION 11. Coordination - The Road Safety Working Group shall meet every 294 quarter or as often as necessary duly convened by the Lead Department/Office. Within 295 fifteen (15) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance, all members of the Road Safety 296 Working Group shall submit to the Lead Department/Office the names of one (1) 297 permanent and two (2) alternate representatives who shall be responsible for 298 participating in all meetings of the Road Safety Working Group on behalf of their 299 department or office. The Lead Department/Office shall be notified in writing of any 300 changes in the assigned representatives at least ten (10) days prior to the next quarterly 301 302 meeting.

**SECTION 12. Budget**- The Lead Department/Office shall submit an annual budget plan to the City Council with specific appropriations for equipment, human resources, and operations as will be specified hereunder. The budget allotted for the operations of the Road Safety Working Group shall be included in the Lead Department/Office's budget plan.

**SECTION 13.** *Cagayan de Oro City Road Safety Action Plan -* Within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Ordinance, the Road Safety Working Group shall formulate the Cagayan de Oro City Road Safety Action Plan, which shall contain the specific details and information on the following:

- a. Vision;
- 313 b. Interim (5-year) targets;
- 314 c. Objectives;
- 315 d. Strategies;
- **316** e. Activities;
- 317 f Projected outcomes;
- 318 g. Expected outputs;
- 319 h. Responsible office or person; and
- i. Estimated budget.

**SECTION 14.** *Evaluation* - The Lead Department/Office shall ensure that the Road Safety Working Group monitors and evaluates the implementation of this Ordinance and the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan once every quarter, and shall submit an annual report to the City Mayor and the City Council on the implementation of this Ordinance and the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan.

Every five (5) years, the Road Safety Working Group shall review the impact of the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan and update the same, as needed. The Road Safety Working Group shall submit a written report on the outcomes of the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan to the City Mayor and the City Council within three (3) months from the end of the five (5) - year period of the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan.

#### 332 SECTION 15. Road Crash Data Collection.

# A) Data Collection through the Data for Road Incident Visualization Evaluation and Reporting (DRIVER) System.

Unless otherwise provided by the Department of Transportation (DOTr), the Lead Department/Office shall use the DRIVER System for encoding road crash data. Within fifteen (15) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance, the Lead Department/Office shall coordinate with the Department of Transportation (DOTr) on the use of the DRIVER System.

340The Lead Department/Office shall assign a specific division within its341department, which shall oversee collection, monitoring, and analysis of road crash342data. The assigned division shall have at least two (2) analysts who shall be granted343access to the DRIVER System for purposes of encoding and uploading road crash344data.

B) Collection from Other Sources - All TOPs/TCTs shall be submitted by the apprehending law enforcement officer to the Lead Department/Office, within 24 hours from the time of issuance thereof.

The Lead Department/Office shall collect road crash data from police reports and other data sources such as hospitals, barangay reports, etc. and shall monitor and evaluate the impact of this Ordinance on the number of road crashes, road crash fatalities and injuries, and traffic flow. The Lead Department/Office shall likewise collect data on the number of apprehensions, fines collected, cases resolved, and other relevant data pertaining to the enforcement of this Ordinance.

Other enforcement data and results of monitoring and evaluation shall be maintained in a database by the Lead Department/Office and submitted to the Office of the City Mayor and City Council, on or before 30 January of the succeeding year, and annually thereafter, for purposes of the development of road safety policies.

- 359 C) Minimum data to be collected The responding and/or reporting officer shall record
   360 all relevant data related to the crash including, but not limited to the following:
- 361 a. Date and time of occurrence;
- 362 b. Location address, landmarks, and coordinates if available;
- c. Name of people involved;
- d. Number of people involved;
- 365 e. Age of people involved;
- f. Involvement of children (ages 0.-12);
- 367 g. Gender of people involved;
- h. Cause of collision;
- 369 i. Collision type;
- 370 J. Severity (fatal, injury, property damage);
- 371 k. Vehicle or road user type;
- When available, contact information of caller for calls made through City
   Emergency Hotline.
- D) Utilization of CCTV Network for Road Crash Data Collection The Lead
   Department/Office, in coordination with the City Disaster Risk Reduction and
   Management Department, shall as necessary, utilize the City's Closed Circuit
   Television (CCTV) network for road crash data collection in coordination with
   Cagayan de Oro City's Command Center. When necessary, the Lead
   Department/Office shall request access to the relevant barangay's CCTV network for
   road crash data collection.
- 381 SECTION 16. Coordination with National Government Agencies.-
- A) Coordination on Road Safety and Traffic Policies The Lead Department/Office shall align its road safety and traffic policies with the policies, rules, and regulations of the DOTr, LTO and the PNP. The Lead Department/Office shall ensure that the relevant national government agencies are duly notified of policies in Cagayan De Oro City by furnishing them with copies of this Ordinance, the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety Action Plan, other relevant ordinances and/or resolutions, and succeeding issuances.
- B) Coordination on Deployment of Law Enforcement Officers The Lead
   Department/Office shall regularly monitor the deployment of law enforcement
   officers on national roads passing through the City.
- The Lead Department/Office shall ensure that the City has an adequate number of law enforcement officers and that an adequate number of law enforcement officers are deployed in critical areas. For this purpose, the Lead Department/Office shall regularly secure copies of the deployment schedule and deployment plan of the LTO and PNP.

#### 397 SECTION 17. Citizen's Reports -

A) Road Safety Reporting System - The Lead Department/Office shall establish and operate a road safety reporting system where citizens may directly file their complaints and/or requests regarding any concern related to road safety, including but not limited to the following:

- 402a)Repair, maintenance or improvement of city and barangay roads, including403the installation of street lights, road signs and other road furniture;
- 404b)Road obstruction, road hazards and other encroachments on roads and405sidewalks; or
- 406 c) Any violation of this Code by a private person or entity or public official407 tasked with enforcement of this Code.
- B) Minimum Information on Complaint Form The Lead Department/Office shall make
   available in its main office and satellite posts, complaint forms that shall contain the
   following minimum information:
- 411 a. Name of complainant;
- 412 b. Nature of complaint;
- c. Background information about the complaint, allowing photos or supportingevidence to be attached;
- d. Location; and
- e. Desired outcome of the complainant.
- 417 C) Initial Report of Action Taken The Lead Department/Office shall respond to the
   418 complaint filed within fifteen (15) days from receipt thereof with an initial report of
   419 actions taken.
- 420 ARTICLE III SAFER ROADS AND MOBILITY
- 421 SECTION 18. Road Inventory and Classification.-
- A) Road Inventory The City Engineer's Office, working jointly with the City Roads and Traffic Administration (Traffic Engineering Division) shall be responsible for updating the local road inventory every three (3) years or whenever a local road is converted to a national road and vice versa, and coordinating with the DPWH to update the inventory of national roads. The City Engineer's Office shall submit annual reports on any conversions or changes made to the road inventory to the Lead Department/Office.
- B) Road Classification The City Engineer's Office shall be responsible for updating the
  local road inventory to reflect the accurate classification of roads every time a local
  road is reclassified. The City Engineer's Office shall report on any conversions or
  changes made to the road classifications in the road inventory to the Road Safety
  Working Group.
- The classification of roads shall be reviewed every three (3) years.

435 SECTION 19. Road Audit and Crash Risk-Mapping – The RTA shall, in
 436 coordination with the DPWH:

437 a. Conduct a complete road audit of all roads within jurisdiction to identify road
438 hazards and other obstructions, encroachments, the demarcation of sidewalks on
439 local roads and national roads passing through the City, and to ensure that all
440 roads are installed with appropriate road signages and road furniture, in
441 compliance with the DPWH Manual on Highway Safety Design Standards; and

b. Conduct crash-risk mapping using the data collected from road crash investigationin Section 4, Article VI.

Within three (3) months from the effectivity of this Ordinance and every three (3)
years thereafter, the RTA shall submit a report on the road audit, crash mapping, and
the recommended action to the Road Safety Working Group.

**SECTION 20.** *Road Safety Impact Assessment* – (a) All new construction projects, road works, and similar activities shall be required to undergo a Road Safety Impact Assessment by the RTA. Prior to the commencement of any construction activity, roadwork or other similar activities, the project contractor and/or project manager shall submit a certificate of assessment issued by the RTA to the Lead Department/Office. No building permit shall be issued by the OBO without first complying with the requirement of conducting a Road Safety Impact Assessment.

(b) The Road Safety Impact Assessment shall also include a Road Safety
Management Plan to ensure that road safety risks will be minimized or avoided in the
conduct of construction activities, road works, and similar activities. The Road Safety
Management Plan shall be strictly followed in the performance of the construction
facility, roadwork or similar activities. Non-compliance with the approved Road Safety
Management Plan shall cause for suspension of the said construction activity, roadwork
or other similar activities.

461 (c) All projects requiring a Traffic Management Plan (TMP) and/or Traffic Impact462 Assessment (TIA) shall also require Road Safety Impact Assessment.

463 SECTION 21. Exemption - All construction projects, road works, and similar
 464 activities on private roads owned by private subdivisions or villages are exempted from
 465 the requirement of undergoing a Road Safety Impact Assessment. The exemption does
 466 not extend to public roads inside private subdivisions or villages turned over to the City
 467 Government.

#### 468 SECTION 22. Road Design, Maintenance and Improvement -

- A) Road Design New roads shall comply with the design standards prescribed under
   the latest DPWH Design Guidelines, Criteria and Standards Manual. The City
   Engineer's Office shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with the DPWH
   standards.
- 473 All local roads shall bear appropriate instructional signages.
- B) Prohibition of Removal, Defacement, Unauthorized Alteration or Installation of Road
  Signs The removal, defacement, or any unauthorized alteration or installation of
  road signs is prohibited.
- 477 SECTION 23. Road Maintenance -
- A) Maintenance of National Roads The City Engineer's Office shall coordinate with the DPWH for the maintenance and repair of national roads passing through the City. Nothing in this Ordinance shall prevent the Lead Department/Office from conducting urgent and necessary repairs on the said national roads, subject to coordination with DPWH.
- B) Maintenance of Local Roads The City Engineer's Office, in coordination with the
  City Roads and Traffic Administration, shall be responsible for the maintenance and
  repair of city and barangay roads to ensure that they are safe and expose no risk to
  road users, as verified through the road audit and inventory and in compliance with
  the design standards of DPWH.

Barangays shall coordinate with the City Engineer's Office for the maintenanceand repair of barangay roads.

#### 490 SECTION 24. Road Improvement -

- A) Improvement of National Roads The Lead Department/Office shall recommend road
  improvement activities and other road design measures that are necessary to ensure
  road safety on national roads to the City Engineer's Office. The City Engineer's Office
  shall be responsible for coordinating with the DPWH for the improvement of national
  roads passing through the City. Nothing in this Ordinance shall prevent the City
  Engineer's Office from conducting improvement activities and adopting road design
  measures on such national roads, in coordination with the DPWH.
- B) Improvement of Local Roads The Lead Department/Office shall recommend road improvement activities and other road design measures that are necessary to ensure road safety on local roads to the City Engineer's Office. The City Engineer's Office shall be responsible for implementing said road improvement activities and road design measures. Nothing in this Ordinance shall prevent the City Engineer's Office from conducting road improvement and activities pursuant to its regular functions.
- C) Road Safety Infrastructure, Road Signs and Road Furniture The RTA shall ensure that all city and barangay roads have necessary road infrastructure, furniture, markings, rumble strips, speed bumps, and other traffic calming devices, and other cost- effective measures to promote road safety for all types of road users and to prevent speeding or reckless driving.
- The City Engineer's Office shall also be responsible for the installation of 509 signages, lamp posts, CCTV network posts and billboards, painting of sidewalks, 510 pedestrian lanes and similar markings, installation of waiting sheds and other road 511 furniture, and the undertaking of similar road safety measures, subject to the 512 approval of the City Planning and Development Coordinator's Office and in 513 coordination with the barangays. All road signs must be in accordance with the 514 DPWH Manual on Highway Safety Design Standards and/or other accepted 515 international design standards. The City Engineering Department, in coordination 516 with the Lead Department/Office, shall remove and replace all road signs that fail to 517 comply with the DPWH standards. 518
- The Lead Department/Office may recommend, from time to time, the installation or construction of other road infrastructure, furniture, signages and other measures to the City Engineer's Office, when necessary to improve road safety.
- 523 All measures implemented shall comply with policies on "green or cost-524 efficient, environment-friendly engineering.
- 525 D) **Monitoring and Management of Heavy Equipment Vehicles** The City Engineer's 526 Office and RTA shall be responsible for monitoring heavy equipment vehicles 527 passing through the local roads in Cagayan De Oro City. The City Engineer's Office 528 shall also ensure that all city and barangay roads have capacity to accommodate 529 heavy equipment vehicles.
- SECTION 25. Sustainable Urban Planning and Zoning The Lead
   Department/Office shall render the necessary support to the City Planning and
   Development Office (CPDO) in implementing zoning regulations. The Lead
   Department/Office shall closely coordinate with the CPDO to ensure that zoning
   regulations are in line with road safety policies and will not create road safety risks.
- SECTION 26. Inclusive and People-Oriented Mobility The Lead
   Department/Office shall accord the highest priority to the development of proper
   sidewalks and networks of bicycle lanes that will encourage active transport and provide
   safe and direct access to road users to priority destinations such as housing, education,
   health, and business centers, and public transport nodes.
- 540 A) Pedestrian Lanes

- a) Frequency. Within three (3) months from the effectivity of this Ordinance, the
  Lead Department/Office, in coordination with the RTA shall identify all city roads
  with high pedestrian volume and cause the installation of pedestrian lanes with
  appropriate signages on said road.
- The Lead Department/Office shall prioritize school zones in installing pedestrian lanes and shall, whenever practicable, install elevated or trapezoidal pedestrian lanes for speed management purposes.

