**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2(D) OF ORDINANCE NO. 14385-2022, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE TAX RELIEF ORDINANCE OF 2022, SO AS TO GRANT CONDONATION OF ALL ARREARS, SURCHARGES, INTERESTS AND PENALTIES OF DELINQUENT STALL RENTALS IN ALL PUBLIC MARKETS AND TERMINALS FOR THE YEAR 2021 AND PRIOR YEARS; PROVIDED, THAT STALL RENTALS FOR THE YEAR 2022 SHALL BE PAID IN FULL WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS FROM THE EFFECTIVITY OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the 20<sup>th</sup> City Council (*Sangguniang Panlungsod*) in session duly assembled that:

**SECTION 1.** Section 2(d) of Ordinance No. 14385-2022, otherwise known as the Tax Relief Ordinance of 2022, is hereby amended so as to grant condonation of all arrears, surcharges, interests and penalties of stall rental fees and charges in all public markets for the year 2021 and prior years, to read as follows:

“X-X-X

**SECTION 2. Coverage; Relief.** – Subject to compliance of the guidelines and requirements imposed under this Ordinance, there shall be granted relief in the form of condonation from payment of the following:

‘X-X-X

- ‘(d) All arrears, surcharges, interests and penalties of delinquent stall rental fees and charges in all public markets and terminals covering the year 2021 and prior years; *Provided*, That the condonation applicant pays in full his/her CY 2022 stall rental fees and charges, and business permit fees and taxes within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Ordinance.

‘Non-delinquent stall holders are hereby granted 30% discount of their stall rental payment, which shall be applied in the form of tax credit for the year 2022 and 2023; and

**SECTION 2.** Section 3(C) of the same Ordinance is likewise hereby amended to read as follows:

**SECTION 3. Qualified Tax Relief/Condonation Applicants** – The following shall be qualified to avail of the condonation under Section 2 of this Ordinance, to wit:

**‘(C) STALL HOLDERS**

- i) ‘Stall awardees in all City-owned and -operated markets and terminals who are delinquent from payment of stall rental fees and charges for the year 2021 and prior years.

SUBJECT : **CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES FOR ROAD CONVERSION FROM LOCAL TO NATIONAL ROADS AND VICE VERSA**

To provide a set of criteria and guidelines for the evaluation of roads for conversion from local to national and vice versa relative to Executive Order (EO) No. 124, series of 1987, Section 5(i), which mandates the DPWH to classify roads and highways into national, regional, provincial, city, municipal, and barangay roads and highways, based on objective criteria it shall adopt; provide or authorize the conversion of roads and highways from one category to another that focuses on the functionality of a road in relation to the national road network.

I. The conversion of roads and highways shall be evaluated based on the following road functional classification criteria:

**NATIONAL ROADS:**

**1.) Primary Roads**

1.1 A contiguous length of significant road sections extending linearly without any breaks or forks that *connect major cities (At least around 100,000 population)* comprising the main trunk line or the backbone of the National Road System.

**2.) Secondary Roads**

- 2.1 Directly connect cities to national primary roads, except in metropolitan areas
- 2.2 Directly connect major ports and major ferry terminals to national primary roads
- 2.3 Directly connect major airports to national primary roads
- 2.4 Directly connect tourist service centers to national primary roads
- 2.5 Directly connect cities (not included in the category of major cities)
- 2.6 Directly connect provincial capitals within the same region
- 2.7 Directly connect major national government infrastructure to national primary roads or other national secondary roads

**3.) Applicable only for Primary and Secondary Roads**

- 3.1 Bypass/Diversion Roads
  - Roads that divert through traffic away from the City/Municipality Business Center (with affirmative Feasibility Study).
- 3.2 Roads that would connect or fill the gap between adjoining national roads (protruding) to form a continuous national road network.

**4.) Tertiary Roads**

- 4.1 Other existing roads under the DPWH which perform local function.

Refer to (**Attachment 1**) for the definition of underlined terms and (**Attachment 2**) for the list of the requirements for bypasses.

## **LOCAL ROADS:**

### **1.) Provincial Roads**

- 1.1 Connect cities and municipalities without traversing National Roads.
- 1.2 Connect National Roads to barangays through rural areas.
- 1.3 Connect to major provincial government infrastructure.