548Within the same period, the Punong Barangay of all barangays in Cagayan549De Oro City shall identify all barangay roads with high pedestrian volume and550shall submit their respective findings and recommendations to the Lead551Department/Office. The recommendations must specify road signages and other552road furniture needed to improve the safety of pedestrians on said barangay553roads.

- 554 Every intersection, school zone, marketplace, place of worship, 555 government agency or office, and all other places as may be determined by the 556 Road Safety Working Group, shall have pedestrians lanes, crosswalks, or 557 footbridges, as may be deemed necessary by the RTA and subject to compliance 558 with the appropriate DPWH standards.
- b) Right of Way of Pedestrians The driver of any motor vehicle shall yield the right
  of way to a pedestrian crossing within a crosswalk or pedestrian crossing, except
  at intersections where the movement of traffic is being regulated by a traffic law
  enforcement officer or by a traffic signal.
- 563 A driver approaching a pedestrian crossing shall slow down and stop, as 564 necessary, to allow pedestrians to cross within the crosswalk.
- 565 c) Prohibition on Using, Straddling or Obstructing Pedestrian Lanes A driver shall
  566 not permit any portion of his or her vehicle to obstruct any portion of the
  567 pedestrian lane. At no time shall any vehicle use, straddle, or obstruct the
  568 designated pedestrian lane.
- This provision shall apply to all motor vehicles including motorcycles and electronic bikes.

#### 571 B) Bicycle Lanes

- a) Installation of Bicycle Lanes Within three (3) months from the effectivity of this
  Ordinance, the RTA and DPWH shall identify roads that can accommodate the
  installation of bicycle lanes.
- 575Within the same period, the Lead Department/Office shall, in consultation576with the stakeholders, identify priority areas for the installation of bicycle lanes577and submit its recommendations to the City Planning and Development Office.

The City Planning and Development Office, in coordination with the Lead Department/Office and the City Engineer's Office, shall assist the compliance of the safety standards in the installation of bicycle lanes on such roads identified by the Lead Department/Office and the City Engineer's Office. The bicycle lanes shall, as far as practicable, be protected or exclusively dedicated to bicycles. At the minimum, the bicycle lanes shall be appropriately marked and shall comply with the DPWH Manual on Highway Safety Design Standards.

The Lead Department/Office, in coordination with the City Engineer's Office, shall install appropriate road signs, banners, and other safety features to ensure the safety of bicyclists on bicycle lanes, in accordance with the DPWH 588 Manual on Highway Safety Design Standards and/ or other accepted 589 international design standards.

590The City Engineer's Office shall assist the Lead Department/Office in591setting and indicating the reasonable targets for the number of kilometers of592bicycle lanes to be installed every year in the Cagayan De Oro City Road Safety593Action Plan.

The Lead Department/Office, in coordination with the City Planning and Development Office and the City Engineer's Office, shall ensure that at least ten (10) kilometers of bicycle lanes shall be installed annually, for the first five (5) years of the effectivity of this Ordinance.

- b) Prohibition on Using, Straddling or Blocking Bicycle Lanes No driver shall permit any portion of his or her vehicle to block any portion of the bicycle lane. At no time shall any vehicle use, straddle, or obstruct the designated bicycle lane.
- 601This provision shall apply to all motor vehicles including motorcycles and602electronic bikes.
- c) Parking Areas for Bicycles and Facilities for Cyclists The City Planning and 603 Development Office, in coordination with the Lead Department/Office and the 604 City Engineer's Office, shall as far as practicable, designate parking areas for 605 bicycles, install bike racks, and implement other measures that promote cycling. 606 Commercial establishments open to the public such as malls, supermarkets, 607 groceries, banks, restaurants and other similar establishments with parking 608 spaces for motor vehicles in the City shall also be required to provide bicycle 609 parking where bicycles can be safely and securely parked. 610

#### 611 C) Road Design and Better Transport Alternatives for Persons with Disabilities 612 and Other Groups with Special Needs.

613 Within three (3) months from the effectivity of this Ordinance, the City 614 Planning and Development Office, City Engineer's Office, and Persons with 615 Disabilities Affairs Office, in coordination with the Lead Department/Office, shall 616 submit proposed plans for road design improvements and better transport 617 alternatives that will cater to persons with disabilities (PWDs) and other groups with 618 special needs, such as pregnant women, senior citizen, and children.

- These measures shall include the widening of sidewalks to accommodate wheelchairs and the provision of ramps, shuttle services and other facilities provided under Batas Pambansa Blg. 344 or the Accessibility Law and other rules and regulations promulgated or issued by the National Council on Disability Affairs, among others, that will increase the accessibility of establishments and promote the mobility of PWDs and other special need groups.
- a) Prohibition against Parking on Designated Parking Slots for Persons with Disabilities and
   Other Groups with Special Needs. It shall be prohibited to park on designated
   parking slots for persons with disabilities and other groups with special needs.

#### 628 D) Use of Sidewalks

- a) Prohibition against use of sidewalks by motor vehicles Sidewalks shall be for the exclusive use of pedestrians. It shall be prohibited for motor vehicles to traverse sidewalks or use the same for any other purpose, unless expressly permitted by the City Mayor and/or the City Council.
- b) Prohibition against blocking of sidewalks for parking or other purposes Unless expressly
   permitted by the City Mayor and/or the City Council, the following are prohibited:

- *i*) Blocking or obstructing any portion of a sidewalk;
- 636 *ii*) Placing goods or items on the sidewalk, parking vehicles in a manner that637 obstructs the sidewalk, and sleeping or squatting thereon; and
- *iii*) Use of any portion of sidewalks for any purpose other than mobility of pedestrians.
- 640 c) Sidewalk-Clearing Operations The Lead Department/Office shall regularly
   641 conduct sidewalk clearing operations. Any obstructions on sidewalks that are
   642 not otherwise authorized by the proper authorities shall be removed
   643 immediately, without prejudice to applicable penalties.
- 644 d) Temporary Sidewalks The Lead Department/Office shall designate temporary
   645 sidewalks in the event of obstruction of sidewalks due to authorized road
   646 improvement or construction activities. The temporary sidewalks shall be
   647 properly marked.
- E) Promotion of Sustainable and Inclusive Mobility Immediately upon the
  implementation of this Ordinance, the Lead Department/Office, in coordination with
  the City Engineer's Office, shall submit the proposed number and location of
  additional pedestrian lanes, bicycle lanes, and other road improvements for PWDs
  and other groups with special needs.

The Lead Department/Office shall also submit recommendations to the City Mayor and/or the City Council to promote active transport within the City, including the development of greenways, car-free zones, and public open spaces, and conduct of IEC activities.

SECTION 27. Road-Clearing Operations - The Lead Department/Office shall 657 regularly conduct road-clearing operations pursuant to city ordinances that provide for 658 and regulate the removal of objects or materials that obstruct the free flow of vehicular 659 traffic and pedestrian passage, including the ordinance that will require and direct the 660 removal of junk motor vehicles, construction and other materials abandoned along the 661 sides of public thoroughfares, roads, city and subdivision streets, within the jurisdiction 662 of Cagayan De Oro City, which are unsightly and obstruct the free flow of vehicular traffic 663 and pedestrian passage, providing penalties for violation hereof and for other purposes. 664

Properties confiscated during road-clearing operations shall be disposed of in accordance with prevailing laws, rules, and regulations, including DPWH rules on prohibited uses within the right-of-way of national roads.

- 668 **SECTION 28.** *Traffic Lights* The Lead Department/Office shall be responsible 669 for the management of all traffic lights, controls or signals on public roads, whether 670 installed by the City Government or private entities.
- The operation of traffic lights installed by private entities on public roads shall be coordinated with the Lead Department/Office.
- 673 No person shall, without authority from the Lead Department/Office, install,674 alter, remove, or control any traffic control sign or traffic light on any public road.

675 **SECTION 29.** *Capacity* **Building and Knowledge Transfer** – The Lead 676 Department/Office, working jointly with the City Engineer's Office, with the support of 677 the DPWH and other agencies or institutions, shall organize regular capacity building 678 trainings and workshops on safer road design, safe infrastructure design, low-cost safety 679 engineering, traffic impact assessment, safety impact assessment and safety auditing in 680 general for its personnel and other stakeholders.

681 The Head of the Lead Department/Office shall as far as practicable, appoint a
682 technical expert on road audit and safety impact assessment in the Lead
683 Department/Office.

#### ARTICLE IV - SAFER VEHICLES

685 **SECTION 30.** *Minimum Vehicle Safety Standards for Motorelas and Trisikads* 686 **Franchised in Cagayan de Oro City** - The Lead Department/Office, through the 687 appropriate department, shall (i) review minimum vehicle safety standards for 688 motorelas/trisikads applying for renewal of Franchises in Cagayan De Oro City and (ii) 689 recommend policies to the City Council to promote the safety of motorela and tricycle 690 riders.

# 691 A) Trisikads

- a) Trisikad Design Standards All trisikads plying routes within Cagayan De Oro
   City, including government-owned and utility tricycles, shall comply with the
   design standards, standard measurement, road worthiness guidelines, and other
   requirements set by the City Government under Section 152, Article XXIII, of the
   City Traffic Code and other relevant issuances.
- Failure to comply with the minimum standards within the term of the
  franchise shall constitute a ground for suspension or revocation of the franchise
  and impoundment of the vehicle pursuant to Section 4, Article VII of this
  Ordinance and shall be penalized with administrative fines pursuant to Section
  206, Article XXIX of the City Traffic Code.
- b) **Prohibition on Trisikads for Private Use** All trisikads in Cagayan De Oro City shall be required to obtain a franchise from the City Government through the RTA and Business Permit and Licensing Division and shall be governed by the rules and regulations of this Ordinance, the City Traffic Code, and other relevant issuances of the City Government. Tricycles shall only be allowed (a) for transporting passengers for a fee; and (b) for transporting goods.
- c) Number of Passengers Allowed on Trisikads As a general rule, trisikads shall 708 only be allowed to carry two (2) passengers excluding the driver. < Only one (1) 709 passenger shall be allowed to sit behind the driver, provided that, a protective 710 guard and adequate handles are installed for the passenger seated behind the 711 driver. > This limitation shall not apply to electronic trisikads <tricycles>, 712 motorelas, and other models of trisikads <tricycles> designed by the 713 manufacturer to carry more than two (2) < three (3)> passengers. In such cases, 714 the owner of the trisikad <tricycle> shall present a manufacturer's manual or 715 certificate indicating the load capacity of the trisikad <tricycle> to the law 716 enforcement officer. Such load capacity shall be clearly stated in the franchise 717 of the said tricycle. 718
- d) Limitation on Route In addition to limitations on the route of trisikad (tricycles)
  under the City Traffic Code and other relevant issuances, trisikads shall be
  prohibited from plying any national road or any road with a speed limit higher
  than 40 kph, except in the following instances:
- *i*) When the trisikad has been permitted under an existing franchise to ply a road with a speed limit higher than 40 kph;
- *ii)* On designated intersections solely for the purpose of crossing;
- *iii*) When an intersection has been blocked for purposes of traffic management
  and replaced by a U-Tum solely for the purpose of crossing and only if
  permitted under the trisikad's franchise; and
- *iv*) When the trisikad is en route to its garage, provided that it is not carrying any passenger.

#### 731 **B) Motorelas**

684

- 732 a) Design Standards for Motorelas All motorelas plying the routes within Cagayan
  733 De Oro City, including government-owned and utility motorelas, shall comply
  734 with the design standards, standard measurement, road worthiness guidelines,
  735 and other requirements set by the City Government under Section 142, Article
  736 XXII, of the City Traffic Code and other relevant issuances.
- Failure to comply with the minimum standards within the term of the
  franchise shall constitute a ground for suspension or revocation of the franchise
  and impoundment of the vehicle pursuant to Section 4, Article VII of this
  Ordinance, and shall be penalized with administrative fines pursuant to Section
  206, Article XXIX of the City Traffic Code.
- b) Regulation on Motorela Operation All motorela owners and operators in 742 Cagayan De Oro City shall be required to obtain a business permit or franchise 743 from the City Government through the City Mayor's Office and shall be governed 744 by the rules and regulations of this Ordinance, the City Traffic Code, and other 745 relevant issuances of the City Government. Owners or operators of motorelas 746 shall likewise secure a Group Accident Insurance or at least a Third Party Liability 747 and Passenger Liability (TPL/PL), as required under Section 139, Article XXII of 748 the City Traffic Code. 749
- r50 c) Number of Passengers Allowed on Motorelas As a general rule, tricycles shall only be allowed to carry a maximum number of six (6) passengers excluding the driver. Such load capacity shall be clearly stated in the franchise of the said motorela.
- d) Limitation on Route In addition to limitations on the route of public utility vehicles under the City Traffic Code and other relevant issuances, motorelas shall be prohibited from plying any national road or any road with a speed limit higher than 40 kph except in the following instances:
- *i*) When the motorelas has been permitted under an existing franchise to ply a road with a speed limit higher than 40 kph;
  - *ii*) On designated intersections solely for the purpose of crossing;
- *iii*) When an intersection has been blocked for purposes of traffic management
  and replaced by a U-Tum solely for the purpose of crossing and only if
  permitted under the tricycle's franchise; and
- *iv*) When the motorela is en route to its garage, provided that it is not carrying any passenger.

766 SECTION 31. Three (3)-Strike Rule – The franchise of drivers of
767 motorelas/trisikads who were found to have committed any of the following violations
768 at least three (3) times within three (3) years from the time of the first offense shall
769 immediately be revoked and shall not be renewed:

- A) Failure to comply with the minimum safety standards under this Ordinance and related ordinances;
- B) Violation of limitation on route; and

760

C) Violations under Article V of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 32. In Case of Court's Final Judgment** – The franchise or license of a franchisee or licensee whose motorelas and trisikads is found by final judgment, to have caused a road crash resulting in serious injuries and/or death shall likewise be revoked and shall be permanently disqualified for renewal. Said franchise or license may be suspended while court proceedings are ongoing, when upon the determination of the Lead Department/Office, it is evident that the crash was due to the fault or negligence of the franchisee or licensee.

781 In all cases, the franchisee shall also be barred from applying for a new782 franchise/license.

SECTION 33. Minimum Vehicle Safety Standards for Vehicles Passing Through
 Cagayan de Oro City - AU vehicles, including bicycles, electric bicycles, and All-Terrain
 Vehicles (ATVs) passing through Cagayan de Oro City shall be required to comply with
 the minimum vehicle standards prescribed by the Land Transportation Office. In
 addition, thereto, motor vehicles passing through the City must have:

- 788 a) Functioning headlights, lights and signal lights in compliance with LTO789 standards;
- b) Headlights turned on from 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., as well as when traversing tunnels or as required by the weather; and
- c) Functioning wipers on the windshield, where applicable.

793 SECTION 34. Vehicle Requirements for Transporting Goods - In transporting
 794 goods, the vehicle must be equipped with the necessary facilities to secure its cargo
 795 and to ensure that the said cargo will not fall or be dislodged while in transit.

796 In transporting hazardous goods and other materials, the vehicle must be 797 equipped with the necessary facilities to secure the cargo and prevent any untoward 798 consequences the transportation of the same may entail including consequences due 799 to the nature of the hazardous object.

The owner and/or driver of the vehicle shall be responsible for removing fallen cargo from the road to avoid creating a road hazard.

802

# ARTICLE V – SAFER ROAD USERS

#### 803 SECTION 35. Speeding

- A) What Constitutes Speeding The following activities constitute a speeding violation
   penalized under this Ordinance:
- 806 a. Driving a motor vehicle on any road in this City at a rate of speed greater than807 that permitted by this Ordinance;
- b. Driving a motor vehicle on any road in this City at a speed that is not appropriate
  for the width, traffic, grades, crossing, curvatures, visibility or other condition of
  the road, as to endanger the safety of road users and their property; and
- 811 c. Driving a motor vehicle on any road in this City at a speed greater than that which
  812 will permit the vehicle to stop within the assured clear distance ahead, in order
  813 to prevent a road crash.

B) Default Speed Limits - Subject to Paragraph (D) and unless otherwise provided herein, 814 the speed limit for all city roads within Cagayan de Oro City shall be Thirty Kilometers 815 per Hour (30 kph) for all motor vehicles. The speed limit for all barangay roads or 816 collector roads, classified as such by the City, shall be 20 kph. The speed limit of 817 Twenty Kilometers per Hour (20 kph) set for certain zones, namely: business zone 818 and zones fronting schools, colleges, hospitals, churches, and in all places where 819 people are congregated, under Article VII, shall continue to apply insofar as this 820 speed limit does not allow motor vehicles to travel at speeds higher than those 821 allowed under this Ordinance. 822

C) Crowded Streets - Based on the actual road condition and the road user mix,
barangays may recommend to the Lead Department/Office the setting and
enforcement of safer speed limits for barangay roads and crowded streets within
their jurisdiction when necessary.

827 Within thirty (30) days from effectivity of this Ordinance, barangays shall 828 submit a list of crowded streets to the Lead Department/Office. The Lead 829 Department/Office shall review and submit the list to the City Council with 830 recommendations on the enactment of an ordinance imposing a speed limit of 20 831 kph on such roads. B) Speed Limits for Specific Roads - The following speed limits shall apply to the roads
 and motor vehicles identified below and other similar motor vehicles:

E) Exceptions - The speed limits prescribed above shall not apply to drivers in the following circumstances, provided that these exceptions shall not be construed to allow unnecessary fast driving or to endanger the life, health or property of any person:

- a. The driver of a motor vehicle carrying a physician or health worker who isresponding to an emergency call;
- b. The driver of a hospital ambulance or emergency vehicle on the way to and fromthe location of a road crash or other emergency;
- c. Any driver bringing a wounded, injured, or sick person for emergency treatmentto a hospital, clinic, or any other similar place;
- 844 d. The driver of a motor vehicle belonging to the Armed Forces, while in use for845 official purposes in times of riot, insurrection, or invasion;
- e. The driver of a motor vehicle when he/ she is in pursuit of a criminal;
- 847 f. A law enforcement officer law is trying to apprehend a person in violation of848 traffic laws;
- g. The driver operating a motor vehicle of Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) or anyfire trucks/ vehicles, while responding to an emergency.
- F) Installation of Speed Limit Signs The Lead Department/Office shall install appropriate speed limit signs on roads within the City as set under Section 35(D) hereof;
- For National Roads, the Lead Department/Office shall coordinate with the DPWH Regional Office on the installation of appropriate speed limit signs. The speed limit signs shall conform to the standards prescribed by the DPWH Manual on Highway Safety Design Standards.
- Within three (3) months from the effectivity of this Ordinance, the Lead
  Department/Office shall identify priority roads for the installation of speed limit
  signs.
- 861 G) Information Dissemination on Applicable Speed Limits The Lead Department/
   862 Office shall ensure that information dissemination on applicable speed limits on
   863 roads within Cagayan De Oro City is conducted.

H) Prohibition against Street Racing - It shall be prohibited to engage in the unauthorized racing of motor vehicles, including trisikads and motorcycles and other vehicles. Motor vehicles used in unauthorized racing shall be immediately impounded and shall not be released until proof of payment of fines and service of the penalty is presented.

869 I) Use of Speed Detectors – The Lead Department/Office shall be allowed to use Speed
 870 Detectors for purposes of ascertaining the exact speed of the motor vehicle, if it
 871 exceeds the allowable speed as set under Section 35(D) hereof.

## 872 SECTION 36. Drink and Drug Driving

- A. Drink Driving It shall be prohibited for any person to drive a motor vehicle whileunder the influence of alcohol.
- B. Drug-Driving It shall be prohibited for any person to drive a motor vehicle while
   under the influence of dangerous drugs and other similar substances.
- A driver is presumed to be driving under the influence of dangerous drugs and other similar substances if it is reasonably apparent based on his/her gestures or behavior that his/her motor and mental faculties are impaired due to the ingestion or intake of incapacitating substances as these prohibited by existing laws, such that he/she exposes himself/herself or other persons to the risk of a crash.
- 882 C. Random Breath and Drug Testing in Terminals The Lead Department/Office shall conduct random breath and drug testing to drivers of motorela, trisikad, jeepney, taxi and at public terminals. For this purpose, the Lead Department/Office may coordinate with the Cagayan De Oro City Police Office and LTO.

In case a driver of a jeepney, taxi or bus tests positive in the breath and/or drug 886 test, the operator shall prohibit the driver from driving his/her vehicle until such 887 time that the driver has completed his/her rehabilitation. The cost for rehabilitation 888 of the driver who is found positive in the breath and/or drug test shall be shouldered 889 by the operator. In such case, the franchisee/permittee of the terminal shall be 890 meted a fine of ₱5,000.00. For the second offense, in addition to rehabilitation and 891 fine, the Lead Department/Office, in coordination with the Business Permits and 892 Licensing Office (BPLO), shall issue a Cease-and-Desist Order (CDO) to the 893 franchisee/permittee of the terminal until such time that corrective measures, 894 approved by the Lead Department/Office, are complied with by the 895 franchisee/permittee of the terminal. For the third offense, in addition to 896 rehabilitation and fine, the terminal shall be permanently closed. 897

In the event that the driver is also the operator of the jeepney, taxi or bus, as
the case maybe, tests positive in breath and/or drug test, the subject vehicle shall
be immediately impounded in addition to the aforementioned fine and penalties.

- 901For motorela terminal, the rules provided for by the City Traffic Code shall902apply.
- D. Random Sobriety Checkpoints near commercial establishments The Lead
  Department/Office shall organize random sobriety checkpoints. Random sobriety
  checkpoints shall have appropriate signages to inform the public that random
  sobriety checks are being conducted. In the event that a driver suspected of driving
  under the influence of alcohol fails the BAC breath test, the driver shall be assisted
  in parking at a nearby designated parking area and shall be prohibited from driving
  until such time that he/she is able to comply with the allowed BAC.
- 910Random sobriety checkpoints shall be recorded using video cameras or body911cameras. Law enforcement officers conducting random sobriety checks shall be

- 912 provided with a deployment order for such purpose, indicating the protocols for913 the selection of vehicles, and shall have an identification card with 2x2 photograph.
- 914 E. Responsible Beverage Service Programs and Designated Driver Program All
  915 establishments selling liquor within the City shall be required to adopt a responsible
  916 beverage service program which shall include, but shall not be limited to:
- 917 a. Server training on identifying intoxication and implementation of designated918 driver program;
- b. Signs or notices within the commercial establishment notifying patrons that thebar reserves the right to refuse service to visibly intoxicated persons; and
- 921 c. Other information, education and communication campaign materials on drink-922 driving.

Applicants for liquor licenses within Cagayan de Oro City shall be required to submit a sworn affidavit describing the Responsible Beverage Service Program of the commercial establishment as a condition for the issuance or renewal of the liquor license.

927 **SECTION 37.** Use of Motorcycle Helmets - Motorcyclists shall wear a safety 928 helmet while driving within this City. It shall be prohibited to drive or ride a motorcycle 929 within this City without wearing a properly fastened, appropriately-sized, standard 930 safety helmet.