### **2.) Municipal and City Roads**

- 2.1 Roads within the poblacion.
- 2.2 Roads that connect to provincial and national roads.
- 2.3 Roads that provide inter-barangay connections to major municipal and city infrastructure without traversing provincial roads.

### **3.) Barangay Roads**

- 3.1 Other public roads (officially turned over) within the barangay and not covered in the above definitions.

## **OTHER ROADS**

### **1.) Expressways**

- 1.1 Highways with limited access, normally with interchanges; may include facilities for levying tolls for passage in an open or closed system.

**II.** The conversion of a local road into a national road shall be evaluated based on the following guidelines:

- a.) **The local road shall comply with at least one of the DPWH Road Functional Classification Criteria for a national road for it to be meritorious for conversion; otherwise the conversion is not possible.**
- b.) If the road is meritorious for conversion, the following technical requirements shall be submitted/complied before a road can be processed and converted into a national road:
  - Proof of acquisition of the required minimum **20-meter road right-of-way (RROW)** per EO 113, Series of 1955 and minimum of **15-meter RROW** for cases within highly urbanized areas per EO 621, s1980 (**Absolute Requirement**); such as Deeds of Donation or sale duly notarized indicating the lot number, OCT/TCT number, area acquired including technical description, sketches and Real Property Tax Declaration Number, and/or certifications from the concerned Provincial/City/Municipality Register of Deeds in order to ensure the Department that there will be no expense from its part for any claims for the payment of RROW that may arise therefrom; and
  - Certification from the concerned Registry of Deeds and/or DENR to ensure the DPWH that there will be no expense from its part for any claims for the payment of RROW that may arise therefrom; and
  - Certification from the District Engineer concerned that the road is within the DPWH's standards of at least 20-meter RROW, with at least 6-meter carriageway width gravel surfacing and in maintainable condition.

**III.** The request/proposal for conversion of a local road (provincial, municipal, city, or barangay road) into a national road or vice-versa shall be submitted to the DPWH Secretary, through the Undersecretary for Planning and PPP, by the concerned DPWH Regional Director supported by the following documents:

- a.) Resolution from the City/Municipal/Provincial Board requesting the conversion of a local road into a national road (**Absolute Requirement**)
- b.) Endorsement from the DPWH Regional Office (*Those initially evaluated meritoriously by the Regional Planning and Design Division (RPDD) should be endorsed.*); and
- c.) Map showing the location of the road indicating its start and end limits, network connectivity and national importance.

**IV. Planning Service (PS)** through the **Statistics Division (SD)** evaluate proposed roads for conversion using the above-mentioned criteria and requirements using the Evaluation Sheet (**Attachment 3**); inspect and survey the road configuration using the Inventory Sheet (**Attachment 4**), investigate compliance to requirements and make recommendation as to the merit of the proposal.

The **Project Preparation Division (PPD)**, PS, shall evaluate proposed roads (*bypasses/diversion roads*) for conversion that requires a **feasibility study** that will determine its viability in satisfying the conditions set forth under (**Attachment 2**)

This Department Order shall take effect immediately.

**SECTION 1. PILOT IMPLEMENTATION:** The pilot implementation will be considered as part of the TWG activities and will be placed under the strict supervision of the DOT. The Final Report of the TWG will be submitted to the House of Representatives and Senate which shall serve as valuable inputs for legislative action.

**SECTION 2. BASIC GUIDELINES:** In order to ensure the efficiency of the pilot implementation, the TWG formulated the following basic guidelines:

- A. **Areas of Implementation.** The pilot implementation will run within Metro Manila and Metro Cebu.
- B. **Safety Requirements.** Both the rider and passenger must comply with safety gear laws. In addition, the following measures shall also be strictly implemented and followed:
  - a. Rider should be equipped with helmet and reflectorized vest with relevant Motorcycle Taxi branding and identification card which includes the rider number;
  - b. Passenger should be equipped with reflectorized helmet;
  - c. Only helmets with Philippine Standards (PS) or Import Commodity Clearance (ICC) helmets shall be allowed;
  - d. Rider must wear a body or vest-based strap or belt that can be held by the passenger to remain stable in case the passenger is uncomfortable holding the rider's waist;
  - e. Riders shall drive no faster than 60kph along any road while on duty, even if the speed limit permits higher speeds
  - f. Riders shall observe speed limit in all roads such as schools, churches, markets;
  - g. Riders shall abide by all available traffic rules and regulations;
  - h. Rider needs to observe maximum payload of the motorcycle;
  - i. Riders shall ensure that motorcycles are routinely maintained and all safety gear are in good condition;
  - j. Riders must wear proper uniform e.g. pants and shoes; and
  - k. Riders shall only be allowed to serve ten (10) hours a day, or as prescribed by the LTRFB.
- C. **Data Sharing**
  - a. The Pilot Implementation should run on a Motorcycle Ride Hailing app-based platform;
  - b. The participating ride-hailing platform for the pilot implementation must, on a monthly basis, submit raw data on the following:
    - i. Road crashes and complaints from passengers;
    - ii. Collation of service feedback from passengers;
    - iii. Any data on trips, kilometers travelled, fares collected, as determined by the DOT; and
    - iv. Metro Cebu pilot implementation will gather data for mountainous and rural areas to determine best course of action for motorcycles-for-hire specific to those locations.
  - c. Have access to a feedback mechanism for both rider and passenger to raise

- complaints or other issues (e.g. accidents, lost items, etc.);
- d. The Data for Road Incident Visualization Evaluation and Reporting System (DRIVERS) and the other road safety databases (MMARAS, PSA, ONEISS-DOH) shall be utilized for this pilot implementation;
- D. *Monitoring*. The TWG shall convene on a monthly basis and reports shall be provided to all members one week prior to the meeting.
- E. *Fare Matrix*
- a. The following fare matrix shall be utilized for the purpose of the pilot implementation:
    - a. Metro Manila: Php 50 for 1<sup>st</sup> 2km, Php10/km up to 7km and Php 15 for the succeeding km with dynamic pricing based on supply and demand with 1.5x surge cap;
    - b. Metro Cebu: Php20 for 1<sup>st</sup> km, Php16/km up to 8km, and Php 20/km above 8km; and
    - c. Surge cap will be adjusted and reviewed by the LTFRB.
- F. *Timeline*. The pilot implementation shall run for six (6) months, unless a law is sooner enacted, in which case the TWG becomes *functus officio* and the pilot shall cease. The TWG may reconvene and recommend the extension if necessary.
- G. *Key Performance Indicators (KPI)*. The following shall serve as the KPI for the pilot implementation:
  1. Accident Threshold (both major and minor incidents) – Five (5) Percent of total rides; any major or fatal incident will call immediately for an emergency TWG meeting, followed by an investigation and decide appropriate next steps which may include possible suspension of the pilot implementation;
  2. Traffic Rules Violation reported by the PNP-HPG, MMDA, LTO and other traffic-enforcement agencies; and
  3. Customer Feedback from Frequent Customers.
- H. *Participating Riders*. A total of 27,000 riders shall form part of this pilot implementation.
- I. *Insurance*. Accident insurance should be secured and on par with or above Passenger Personal Accident Insurance Program (PPAIP) rates;
- J. *Passenger Safety Campaign*. A comprehensive safety campaign for the public to ensure that all passengers are knowledgeable in pillion-riding shall be implemented.

**SECTION 3. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS:** Participating ride-hailing platform shall comply with the following requirements:

- a. Riders must possess or pass the following:
  - i. Professional Driver's License
  - ii. NBI Clearance
  - iii. Police or Barangay Clearance
  - iv. Pillion-ferrying Skills Assessment
  - v. Traffic Rules and Regulations Written Exam
  - vi. Customer Relations Training for Riders
  - vii. Official Receipt/Certificate of Registration for the motorcycle under rider's name, otherwise, proof-of-ownership (e.g. deed-of-sale) or authorization letter to use must be provided
  - viii. Completed Passenger Courtesy Training to avoid sexual harassment and discrimination, among others

**SECTION 2. PILOT IMPLEMENTATION:** The pilot implementation will be considered as part of the TWG activities and will be placed under the strict supervision of the DOTr. The Final Report of the TWG and the result of the Public Consultation will be submitted to DOTr for approval before submission to the House of Representatives and Senate which shall serve as valuable inputs for legislative action.

**SECTION 3. AREAS OF IMPLEMENTATION:** The pilot implementation will run within Metro Manila, Metro Cebu and Cagayan De Oro City.