- A. No Helmet, No Travel Policy The Lead Department/Office shall strictly implement 931 a "No Helmet, No Travel" policy. In the event of a violation, the motorcycle shall be 932 impounded. The motorcycle may only be recovered upon payment of the applicable 933 fine and upon presentation of a standard motorcycle helmet that must be properly 934 worn if the motorcycle will be used to depart from the impoundment area. 935 Barangays, private subdivisions, and commercial establishments within the City shall 936 not be allowed to impose or implement rules prohibiting motorcycle riders from 937 wearing helmets except during security inspections. 938
- B. Appropriately-sized standard helmets and proper use thereof Helmets shall be according to the standard approved by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) and shall be appropriately-sized for the wearer. It shall be properly fastened under the motorcycle rider's chin. Failure to properly fasten the helmet shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance.
- 944 SECTION 38. Safer Child Passengers in Motor Vehicles.

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954

- 945 A. Protecting Child Passengers in Tricycles, E-bike and E-trike.
- a) When Children May Ride Tricycles, E-bike and E-trike As far as practicable, a child riding as a passenger in a tricycle, e-bike and e-trike must be seated inside the passenger cab of the tricycle, e-bike and e-trike. A child who is ten (10) years of age or older shall be allowed to back-ride with the driver of the tricycle, e-bike and e-trike only if all the conditions below are present:
- 951 i) The child passenger can comfortably reach his/her feet on the standard foot952 peg of the motorcycle of the tricycle, e-bike and e-trike;
  - *ii*) The child's arms can comfortably reach the handrails on the tricycle, e-bike and e-trike roof;
- 955 *iii*) The child is mentally capable to appreciate the need to hold onto the956 handrails on the tricycle, e-bike and e-trike roof; and
- 957 *iv*) Only one (1) child is back-riding on the motorcycle of the tricycle, e-bike and958 e-trike which shall be fitted with the safety barrier.
- 959 It shall be unlawful for the driver of a trisikad, e-bike and e-trike to allow a child960 to ride as a passenger in a trisikad, e-bike and e-trike when the number of passengers

has reached the maximum capacity before the child boards the trisikad, e-bike and e-trike.

Cagayan de Oro City Traffic Code, S. 2007, on trisikads, is hereby amended accordingly.

# 965 B. Protecting Child Passengers on Motorcycles

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- 966 a) When Children May Ride Motorcycles No child shall be allowed to back-ride
   967 on a motorcycle unless it is driven by his/her parents, adult siblings, or adult
   968 relatives up to the fourth civil degree of consanguinity and affinity, and unless all
   969 the conditions below are present:
- i) The child passenger can comfortably reach his/her feet on the standard footpeg of the motorcycle;
- *ii*) The child's arms can comfortably around and grasp the waist of the motorcycle driver;
- 974 *iii*) The child is mentally capable to appreciate the need to hold onto the motorcycle driver;
  - *iv*) Only one (1) passenger is back-riding on the motorcycle;
- 977 v) The child is wearing an appropriately-sized protective helmet that is up to
  978 standard set in Republic Act No. 10666 or the Children's Safety in
  979 Motorcycles Act of 2015, and the helmet is properly fastened under the chin.

As far as practicable, child passengers on motorcycles shall wear pants and rubber or leather footwear to prevent leg or foot injuries in case of a crash or foot entrapment.

- b) Exception The requirements of this Section shall not apply during medicalemergencies involving the child passenger.
- 985 c) Where Children May Ride on Motorcycles In cases allowed under this
  986 Ordinance, a child passenger on a motorcycle shall sit on the seat above the rear
  987 wheel of the motorcycle. It shall be unlawful for the driver of a motorcycle to
  988 allow a child passenger to ride in the position in front of the driver.

#### 989 C. Protecting Child Passengers in Jeepneys

- a) When Children May Travel in Jeepneys Children from eight (8) to twelve (12) years of age may be allowed to ride public passenger jeepneys on their own;
   Provided, that they are travelling to or from school or for activities related to their schooling or for medical emergencies involving a member of their family or any authorized member of the household by the parent.
- b) When Children Not Allowed to Travel in Jeepneys It shall be unlawful for the driver of a public utility jeepney to allow a child to ride as a passenger in a jeepney when the number of passengers has reached maximum capacity before the child boards the jeepney.
- c) When Children May Sit in Jeepneus It shall be unlawful for the driver of a public 999 utility jeepney to allow child passengers to sit in the front seat of a jeepney, or 1000 any of the seats directly behind the driver or the front seat of a jeepney, or the 1001 seats in the last row next to the rear passenger door of the jeepney, provided, 1002 that in case a child is at least one hundred fifty (150) centimeters or fifty-nine 1003 (59) inches in height, he or she may sit in the front seat provide he or she is 1004 properly secured using the regular seat belt. The driver of the jeepney shall be 1005 1006 required to immediately inform and require the front seat child passenger upon 1007 boarding the jeepney to wear the prescribed seat belt. Any child passenger who refuses to properly wear the prescribed seat belt shall not be allowed to continue 1008 1009 his/her trip.

# 1010 D. Protecting Children in Private Motor Vehicles.

- a) Children Must Be Secure in Child Restraints Systems It shall be unlawful for 1011 the driver of a private motor vehicle not to properly secure at all times a child, 1012 in a child restraint system while the engine is running or transporting such child 1013 on any road, street or highway unless the child is at least one hundred fifty (150) 1014 centimeters or fifty-nine (59) inches in height and is properly secured using the 1015 regular seat belt. The child restraint system shall be appropriate to the child's 1016 age, height and weight, and approved in accordance with Republic Act No. 11229 1017 or the Child Safety in Motor Vehicles Act. The requirements of this section shall 1018 not apply to circumstances where the child restraint system would put such child 1019 in a greater danger, such as: 1020
- i) During medical emergencies; or
- ii) When the child transported has a medical or developmental condition.
- b) Children Must Not Be Left Unattended Notwithstanding the child being
   secured in a child restraint system, it shall be unlawful for the driver of a private
   motor vehicle to leave unaccompanied by an adult in a private motor vehicle.
- c) Children Must Be Seated in the Rear Seats It shall be unlawful for the driver of a private motor vehicle to allow a child to sit in a front seat of a private motor vehicle with a running engine or while such child is being transported on any road, street or highway, unless the child is at least one hundred fifty (150) centimeters or fifty-nine (59) inches in height and is properly secured using the regular seat belt.
- E. Overloading and Dangerous Riding Practices It shall be unlawful for a driver of a motor vehicle covered by this Ordinance to operate a motor vehicle while exceeding the registered passenger capacity, or to allow passengers especially to ride outside of the motor vehicle at the space intended for cargo and freight, or atop motor vehicles, or on the step board holding on to the overhead railings in the case of jeepneys through the "kabit" practice.

#### 1038 SECTION 39. Motorcycle Overloading

- A. Limit on the Number of Passengers of Motorcycles Motorcycle riders are prohibited from carrying another person on the motorcycle backseat unless the motorcycle is designed to carry more than one (1) person. A motorcycle carrying more than one (1) person shall be considered overloaded in the event that the driver fails to show proof, such as a manufacturer's manual, that the motorcycle was designed to carry more than one (1) person.
- B. Prohibition on Use of Motorcycles for Carrying Passengers for a Fee It shall
   be prohibited to use motorcycles to carry passengers for a fee, unless deem
   authorized and issued with permit.
- 1048 C. Limit on Motorcycle Cargo Any cargo being transported using a motorcycle shall
  1049 be secured firmly and should not cause the motorcycle to be unstable. Load
  1050 dimensions should not go beyond one (1) meter from the center of the motorcycle
  1051 side to side and higher than the helmet of the rider. Other objects designed to be
  1052 carried by the rider such as guitars and similar instruments, rulers, tools and the like
  1053 should be strapped to the rider.

#### 1054 SECTION 40. Seatbelt Use for Drivers and Passengers -

1055 The driver and front seat passengers of a public or private motor vehicle are 1056 required to wear or use their seat belt devices while inside a vehicle with running engine 1057 on any road or thoroughfare; Provided, that, for private vehicles, except for jeeps, 1058 jeepneys, vans, buses and such other private vehicles as may be determined in the 1059 Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 8750, otherwise known as, the
1060 "Seat Belts Use Act of 1999," front and back seat passengers are likewise required to
1061 use their seat belt devices at all times.

1062 In the case of public motor vehicles, the driver shall be required to immediately 1063 inform and require the front seat passengers upon boarding a vehicle of running engine 1064 to wear the prescribed seat belts. Any passenger who refuses to wear seat belts shall 1065 not be allowed to continue his/her trip.

For special public service vehicles such as school services and other similar vehicles, seat belt devices should be provided and used by both drivers and front seat passengers and the first-row passengers immediately behind the driver at all times while inside a vehicle of running engine.

1070 For jeepneys, the driver and front seat passenger shall be required, at the 1071 minimum, to use a pelvic restraint or lap belt installed in the vehicle.

1072 SECTION 41. Anti-Distracted Driving -

A. Prohibition on the Use of Mobile Devices while Driving - Drivers are prohibited from using mobile communications or entertainment devices while driving whether in motion or temporarily stopped at a red light.

Provided, that the hands-free use of mobile communications devices and other navigation devices for communication and navigation shall be permitted. Provided, further, that, the placement of the mobile communications device or the hands-free device does not interfere with the field of view of the driver. Provided, finally, that answering of phone calls and setting-up of the navigation device shall only be allowed when the vehicle is not in motion and is parked at an area appropriate for parking.

1083It shall be prohibited to use or install modified front visors, rear view mirrors1084and other in-vehicle gadgets if installed in a manner that obstructs the driver's field1085of view.

- a) Prohibition for Student Permit Holders to use Hands-Free Devices Student drivers or student permit holders are prohibited from using mobile communication or entertainment devices while driving whether for communication or navigation and whether hands-free or otherwise.
- b) Exceptions The provisions of this Section shall not apply during the following instances:
- i) Using a mobile phone for emergency purposes, including but not limited to,
   an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, Bureau
   of Fire Protection or other emergency services, agency or entity; and
- 1095 ii) Using a mobile phone while operating an emergency vehicle such as an
  1096 ambulance, a fire truck, and other vehicles providing emergency assistance,
  1097 in the course and scope of his or her duties.
- B. Prohibition on Obstruction of the Driver's Field of View The driver's field of view shall always remain unobstructed. No item or object shall be placed on the front windshield or on the dashboard in such a manner as to obstruct the driver's field of view.

Signs, stickers, posters or any other non-transparent material shall be prohibited from being placed upon the front windshield of a vehicle, except for stickers required by the LTO, LTFRB, homeowners' associations or building owners. These stickers shall only be placed at the lower or upper hand corner of the front windshield.

#### 1107 SECTION 42. Pedestrian Safety -

A. Duties of Pedestrians - In addition to the duties of pedestrians under the City Traffic
 Code and other relevant issuances, pedestrians have the following duties:

- a) When on a footway, marked cross-walk or pedestrian crossing, to keep as closeas practicable to the right side of the footway;
- b) When crossing a thoroughfare at an intersection, to keep right of the pedestriancrossing in the opposite direction.
- c) When crossing a thoroughfare or portion of a thoroughfare, to do so promptlyby shortest and most direct route to the thoroughfare boundary as may bepracticable.
- B. Restrictions on Pedestrians In addition to the limitations of pedestrians under the
  City Traffic Code and other relevant issuances, pedestrians are prohibited from
  doing the following acts, which shall constitute the offense of jaywalking:
- a) Standing on any portion of the road while waiting to board a vehicle;
- b) Proceeding from a footway toward a vehicle that has not fully stopped for the purpose of boarding it;
- c) Alighting from or boarding a moving vehicle;
- d) Alighting from or boarding a vehicle at an area where loading and unloading isprohibited;
- e) Remaining on a pedestrian crossing or marked cross- walk longer than is
   necessary for the purpose of passing through the thoroughfare with reasonable
   dispatch;
- f) Standing on a footway or sidewalk so as to inconvenience, obstruct, hinder or prevent the free passage of any other pedestrian;
- g) Using mobile communications or entertainment devices including earphones
   head sets and/ or other devices that may impede sense of hearing and sense of
   sight while crossing.

#### 1134 SECTION 43. General Driving Rules. -

- A. Overtaking When overtaking a moving vehicle, the driver shall turn on the appropriate signal light and safely pass to the left of that vehicle. He/she shall not switch lanes or drive in front of the moving vehicle until his/her vehicle is safely clear.
  Provided, that, where a thoroughfare has two or more marked lanes, a vehicle may overtake and pass to the right of a moving vehicle, if traffic conditions permit him/ her to do so safely.
- 1141The driver of a vehicle being overtaken shall not increase the speed of his/her1142vehicle until it has been completely passed by the overtaking vehicle and shall yield1143in favor of the latter.
- B. Giving Way at Intersections A driver approaching or passing through an intersection shall exercise special care and, where appropriate, shall drive at a reduced speed.
- 1147 Except where traffic control signals are in place, the driver of a vehicle that 1148 is approaching an intersection shall give way to the vehicle that entered the 1149 intersection first; Provided, that, where the two vehicles entered the intersection at 1150 the same time, the vehicle on the left shall give way.
- 1151 C. Giving Way in Rotundas In a roundabout or rotunda, the first vehicle to enter takes
   1152 precedence over a vehicle approaching or about to enter the rotunda.
- 1153Within the rotunda, drivers must give way to vehicles intending to leave the1154nearest exit point.

- D. Prohibition against Counter flowing No driver shall be al/owed to drive his/ her vehicle in the direction opposite to the flow of traffic that he/she is traversing at any time and for any purpose, unless shall is expressly authorized by a law enforcement officer.
- E. Parking Near Curves No person shall park or leave a vehicle unattended on or near a crest or curve of the road that poses a risk to turning vehicles, unless an approaching driver from the rear would have a clear view of the vehicles for a distance of at least forty-five (45) meters.
- F. Prohibition against Blocking the Yellow Traffic Box No driver shall allow his vehicle to straddle or block the yellow traffic box at any time. Any vehicle straddling or blocking the yellow traffic box when the red traffic light is on shall suffer the next higher penalty provided under Article VII hereof.

#### 1167 **ARTICLE VI – POST-CRASH CARE**

**SECTION 44. CDO Emergency Hotline** - The Cagayan de Oro City Government shall maintain an emergency hotline (CDO Emergency Hotline) that shall receive calls seeking an emergency response. The Cagayan de Oro City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Department (CDRRMD) shall be responsible for dispatching emergency responders to sites of emergency and coordinating with hospitals and the Lead Department/Office for the purpose of responding to the emergency.

- A. Information Campaign on CDO Emergency Hotline The Lead
   Department/Office, in coordination with the CDRRMD and Operation Kalinaw ug
   Kahusay (OKK) Center shall conduct an IEC campaign on the City Emergency
   Hotline.
- B. Procedure for Dispatching Emergency Responders ~ The procedure for dispatching emergency responders shall be as follows:
- a) Call made to the City Emergency Hotline shall be received by a trained call-taker
  who is responsible to take down all vital information regarding the emergency,
  such as, but not limited to, the following:
- *i)* Type of emergency;
- *ii)* Information on the victim/ s and persons involved;
- 1185 *iii*) Type of injury, if any, and the severity;
- 1186 *iv*) Address;

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- v) Telephone number;
- 1188 *vi*) First aid provided, if any;
- 1189 *vii*) Contact information of caller, with consent.
- b) The call-taker shall alert and coordinate with the relevant local offices or
   departments of the emergency who have stationed officers at the CDRRMD
   center.
- c) The call-taker shall immediately endorse the call to the nearest emergency responder, such as the Barangay Emergency Response Team.
- d) The emergency responders shall confirm their capacity and availability to respond. Should they be unavailable, the call-taker shall endorse the matter to the CDRRMD.
- e) The call-taker and the relevant office or department shall dispatch the emergency responders.
- f) The call-taker and relevant office or department shall closely monitor the statusof the emergency responders.
- 1202 g) The call-taker shall record the incident.

- 1203 C. Coordination with the 911 emergency response team and the City Health Officer for1204 Uniform Data Collection and Response.
- 1205The CDRRMD shall coordinate with the 911 emergency response team and1206the City Health Officer to develop a uniform system for data collection and1207systematic response.
- 1208 D. Barangay Emergency Response Teams In addition to the composition of the
   1209 existing Barangay DRRM each Barangay shall have a functioning emergency response
   1210 team. The *punong barangay* shall facilitate and ensure the participation of first 1211 responders in the community.
- a) First Response The Barangay Emergency Response Team covering the area
   where an emergency occurred shall be considered the first responder to the
   emergency.
- b) Resources for Emergency Response Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance, all Barangays must submit a report to the Lead Department/Office identifying the resources it needs in order to effectively function as first responder, including but not limited to, the hiring of new personnel, equipment, resources for the maintenance and repair of equipment, etc.
- 1221The Barangay Emergency Response Team shall be responsible for1222maintaining all its equipment and shall submit an annual inventory of its1223emergency response equipment with information on the status of the1224equipment.
- 1225The Lead Department/Office shall from time to time, audit the equipment1226of the barangay emergency response teams that consistently fail to provide a1227satisfactory response to emergencies.
- E. First Aid Training. All law enforcement officers, members of the Barangay
  Emergency Response Team, and as far as practicable, teachers and school service
  or transport drivers, shall undergo regular training on first aid response and relief,
  basic life support, and extraction. The Lead Department/Office, in coordination with
  the DRRM, shall be responsible for organizing first aid response and relief training
  and certification for these responders.
- F. Free First Responder Training to Communities Regularly The CDRRMD shall
   provide regular free first aid response and relief training, basic life support and,
   extraction every year, and invite communities, barangay volunteers and other
   stakeholders. The CDRRM is likewise authorized to provide free first responder
   trainings to communities and other stakeholders and volunteers, upon their written
   request.

1240 **SECTION 45.** *Coordination with Hospital Trauma Care Providers* - The 1241 CDRRMD shall coordinate with the City Health Officer in developing and disseminating 1242 a directory of hospital trauma care providers. The Lead Department/Office shall build a 1243 coordination network between the emergency responders and hospital trauma to 1244 strengthen the emergency response of the City.

1245 **SECTION 46.** *Social Services* - The road crash victim or his/ her family may 1246 avail assistance from the City Social Welfare and Development Office. The Lead 1247 Department/Office shall develop or recommend improvements to social services 1248 provided to road crash victims and/or their family, including financial and counselling 1249 assistance.

1250 SECTION 47. Road Crash Investigation - The Lead Department/Office in
 1251 coordination with the Traffic Enforcement Unit of COCPO shall investigate fatal crashes
 1252 occurring within Cagayan De Oro City for purposes of policy development. Findings from

the investigation shall be submitted to the Road Safety Working Group and/ or the 1253 appropriate office for appropriate action on how to prevent similar incidents from 1254 occurring. The Lead Department/Office may coordinate with the LTO and other 1255 organizations for the purpose of training law enforcement officers and other relevant 1256 1257 City personnel to conduct thorough road crash investigations.

SECTION 48. Monitoring and Evaluation of Response Time – The CDRRMD 1258 shall monitor and evaluate the efficiency of the City's post-crash response through the 1259 monitoring and recording of response times from the time the call was received to the 1260 time that relief is rendered. 1261

The CDRRMD shall identify and recognize the Barangay Emergency Response 1262 Team with the fastest and most frequent response time, and the Barangay Emergency 1263 Response Team that consistently fails to respond to emergencies and shall make 1264 recommendations on incentives to improve response time. 1265

**SECTION 49.** Reporting - The CDRRMD shall submit an annual report to the 1266 Lead Department/Office and the Road Safety Working Group on the number of road 1267 safety emergency calls received, response times of DRRM and the response time and 1268 frequency of response of Barangay Emergency Response Teams. 1269

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#### **ARTICLE VII - FINES AND PENALTIES**

1277 SECTION 53. Impoundment - The penalty of impoundment shall entail seizure
1278 and confiscation of the vehicle and storage of the same in the authorized impounding
1279 area. Failure to settle the necessary fines and redeem the impounded vehicle shall
1280 subject the same to public auction.

1281 SECTION 54. Imprisonment - The Lead Department/Office, with the assistance
1282 of the Office of the City Legal Officer, shall be responsible for the filing of cases with the
1283 appropriate court for the third and subsequent violations of this Ordinance which,
1284 subject to the discretion of the presiding judge, may result in the imposition of the
1285 penalty of imprisonment.

**SECTION 55.** *Community Service* - Community service may be performed, at the option of the offender in lieu of payment of fines. Community service may include any kind of activity determined by the Lead Department/Office in coordination with the City Public Services Department that will redound to the benefit of the community and the City. The offender shall report to the office of the City Public Services Department upon the endorsement of the Lead Department/Office for community service assignments.

SECTION 56. Confiscation of License - The confiscation of the offending driver's
 license shall be a concurrent penalty. For third offenses, the Lead Department/Office
 shall make a recommendation to the LTO for the revocation of the offender's license.
 The offender shall not be allowed to apply for a new license. The Lead
 Department/Office shall ensure connectivity with the LTO information technology
 system for coordination on the recording of violations and imposition of penalties.

#### ARTICLE VIII- ENFORCEMENT AND ADJUDICATION

1300 SECTION 57. Uniform Enforcement Procedure - shall be a uniform minimum
 1301 enforcement procedure for violations of this Ordinance, as provided under the City
 1302 Traffic Code:

#### 1303 A) Violations of Drivers.

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- a. The law enforcement officer is authorized to stop a motor vehicle in transit at the time of an observe violation or during random safety checks. The law enforcement officer shall flag down the motor vehicle and safely lead it to the roadside to avoid obstructing the flow of traffic, or, if he/she is stationary, call his/her attention immediately.
- b. Upon apprehension, the law enforcement officer shall inform the offending driver of the violation, and require the presentation of the driver's license of the offending driver and the motor vehicle Certificate of Registration (CR) and Official Receipt (OR) of registration.
- c. The law enforcement officer shall confiscate the driver's license and issue a
  Traffic Citation Ticket (TCT) or Temporary Operator's Permit (TOP) to the
  offender, which shall serve as the driver's temporary driver's license. The law
  enforcement officer may be allowed to educate and issue warnings to the
  offender, instead of issuing immediately a ticket in cases mentioned under
  Section 2.4.c of this Ordinance.
- d. The law enforcement officer shall indicate the following information in the TCTor TOP:
- *i)* name and address of the driver;
  - *ii*) driver's license number and date and place of issuance;
- *iii*) issuing agency of the driver's license;
- *iv)* name and address of the motor vehicle owner;
- 1325 *v*) registering agency of the motor vehicle;
- *vi*) certificate of registration number;
- 1327 *vii*) Violation/s committed.
- **1328** Each violation shall constitute a separate offense.
- e. In case of subsequent violations, the law enforcement officer shall confiscate
  the presented TOP and issue a new TOP or TCT, indicating both the previous and
  present violation and the issuing authorities.
- f. The driver shall have three (3) days within which to settle the fine and comply
  with the attached penalties, or to file a protest in accordance with Section 3
  herein.
- g. Failure to file a protest within the period shall be deemed a waiver of the right to
  protest and shall result in the automatic resolution of the violation against the
  driver and/or the registered owner.

#### 1338 B) Violation detected using speed enforcement cameras/speed gun.

- a) Upon detection of a speeding violation using speed enforcement cameras or
   speed guns, the Lead Department/Office shall issue a notice to the registered
   owner of the motor vehicle via registered mail.
- b) The notice shall indicate the speed limit of the road where the violation was
  committed and shall include a photograph of the vehicle with the speed
  detected by the camera at the time violation shown legibly.
- c) The registered owner shall be presumed to be the driver of the motor vehicle unless he/she can prove that the motor vehicle was driven by another person.
- d) The registered owner shall have three (3) days from the date of receipt of the notice within which to settle the fine indicated in the notice, or to file a protest in accordance with Section 3 herein. Failure to file a protest within the period

shall be deemed a waiver of the right to protest, and shall result in the automaticresolution of the violation against the registered owner.