**SECTION 4. BASIC GUIDELINES:** In order to ensure the efficiency of the pilot implementation, the TWG formulated the basic guidelines to be strictly implemented and followed:

b. Motorcycle Specifications:

- i. 100-200 cubic centimeter (cc) conventional engine displacement
- ii. Allowable build types include: underbone, scooter, business motorcycle models only. No aggressive sport, off-road or enduro bikes.
- iii. Pillion seat and foot pegs must be in good condition, and exhaust pipe shall be insulated. Any modifications made shall adhere to the LTO standard; and
- iv. No modifications to engine, air intake, exhaust, or wiring.

c. Bookings. All bookings shall only be made within and via the app platform.


d. Passengers, among other things, must:

- i. Comply with proper safety gear requirements;
- ii. Passengers to seat front-facing only;
- iii. Riders may refuse passengers that are in the influence of alcohol, PWDs' who cannot hold on safely as passenger, children seven (7) year old and below; and
- iv. Safely secure the hand-carry bag.

**SECTION 4. TERMINATION.** The TWG may recommend for the termination of the pilot implementation upon assessment of the operations.

**SECTION 5. EFFECTIVITY.** The Pilot Implementation for the Motorcycle Taxi shall take effect one (1) month after the approval of the Secretary, provided that the Information Education Campaign (IEC) has been properly executed.

**ON SAFETY:**

1. The Motorcycle Specifications shall be as follows:
  - i. 100-155 cubic centimeter (cc) conventional engine displacement
  - ii. Allowable build types include: underbone, scooter, business motorcycle models only. No aggressive sport, off-road or enduro bikes.
  - iii. Pillion seat and foot pegs must be in good condition, and exhaust pipe shall be insulated. Any modifications made shall adhere to the LTO standard; and
  - iv. No modifications to engine, air intake, exhaust, or wiring.
  - v. Motorcycles without top boxes shall have a helmet bag secured by a flexible strap.
  
2. The Biker/Rider must comply with the following safety measures:
  - a. Rider must comply with safety gear laws;
  - b. Rider should be equipped with helmet and reflectorized vest with relevant Motorcycle Taxi branding and identification card which includes the rider control number provided by LTFRB. Only helmets with Philippine Standards (PS) or Import Commodity Clearance (ICC) shall be allowed;
  - c. Rider must wear a belt-based strap with at least 4 handles that can be held by the passenger for stability;
  - d. Rider must be in good health condition prior to accreditation by MC providers as certified by public hospitals or DOH accredited clinics.
  - e. Rider shall drive no faster than 60kph along any road while on duty, even if the speed limit permits higher speeds
  - f. Rider shall observe speed limit in all roads such as schools, churches, markets, hospitals;
  - g. Rider shall abide by all available traffic rules and regulations;
  - h. Rider needs to observe maximum payload of the motorcycle;
  - i. Rider shall ensure that motorcycles are routinely maintained and all safety gear are in good condition;
  - j. Rider must wear proper uniform e.g. pants and shoes; and
  - k. Rider shall only be allowed to serve ten (10) hours a day, or as prescribed by the LTFRB.
  
3. The passenger must comply with the following safety measures:
  - a. Passenger should be provided with reflectorized helmet and comply with proper safety gear requirements;
  - b. Passenger to seat front-facing only;
  - c. The following passengers shall not be allowed to ride:
    - i. Passenger who is under the influence of alcohol, drugs and other banned substances;
    - d. PWD who cannot hold –on safely
    - e. Children covered by R.A. 10666 or the Children's Safety on Motorcycles Act of 2015
    - f. Pregnant women

**ON SECURITY:**

1. Participating Ride Hailing Platform Providers shall require the Riders to submit the following:
  - a. Professional Driver's License
  - b. NBI Clearance
  - c. Police or Barangay Clearance
  - d. Court Clearance/Public Prosecutor's Clearance
  - e. Pillion-ferrying Skills Assessment
  - f. Traffic Rules and Regulations Written Exam
  - g. Customer Relations Training for Riders
  - h. Official Receipt/Certificate of Registration for the motorcycle under rider's name, otherwise, proof-of-ownership (e.g. deed-of-sale) or authorization letter to use must be provided
  - i. Completed Passenger Courtesy Training to avoid sexual harassment and discrimination, among others