- e) In case of a protest based on the identity of the driver, the registered owner shall have the duty to provide under oath the name of the driver of the motor vehicle, his/her known address, and other details as may be required by the Lead Department/Office. Except in cases where the protest is based on stolen vehicles, no protest based on the identity of the driver shall be allowed unless the alleged driver at the time of violation is identified.
- f) Upon a finding that the registered owner is not the driver of the motor vehicle at
  the time of the violation, the Lead Department/Office shall send a notice to the
  driver, as identified by the registered owner subject to the requirements herein.
- 1361 C) Drink-Driving Enforcement Procedure. The enforcement of this section shall
   1362 be uniformly conducted in accordance with the following procedure provided under
   1363 Ordinance:
- a) The law enforcement officer shall cause the driver suspected of driving under the
   influence of alcohol to undergo any or a combination of the following preliminary
   field sobriety tests, prior to the initial test for blood alcohol concentration:
- i) Walk a straight-line test;
- 1368 ii) Finger to nose test;
- iii) Stand on one leg test;
- iv) Horizontal gaze nystagmus ("follow the penlight").
- b) In the event that the suspected driver fails any of the preliminary sobriety tests,
  or when there is strong reason to believe that he or she is intoxicated, the law
  enforcement officer is mandated to subject him or her to the BAC breath test
  with a portable breath analyzing device or any modification thereof.
- c) In the event that the driver's BAC exceeds 0.05%, he or she shall be asked to park at a nearby designated parking area and shall be prohibited from driving until such time that he or she is able to comply with the allowed BAC. If he or she refuses to comply, he/ she shall be requested to alight the vehicle and shall
  be apprehended for violation of this Ordinance.
- d) The law enforcement officer shall inform the offending driver of the violation,
  and demand the presentation of the driver's license of the offending driver and
  the motor vehicle certificate of registration and official receipt of registration.
- e) The traffic law enforcement officer shall issue a Traffic Citation Ticket or TOP and issue the same to the offender.
- 1385f) The law enforcement officer shall indicate the following information in the TCT1386or TOP:
- *i)* name and address of the driver;
  - *ii*) driver license number and date and place of issuance;
- 1389 *iii*) agency of the driver's license;
  - *iv*) name and address of the motor vehicle owner;
    - v) registering agency of the motor vehicle;
  - *vi*) certificate of registration number;
- 1393 *vii*) Violation committed.

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- g) In case of subsequent violations, the traffic law enforcement officer shall
   confiscate the presented TOP and issue a new TOP indicating both the previous
   and present violation and the issuing authorities.
- h) The driver shall have three (3) days within which to settle the fine and comply
  with the attached penalties, or to file a protest in accordance with Section 3
  herein. An additional surcharge of five percent (5%) for each day of delay or

failure to pay the appropriate fine shall be imposed until the full amount of fineand surcharge is paid.

i) Failure to file a protest within the period shall be deemed a waiver of the right to
 protest and shall result in the automatic resolution of the violation against the
 driver and/ or registered owner.

#### 1405 **D) Random Sobriety Checkpoint**

- a) During random sobriety checks at authorized checkpoints, the law enforcement
  officer shall flag down every tenth (I0th) passing motor vehicle. The law
  enforcement officer shall explain that a random sobriety check is being
  conducted pursuant to this ordinance, inform the driver that the proceedings
  are being recorded by video, and request the driver to undergo a BAC breath test
  with a portable breath analyzing device or any modification thereof
- b) In the event that the driver's BAC exceeds 0.05%, he or she shall be asked to park at a nearby designated parking area and shall be prohibited from driving until such time that he or she is able to comply with the allowed BAC. If he or she refuses to comply, he/ she shall be requested to alight the vehicle and shall be apprehended for violation of this Ordinance.
- 1417 c) Random sobriety checkpoints shall have appropriate signages. The conduct of
   1418 random sobriety checkpoints shall be recorded using video cameras and/or body
   1419 cameras.
- d) Law enforcement officers deployed for random sobriety checkpoints shall have
  a deployment order signed by the head of the Lead Department/Office and shall
  wear an identification card with their name and 2x2 photograph. The deployment
  order shall state the protocol for the random sobriety checkpoint.
- e) Law enforcement officers shall record the plate number of all vehicles flagged down, the name, license number and plate number of the driver of the vehicles that fail the BAC.
- 1427 E) Drug-Driving Enforcement Procedure. The enforcement of this section shall be uniformly conducted in accordance with the following procedure:
- a) As for persons suspected to be under the influence of dangerous drugs and similar substances, if it is reasonably apparent, based on his/ her gestures or behavior that his/ her motor and mental faculties are impaired due to the ingestion or intake of incapacitating substance as those prohibited by existing laws, such that he or she.
- b) If the law enforcement officer has probable cause to believe that a person is driving under the influence of dangerous drugs and/ or other similar substances, it shall be the duty of the law enforcement officer to bring the driver to the nearest police station to be subjected to a drug screening test and, if necessary, a drug confirmatory test as mandated under Republic Act No. 9165.
- c) The law enforcement officer shall inform the offending driver of the violation,
  and demand the presentation of the driver's license of the offending driver and
  the motor vehicle certificate of registration and official receipt of registration.
- d) The law enforcement officer shall confiscate the driver's license and issue a
   Temporary Operator's Permit (TOP) to the offender, which shall serve as the
   driver's temporary driver's license for Three (3) days from the date of issuance.
- e) The law enforcement officer shall indicate the following information in the TOP:
- i) name and address of the driver;
- 1447 ii) driver's license number and date and place of issuance;
- 1448 iii) issuing agency of the driver's license;

- iv) name and address of the motor vehicle owner;
- 1450 v) registering agency of the motor vehicle;
- 1451 vi) certificate of registration number;
- vii) violation committed.

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- f) In case of subsequent violations, the law enforcement officer shall confiscate
   the presented TOP and issue a new receipt, indicating both the previous and
   present violation and the issuing authorities.
- g) The driver shall have three (3) days within which to settle the fine and comply
  with the attached penalties, or to file a protest in accordance with Section 3
  herein. An additional surcharge of five percent (5%) for each day of delay or
  failure to pay the appropriate fine shall be imposed until the full. amount of fine
  and surcharge is paid.
- h) Failure to file a protest within the period shall be deemed a waiver of the right to
  protest and shall result in the automatic resolution of the violation against the
  driver and/ or registered owner.

#### 1464 F) Enforcement of Mandatory Use of Child Restraint Systems.

- a) Only law enforcement officers that have complete training for fitters under
  Section 5, Article VIII, of this Ordinance shall be authorized to apprehend
  violators of Section 4.4.1, Article V, of this Ordinance.
- b) A law enforcement officer shall make an initial determination of a violation/s ofSection 4.4.1, Article V, of this Ordinance:
  - i. Through a visual inspection, whether through observational checks, random safety checks conducted at established checkpoints, or in the course of routine patrols;
- 1473 ii. In the course of apprehension for the commission of another traffic
  1474 violation, such speeding, beating the red light, ignoring traffic signs,
  1475 counter-flowing or incorrectly driving in a one-way street, driving recklessly
  1476 or swerving, or driving under the influence of alcohol or prohibited drugs;
  1477 or
- 1478 iii. In the course of an investigation of a road crash or collision.
- c) Where the act or omission constituting the violation may be corrected through 1479 minor adjustments, such as in the installation or use of child restraint systems 1480 in cases under Section 4.4.1, Article V, of this Ordinance, wearing of helmet in 1481 cases under Section 4.2.1, Article V, this Ordinance, the law enforcement officer 1482 shall issue a warning instead of a TOP, provided, that the driver or any adult 1483 passenger accompanying the child shall be given an opportunity to make the 1484 necessary minor adjustments under the supervision of the law enforcement 1485 officer. 1486
- d) In cases where violations under Section 4.4.1, Article V of this Ordinance can only be corrected by requiring the child to alight the vehicle or by removing the child restraint system, the law enforcement officer shall issue TCT/TOP to the driver and direct the driver to the nearest LTO or Cagayan De Oro City fitting station where the child restraint system may be assessed and properly fitted, installed, or adjusted.
- e) Nothing in this Ordinance shall prevent the law enforcement officer from using
   reasonable means to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance, including issuing
   warnings and conducting IEC campaign.

#### 1496 G) Protecting Child Passengers from Distress.

a) The law enforcement officer shall at all times ensure the safety of child
passengers and shall conduct himself/herself in a manner that the child is not
subjected to any form of distress during apprehension.

- b) The law enforcement officer shall follow existing protocol in the apprehension of drivers for traffic violations and shall only resort to visual inspection in determining whether there is a violation of this Ordinance. At no point may the law enforcement officer require the child to alight the vehicle or the removal of the child restraint system in cases related to Section 4.4.1, Article V, of this Ordinance.
- c) All communication during apprehension and processing of the violation shall be directed to the driver of the motor vehicle. At no instance shall the law enforcement approach or communicate directly with the child passenger without the presence of the driver or adult passenger.

 H) Fitting Stations. The Lead Department/Office shall establish fitting stations within the jurisdiction of the City and shall be authorized to enter into partnerships with or consult healthcare institutions and/or medical professionals, law enforcement agencies, local government units (LGUs), and other institutions for the conduct of fitting services through mobile fitting stations. Fitting stations shall be established in accordance with the specifications to be set out in the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance.

1517 SECTION 58. Protest Adjudication - The Traffic Adjudication Board created
 1518 under the Lead Department/Office shall continue to have jurisdiction over protests in
 1519 relation to this Ordinance. The process of filing a protest is as follows:

- a. Within Three (3) days from the issuance of the TCT/TOP, the driver or registered
  owner may file a protest with the Traffic Adjudication Board, attaching therein all
  evidence which he/she may wish to present.
- b. The Traffic Adjudication Board shall conduct an investigation and hearing, and
   shall have the authority to issue summons to law enforcement officers, drivers and
   registered owners of motor vehicles, and receive evidence in relation to the
   protest.
- c. Within thirty (30) days from the filing of the protest, the Traffic Adjudication Board
  shall decide on the protest and inform the driver and/or registered owner of its
  decision and the owner shall have Three (3) days within which to settle the fine
  indicated in the decision. Otherwise, the driver or registered owner shall be issued
  a clearance by the Lead Department/Office, indicating that the driver/registered
  owner has been cleared of the violation, cancelling the TOP and directing the
  appropriate office to return the confiscated license.

SECTION 59. Effect of Failure to Settle Fines and Serve Penalties - In the event 1534 1535 of failure to settle the fines or penalties within the period provided in this Ordinance, the Lead Department/Office shall after three (3) days from the time the fine or penalty 1536 becomes due, file a complaint before the appropriate court for the enforcement of said 1537 fines or penalties. The Lead Department/Office shall also submit the information of the 1538 1539 offending driver and registered owner to the LTO, requesting the said office to hold in 1540 abeyance the registration of the motor vehicle involved in the violation until such time 1541 that the fine is settled and/or the penalty is served.

- **SECTION 60.** *Training for Law Enforcement Officers and Fitters*. The Lead Department/Office shall develop a training module for the enforcement of this Ordinance and for fitters to provide fitting services, and shall be authorized to coordinate with the LTO and other institutions for this purpose. The Lead Department/Office shall be responsible for ensuring that all law enforcement officers have undergone training on enforcement of this Ordinance in accordance with the specifications to be set out in the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance.
- 1549 ARTICLE IX MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

1550 SECTION 61. Budget and Appropriation - The amount of Five Million Pesos
 1551 (₱5,000,000.00) from the General Fund or other available source of funds from the

- 1552 Cagayan de Oro City Government or Lead Department/Office is hereby appropriated for
- 1553 the first year of implementation of this Ordinance, including the member's remuneration
- in a form of honoraria, with the following priority procurement:
- 1555 1) Laser speed guns;
- 1556 2) Laser speed cameras;
- **1557** 3) Breath analyzers;
- 1558 4) Speed limit signs;
- 1559 5) Drug testing kits;
- 1560 6) Body cameras;
- **1561** 7) Training of law enforcement officers;
- **1562** 8) Manufacture and installation of road signs;
- **1563** 9) IEC campaign materials;
- **1564** 10) Publication of IEC campaign materials;
- 1565 11) Additional human resources
- 1566 12) Printing of TCT
- 1567 13) IT requirements for connectivity with the LTO information technology system.

All fines collected pursuant to this Ordinance shall be earmarked for the implementation of the road safety ordinance and policies in addition to the budget to be appropriated from the general fund for subsequent years, which shall, not be less than the amount of the prior year's appropriation.

1572 Other items required to be procured for the implementation of this Ordinance 1573 or the Road Safety Action Plan shall be submitted by the Lead Department/Office or 1574 responsible office or agency as part of their budget plan for the succeeding years.

1575 SECTION 62. Procurement - The Office of the City General Services is hereby
 1576 authorized to cause the procurement of the items enumerated in the preceding section
 1577 in accordance with the above budget program and in compliance with Republic Act No.
 1578 9184 or the Government Procurement Reform Act.

1579 SECTION 63. Information, Education and Communication Campaign- The Lead
 1580 Department/Office, in coordination with the City Information Office shall conduct a
 1581 continuing IEC campaign on the implementation of this Ordinance and other
 1582 enforcement activities.

1583 SECTION 64. City Mayor Authority to Enter Into Agreements Related to Road
 1584 Safety - The City Mayor is authorized to enter into agreements with other institutions,
 1585 including those belonging to the private sector, civil society, and the academe, to
 1586 implement the provisions of this Ordinance.

1587 SECTION 65. Implementing Rules and Regulations - The Road Safety Working Group led by the Lead Department/Office, and in consultation with other local offices 1588 1589 and national government agencies, such as the LTO, and other concerned agencies and 1590 stakeholders such as civil society organizations, the academe, and the private sector 1591 including representatives from accredited associations for homeowners, motorela/ 1592 trisikad operators and drivers and public utility vehicles operators and drivers, shall 1593 promulgate the Implementing Rules and regulations (IRR) within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Ordinance. The IRR shall cover among others the following: 1594

- 1595 a) Training for enforcers and fitters;
- 1596 b) Rules for the establishment of fitting stations; and
- 1597 c) Phases of implementation, including phases for information, education, and
   1598 awareness activities and for mandatory compliance of this Ordinance to be
   1599 enforced.

1600 SECTION 66. Transitory Clause. Mandatory compliance of this Ordinance shall
 1601 be enforced only one (1) year after the effectivity of the Implementing Rules and
 1602 Regulations of this Ordinance.

SECTION 67. *Review*. The Lead Department/Office shall conduct a review of the
 interventions provided in this Ordinance every three (3) years to ensure that the
 interventions are appropriate to protect road users and shall, for this purpose, refer to
 globally-accepted best practices and other evolving practices.

1607 SECTION 68. Repealing Clause - All Ordinances, Resolutions, Executive Orders,
 1608 Memorandum Circulars and Administrative Orders or parts thereof which are
 1609 inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified
 1610 accordingly.

1611 SECTION 69. Separability Clause - If any provision of this Ordinance is
 1612 declared void or unconstitutional, the remaining portions shall not be affected and shall
 1613 remain in full force and effect.

1614 SECTION 70. Effectivity - This Ordinance shall take effect after fifteen (15) days
 1615 following its publication in a newspaper of general circulation and after posting of copies
 1616 of this Ordinance in conspicuous locations within Cagayan de Oro City for a period of
 1617 fifteen (15) days.

Dear Vice Mayor Rodriguez:

Among the issues discussed in several meetings of the RPOC 10 Committee on Public Safety is the increasing number of road traffic/vehicle accidents that resulted to fatalities and injuries due to road crashes. One of the identified causes is the inappropriate and/or absence of road traffic signs for speed limits for safe driving.

In response to this, the Regional Peace and Order Council had passed a Resolution No. 07 series of 2021 "Recommending to the Local Government Units the Enactment of a Local Ordinance Updating the Classification of Roads and Thoroughfares Thereby Setting the Speed Limit Thereat to be Made Basis by Law Enforcement Agencies in their Apprehension Activities".

Attached herein is a copy of said RPOC Resolution No. 07 series of 2021 as well as copy of DOTr-DPWH-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2018-001 dated January 17, 2018 for your ready reference.

May the Sangguniang Panlungsod include this in the priority for the passage of appropriate ordinance/s.

Republic Act No. 4136 otherwise known as the Land Transportation and Traffic Code mandates among others, the maximum allowable speed limits of motor vehicles and that speed limits are uniform throughout the Philippines, that no provincial city or municipal authority shall enact or enforce any ordinance or resolution specifying maximum allowable speeds other than those provided". However, public highways



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maybe properly classified for traffic purposes by the concerned sanggunian having jurisdiction over the.

Section 447 and 458 of RA 7160 provides that City and Municipal Governments have the power to regulate traffic in all streets and bridges within their territorial boundaries, and to enact measures that will enhance public health, safety, convenience, maintain peace and order, and promote the general welfare of their inhabitants.

However, the prescribed speed limits are no longer relevant due to rising population and traffic congestion brought on by rapid urbanization.

Thus, in response to the rising number of vehicle accidents that result in fatalities and injuries due to road crashes, primarily due to speeding, the DOTR-DPWH-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2018-01 was released on January 17, 2017. This circular provides guidelines and standards for reclassifying roads and establishing speed limits for safe driving.

The said JMC also urge Sanggunian Panlungsod/Bayan to enact speed limit ordinance for purposes of local enforcement. If and when necessary, sanggunian may propose to lower speed limit for national roads subject to DPWH review and approval, prior to the enactment of an ordinance.

Hence, to monitor the implementation of the said issaunce, the Bureau of Local Government Supervision issued unnumbered memorandum on June 22, 2020 directing DILG Regional Offices to monitor LGUs with ordinances on speed limit, road classification and other requirements (i.e. road crash data, installation of speed limit signages, submitted ordinance to DOTr for review).

After three years of monitoring, a consolidated report showed only 51 of the 98 LGUs in Region 10 currently have a speed limit and road classification ordinance. Only seven LGUs out of the 51 with ordinances have sent theirs to the DOTr for review and approval.

In this regard, all Local Chief Executives through their respective sanggunians are hereby encourage to enact / review existing speed limit ordinance, and other traffic regulations, and submit the same to DOTr/DPWH/ LTO for review.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 07 Series of 2021

#### RECOMMENDING TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS THE ENACTMENT OF A LOCAL ORDINANCE UPDATING THE CLASSIFICATION OF ROADS AND THOROUGHFARES THEREBY SETTING THE SPEED LIMITS THEREAT TO BE MADE BASIS BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THEIR ROAD APPREHENSION ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 4136 otherwise known as the Land Transportation and Traffic Code was approved on June 20, 1964 compiling all the laws relative to land transportation and traffic rules, and covering provisions on control, registration and operation of motor vehicles and licensing of owners, dealers, conductors, drivers, and similar matters – laying out the groundwork for all the traffic regulations at present;

WHEREAS, Section 35 of RA No. 4136 mandates the maximum allowable speed limits of motor vehicles on open country roads (with no "blind corners" not closely bordered by habitations), on "through streets" or boulevards (clear of traffic, with no "blind corners") when so designated, on city and municipal streets with light traffic (when not designated "through streets"), and through crowded streets (approaching intersections at "blind corners," passing school zones, passing other vehicles which are stationary, or for similar dangerous circumstances);

WHEREAS, Section 36 of RA No. 4136 provides that the speed limits are uniform throughout the Philippines and "that no provincial, city or municipal authority shall enact or enforce any ordinance or resolution specifying maximum allowable speeds other than those provided" therein, however, public highways may be properly classified for traffic purposes by the concerned sanggunian having jurisdiction over them, as provided in Section 38 thereof;

WHEREAS, the rapid urbanization of cities and municipalities in the Philippines seems to render the speed limits outdated on some roads since RA No. 4136 was enacted more than five decades ago;

WHEREAS, occurrence of vehicular accidents that result to road crash fatalities and injuries, attributable mostly to speeding, had become a serious threat which led to the issuance of DOTr-DPWH-DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2018-001 on January 17, 2018 providing for the guidelines and standards for the reclassification of different types of roads, providing motorists with a more appropriate set of speed limits to follow, and in effect fortifies the implementation of Section 35 of Republic Act No. 4136 and improve the coordination between local government units (LGU) and concerned national government agencies;

WHEREAS, DOTr-DPWH-DILG JMC No. 2018-001 provides the hereunder relevant provisions:

a. The speed limits to be enforced on National Roads passing through all LGUs shall follow the recommended design speed under Volume IV of the 2015 DPWH Design Guidelines, Criteria and Standards provided hereunder, or such speed limits already indicated on speed limit signs installed by the DPWH along National Roads, provided that, such recommended design speed or speed limits indicated on speed limit signs shall not exceed the maximum allowable limits under Section 35 of RA 4136. (Section II.A.1)

- b. The DPWH shall set speed limits for National Roads based on the function, design and actual conditions of the road, subject to the approval of the DOTr, for purposes of speed limit enforcement. For purposes of enforcement, the DOTr shall inform the LTO and the relevant Sangguniang Bayan or Sangguniang Panlungsod of the speed limits set on roads within its jurisdiction. The relevant Sangguniang Panlungsod or Sangguniang Bayan may enact a speed limit ordinance for purposes of local enforcement. (Section II.A.2.a)
- c. The City or Municipal Government may propose speed limits for National Roads lower than those provided in Section II.A(1), to the appropriate LTO Regional Office and DPWH Regional Office for review and approval, prior to the enactment of a speed limit ordinance. (Section II.A.2.b)
- d. All City and Municipal Governments with existing speed limit ordinances affecting National Roads shall submit said ordinances to the appropriate LTO Regional Office and DPWH Regional Office for review, to determine the appropriateness of the speed limits set for National Roads. (Section II.A.2.b)

WHEREAS, there is a need for the local government units (LGUs) to adjust the speed limits where needed by enacting an ordinance reclassifying certain roads and thoroughfares under their areas of jurisdiction strictly following the procedures set in DOTr-DPWH-DILG JMC No. 2018-001, in order to help reduce the risk of road crashes and to provide basis for road apprehension by law enforcement agencies particularly the Land Transportation Office 10;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, on motion duly seconded during the 3rd Quarter Regional Peace and Order Council 10 (RPOC 10) Full Council Meeting on August 26, 2021, to recommend to the Local Government Units the enactment of a local ordinance updating the classification of roads and thoroughfares thereby setting the speed limits thereat to be made basis by law enforcement agencies in their road apprehension activities.

## JOINT MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2018-001

Subject: Guidelines and Standards for the Classification of Roads, Setting of Speed Limits Under Republic Act No. 4136, and Collection of Road Crash Data

#### I. Declaration of Policy

The occurrence of road crash fatalities and injuries is a serious public health issue that must be addressed globally, as an estimated 1.2 million die and over 50 million are injured in road crashes across the world every year. In the Philippines, the number of road crashes has been rising steadily from 12,875 in 2013 to 32,269 in 2016 based on data from the Philippine National Police. According to the most recent available data from the Philippine Statistics Authority, the number of deaths attributable to road crashes has also been rising, from 8,023 in 2011 to 8,761 in 2013.

Speeding is the most important contributor to road fatalities and is at the core of the road injury problem as it influences both crash risk and crash severity. The setting and strong enforcement of speed limits is one of the most effective interventions in significantly reducing road crashes and road crash fatalities and injuries. However, in the Philippines, the level of speed limit enforcement is very low.

The participation of local government units is vital in improving the level of speed limit enforcement in the Philippines. Sections 35 and 38 of Republic Act No. 4136 (RA 4136) or the Land Transportation and Traffic Code prescribes the maximum allowable speed for specific road classes and motor vehicles, and mandates local government units (LGUs) to classify roads within their jurisdiction for traffic purposes. Under Sections 447 (a)(5)(vi) and 458 (a)(5)(vi) of Republic Act No. 7160 (RA 7160) or the Local Government Code, City and Municipal Governments have the power to regulate traffic in all streets and bridges within their territorial boundaries,

and to enact measures that will enhance public health, safety, convenience, maintain peace and order, and promote the general welfare of their inhabitants.

However, many City and Municipal Governments in the Philippines have not yet classified roads within their jurisdiction or set local speed limits pursuant to their mandate under RA 4136 and the Local Government Code. There is, thus, a compelling need for City and Municipal Governments to issue speed limit ordinances. Further, there is a need to harmonize the road classifications under RA 4136 and the existing road classification by the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) under DPWH Memorandum dated 14 April 2014 in order to inform the public of the applicable speed limits on all roads.

The collaboration between LGUs and relevant national government agencies is vital in order to improve speed limit enforcement in the Philippines and, ultimately, curb the rising number of road crashes in the Philippines. Additionally, the timely and comprehensive collection of reliable data is crucial in improving road safety policymaking, and in monitoring and evaluating the impact of this Joint Memorandum Circular and other road safety policies. The DOTr, the Land Transportation Office (LTO), the DPWH, and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) have thus agreed to collaborate in order to improve the level of speed limit enforcement and road crash data collection in the Philippines.

#### **II.** Guidelines and Standards

In view of the supervisory powers of the DILG over LGUs and pursuant to RA 4136 and the rules and regulations issued by the DOTr and DPWH, all City, Municipal and Provincial Governments are enjoined to adopt and observe the following standards and guidelines in the formulation of ordinances and related issuances on road classification and speed limit enforcement.

#### A. National Roads

#### 1. Classification of National Roads

Unless otherwise provided by law, rules, and regulations issued by the DOTr, or by an ordinance duly enacted by a City or Municipal Government subject to Section II. A (2) herein, the speed limits to be enforced on National Roads passing through all LGUs shall follow the recommended design speed under Volume IV of the 2015 DPWH Design Guidelines, Criteria and Standards provided hereunder, or such speed limits already indicated on speed limit signs installed by the DPWH along National Roads, provided that, such recommended design speed or speed limits indicated on speed limit signs speed or speed limits indicated on speed limit signs speed or speed limits under Section 35 of RA 4136:

## 2. Speed Limit Ordinances Affecting National Roads

- a. As a general rule, the DPWH shall set speed limits for National Roads based on the function, design and actual conditions of the road, subject to the approval of the DOTr, for purposes of speed limit enforcement. For purposes of enforcement, the DOTr shall inform the LTO and the relevant Sangguniang Bayan or Sangguniang Panlungsod of the speed limits set on roads within its jurisdiction. The relevant Sangguniang Panlunsod or Sangguniang Bayan may enact a speed limit ordinance for purposes of local enforcement.
- b. When necessary for the safety of road users, the City or Municipal Government may propose speed limits for National Roads lower than those provided in Section II. A (1) herein, to the appropriate LTO Regional Office and DPWH Regional Office for review and approval, prior to the enactment of a speed limit ordinance.
- c. All City and Municipal Governments with existing speed limit ordinances affecting National Roads shall submit said ordinances to the appropriate LTO Regional Office and DPWH Regional Office for review, to determine the appropriateness of the speed limits set for National Roads. When necessary, the Regional Director of the LTO or the DPWH covering the city or municipality shall coordinate with the Sangguniang Bayan or Panlungsod on any amendments needed to ensure that the speed limit as set are safe and complies with RA 4136.

For purposes of this Joint Memorandum Circular, "speed limit ordinances" shall include any and all issuances by the local legislative body and/or the local chief executive classifying local roads, imposing applicable speed limits or implementing the provisions on speed restrictions under RA 4136, and other related laws.

#### **B.** Provincial Roads

## 1. Classification of Provincial Roads

a. For purposes of identifying applicable speed limits in accordance with RA 4136, Provincial Roads under DPWH Memorandum dated 14 April 2014 shall be classified as follows:

b. Unless otherwise provided by law, rules, and regulations issued by the DOTr, or by an issuance by the Provincial Government, subject to Section II. B (2) herein, the speed limits to be enforced on Provincial Roads passing through all cities and municipalities shall be those provided in this Section.

## 2. Speed Limit Ordinances Affecting Provincial Roads

a. When necessary for the safety of road users, the City or Municipal Government may propose speed limits for Provincial Roads constructed and/or maintained by the Provincial Government lower than those provided in Section II. B (1)(a) herein, to the Provincial Government for the setting of appropriate speed limits therein, subject to limitations set in section 62 of RA 4136.

- C. Municipal, City and Barangay Roads
- 1. Classification of Municipal, City and Barangay Roads
  - a. Pursuant to their mandate under Section 38 of RA 4136 and Sections 447 (a)(5)(vi) and 458 (a)(5)(vi) of RA 7160, all City and Municipal Governments are hereby enjoined to classify all Municipal or City Roads and Barangay Roads within their jurisdiction for the purpose of setting the appropriate speed limits.
  - b. The City or Municipal Government, through its Sanggunian, shall classify all Municipal or City Roads as either Municipal or City Streets or Crowded Streets as provided under RA 4136, based on actual road conditions as provided in Volume IV of the 2015 DPWH Design Guidelines, Criteria and Standards. Unless otherwise provided by an ordinance duly enacted by the appropriate City or Municipal Government, the following speed limits provided under RA 4136 shall apply in Municipal or City Streets, Barangay Roads and Crowded Streets.

#### 2. Speed Limit Ordinances for Municipal or City, and Barangay Roads

Pursuant to their mandate under Sections 447 (a)(5)(vi) and 458 (a)(5)(vi) of RA 7160, all City and Municipal Governments shall, as far as practicable, enact a speed limit ordinance classifying Municipal or City, and Barangay Roads and/or "Crowded Streets," setting the applicable speed limits therefor, subject to limitations set in section 62 of RA 4136, and imposing the appropriate penalties for the violation thereof. City and Municipal Governments may refer to the Template Speed Limit Ordinance (Annex A) for guidance on the key provisions of the speed limit ordinance.

For municipalities and component cities, the Sangguniang Bayan or Panlungsod shall be required to submit their speed limit ordinances to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for review, in accordance with Sections 56 and 468 (a)(1)(i) of the Local Government Code.

#### **D.** Common Provisions

#### 1. Lower Speed Limits

City and Municipal Governments may impose a speed limit lower than the maximum allowable speed limits under Section 35 of RA 4136 for National, City, Municipal or Barangay Roads when the actual road condition, road furniture, road use or road user mix require, for public safety, in accordance with Volume IV of the 2015 DPWH Design Guidelines, Criteria and Standards; *Provided that*, no City or Municipal Government shall enact an ordinance setting speed limits in excess of the maximum allowable speed limits provided under Section 35 of RA 4136; *Provided further that*, in the case of National Roads, the City or Municipal Government shall secure the approval of the LTO Regional Office and DPWH Regional Office as provided in Section II. A (2) of this Joint Memorandum Circular. *Provided finally, that*, in the case of Provincial Roads constructed and/or maintained by the Provincial Government, the Sangguniang Panlungsod or Sangguniang Bayan shall recommend safer speeds to the Provincial Government for the setting of appropriate speeds therein, in accordance with Section B (2).

#### 2. Determination of Crowded Streets

City and Municipal Governments shall identify roads or stretches of roads that may be considered as "crowded streets" in accordance with Section 35 (b) of RA 4136.

For purposes of this Joint Memorandum Circular, "crowded streets" shall refer to streets with heavy pedestrian traffic, including all streets within a five hundred (500)-meter radius of schools, public transportation terminals, markets, government buildings, churches and other places of worship, recreational places, facilities frequented by the youth, parks, shopping malls, movie houses, hotels, restaurants, and other public places as may be determined by the City or Municipal Government. In case of linear strips of crowded areas, the reckoning point for the five hundred (500)-meter radius shall be the first and the last crowded public place. The actual start and end point of the crowded street shall depend on the location of the road sign installed for this purpose.

#### 3. Supervision and Monitoring of Road Classification

The DOTr, LTO, and DPWH shall supervise and monitor the classification of roads and setting of speed limits by City and Municipal Governments. The City and Municipal Governments shall direct all concerns to the following offices:

For concerns related to (i) the DRIVER System; and (ii) for requests for training on enactment of the speed limit ordinance
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For concerns related to speed limit setting and enforcement	LTO	Office of the Executive Director
For concerns related to speed limit setting	DPWH	Office of the Director Bureau of Quality and Safety
For concerns related to classification of roads	DPWH	Office of the Director Planning Service
For concerns related to speed limit enforcement (Metro Manila area)	MMDA	Office of the Director Traffic Discipline Office

#### 4. Training on Speed Limit Setting and Enforcement

The DOTr, through the LTO, in coordination with the DILG, DPWH and civil society organizations shall be responsible for training and information dissemination on speed limit setting and enforcement strategies, to assist City and Municipal Governments in the enactment and implementation of local speed limit ordinances and related policies.

#### 5. Deputation of Law Enforcement Officers

- a. The LTO shall develop a training module for speed limit enforcement and disseminate the same through LTO Regional Offices.
- b. All City and Municipal Governments shall, when necessary, determine the number of additional Law Enforcement Officers (LEOs) necessary for the implementation of the ordinance, and submit a request for the conduct of a deputation training on speed limit enforcement for any additional LEO required by the City or Municipal Government, prior to the enactment of the speed limit ordinance. This provision shall not be construed as to prohibit City and Municipal Governments from enforcing its speed limit ordinance through their local traffic units.
- c. For purposes of this Joint Memorandum Circular, "LEOs" shall, refer to members of the Philippine National Police (PNP), members of the Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), and other public officers deputized by the LTO for speed limit enforcement.
- d. All LTO Regional Offices are hereby directed to prioritize the deputation training of LEOs to be assigned to the enforcement of speed limit ordinances.

#### 6. Installation of Speed Limit Signs

a. The City or Municipal Government shall be responsible for appropriating funds for the procurement and installation of speed limit signs along Municipal Roads, City Roads, and Barangay Roads. For Provincial Roads constructed and/or maintained by the Provincial Government, the Provincial Government shall perform such function.

- b. For portions of National Roads passing through the City or Municipal Government's jurisdiction that have been duly classified as Crowded Streets, for which no speed limit sign has been installed, the City or Municipal Government may, subject to approval of the LTO and DPWH Regional Offices, cause the procurement and installation of speed limit signs, or request the DPWH to install said speed limit signs.
- c. All speed limit signs installed pursuant to this Joint Memorandum Circular shall, as far as practicable, comply with the technical specifications prescribed under the current Road Signs and Pavement Markings Manual of the Highway Safety Design Standards issued by the DPWH.

#### 7. Road Safety Engineering

- a. All City and Municipal Governments shall be guided by Volume IV of the 2015 DPWH Design Guidelines, Criteria and Standards and shall consult the DPWH Regional Office on the road safety engineering design required to ensure that the speed limit ordinance is safely implemented.
- b. The DPWH Regional Office shall provide guidance on the need for transition speed limits and appropriate traffic calming measures to ensure that speed limits are safely observed by road users.
- c. The DPWH shall provide the necessary infrastructure and assistance required to accommodate the installation of speed sensors or radars on national highways.

#### 8. Database of Speed Limit Policies

- a. All LGUs are enjoined to submit local speed limit ordinances, including existing speed limit ordinances, traffic codes, and ordinances with speed limit provisions, to the appropriate LTO Regional Office for monitoring and coordination.
- b. All LTO Regional Offices shall transmit all local speed limit ordinances submitted by LGUs to the DOTr. The DOTr, through the LTO, shall maintain a centralized database of speed limits and speed limit ordinances passed by LGUs, which shall be accessible to the public.

#### 9. Road Inventory

a. All City and Municipal Governments are enjoined to conduct and maintain an inventory of roads to facilitate the determination of road classifications and

appropriate speed limits. For this purpose, City and Municipal Governments may consult the DPWH, and request access to its maps of national primary and secondary roads, expressways, and provincial roads, if needed.

- b. All road inventories of City, Municipal and Provincial Roads shall be transmitted to the DILG, DPWH and DOTr by email for information and monitoring.
- c. At the end of every year, the City and Municipal Governments shall update the inventory, as necessary.

#### 10. Collection and Analysis of Road Crash Data

- a. City and Municipal Governments shall be primarily responsible for the collection and encoding of road crash data for road crashes occurring within their jurisdiction, into the Data for Road Incident Visualization Evaluation and Reporting (DRIVER) System. Road crash data shall refer to information relating to the crash incident, which, at the minimum, should include the following:
  - i. Date and time
  - ii. Location (with address, land marks, and coordinates, if available)
  - iii. Name of people involved
  - iv. Number of people involved
  - v. Cause
  - vi. Collision type
  - vii. Severity (fatal, injury, property damage)
  - viii. Vehicle or road user type
  - ix. Involvement of children (0-12)

As far as practicable, City and Municipal Governments shall adopt the template road crash data report (Annex B) or the Investigative Report Form of the Philippine National Police.

- b. All City and Municipal Governments shall create or assign a specific office, department or focal person for the collection, monitoring and analysis of road crash data. Absent such designation, the office assigned to traffic management shall perform this function.
- c. City and Municipal Governments are directed to encode and record their road crash data through the DRIVER System of the DOTr, which shall be the central and nationwide repository for road crash data. The DOTr, in coordination with the DILG, DPWH and civil society organizations, shall be responsible for training and information dissemination on the use of the DRIVER System.
- d. City and Municipal Governments intending to use the DRIVER system shall designate the analyst/s assigned to use the DRIVER system. The analyst shall

be granted access to the system by submitting a letter of intent (Annex C) to the DOTr, signed by the mayor, through any of the following modes:

City and Municipal Governments may also request to cancel, delete or revise user access by submitting a letter of intent to the DOTr.

e. City and Municipal Governments without reliable internet access may request the Regional LTO or Regional DILG Office for permission to use its Information Technology infrastructure to upload their data regularly.

#### **11. Review and Evaluation of Impact**

Within three (3) years from the effectivity of this Joint Memorandum Circular, the DOTr shall review and evaluate this policy to determine its impact on road safety and to identify other interventions needed to reduce the number of road crashes in the Philippines.

#### **12. Compliance Monitoring**

Within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Joint Memorandum Circular and annually thereafter, the LTO Regional Offices are hereby directed to report to the DOTr on the LGUs' compliance with this Joint Memorandum Circular. Failure to comply with this Joint Memorandum Circular may subject the liable officer to administrative sanctions.