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**SECTION 5. DATA SHARING:** To obtain the necessary data, the Participating Ride Hailing Platform Providers and Participating Bikers/Riders shall comply with the following:

- a. The TWG or any designated IT expert must be allowed to access to the Participating Ride Hailing Platform Provider database for validation and verification.
- b. All Riders must register with the LTRRD to create a database of participating Riders. The data format shall be provided by the TWG;
- c. The Pilot Implementation should run on a Motorcycle Ride Hailing app-based platform;
- d. The participating ride-hailing platform for the pilot implementation must submit a List of Bikers/Riders registered in their platform.
- e. The MC taxi providers must provide free online access to the feed back mechanism from the passenger and riders.
- f. The participating ride-hailing platform for the pilot implementation must, on a monthly basis, submit raw data on the following:
  - i. Road crashes and complaints from passengers;
  - ii. Collation of service feedback from passengers;
  - iii. Any data on trips, kilometers travelled, fares collected, as determined by the DOTr;
  - iv. Metro Cebu pilot implementation will gather data for mountainous and rural areas to determine best course of action for motorcycles-for-hire specific to those locations; and
  - v. Modifications or updates of their mobile application, if any.
- g. Have access to a feedback mechanism for both rider and passenger to raise complaints or other issues (e.g. accidents, lost items, etc.);
- h. The Data for Road Incident Visualization Evaluation and Reporting System (DRIVERS) and the other road safety databases (MMARAS, PSA, ONEISS-DOH) shall be utilized for this pilot implementation;

**SECTION 6. MONITORING AND EVALUATION:** The TWG Members shall convene on a monthly basis with the following data and report to be submitted one week prior to the meeting, for validation and evaluation:

1. Data provided by the Participating Ride Hailing Platform Provider;
2. Reports from the other government agencies concerned (PNP-HPG, MMDA, LTO & other traffic enforcement agencies)
3. Periodic validation on the mobile apps system operation.
4. TWG must validate the data submitted by MC Taxi provider by accessing their database and platform.
5. TWG must validate the actual report submitted by MC Taxi provider from other government agencies concerned.
6. TWG must validate the feedback report of the rider & passenger from the mobile apps platform and for on-line feed mechanism.
7. TWG must conduct surveys to get feedback from riders and passenger.

**SECTION 7. FARE MATRIX:** The following fare matrix shall be utilized for the purpose of the pilot implementation:

- a. Metro Manila: Php 50 for 1st 2km, Php10/km up to 7km and Php 15 for the succeeding km; and
- b. Metro Cebu/Cagayan De Oro: Php20 for 1st km, Php16/km up to 8km, and Php 20/km above 8km.

**SECTION 8. PERIOD OF PILOT IMPLEMENTATION:** The pilot implementation shall run for three (3) months from 23 December 2019 and shall terminate on 23 March 2020. Said period may be extended for another three (3) months upon favorable recommendation of the TWG. In case a law is enacted amending RA 4136 and other related laws allowing Motorcycles as Public Utility Vehicle, the TWG becomes functus officio and the pilot implementation shall cease.

**SECTION 9. KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS (KPI):** The following shall serve as the KPI for the pilot implementation:

1. Accident Threshold (both major and minor incidents) – Five (5) Percent of total rides; any major or fatal incident will call immediately for an emergency TWG meeting, followed by an investigation and decide appropriate next steps which may include possible suspension of the pilot implementation;
2. Traffic Rules Violation reported by the PNP-HPG, MMDA, LTO and other traffic-enforcement agencies; and
3. Customer Feedback from Frequent Customers.

**SECTION 10. PARTICIPATING RIDERS:** A total of 45,000 riders for Metro Manila, 9,000 riders for Metro Cebu and 9,000 riders for Cagayan De Oro City shall form part of this pilot implementation. The number of riders shall be divided evenly among qualified Ride Hailing Platform Providers.

**SECTION 11. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS:** Participating ride-hailing platform shall comply with the following operational requirements:

1. All bookings shall only be made within and via the app platform.
2. Accident insurance should be secured and on par with or above Passenger Personal Accident Insurance Program (PPAIP) rates;
3. A comprehensive safety campaign for the public to ensure that all passengers are knowledgeable in pillion-riding shall be implemented.
4. Existing motorcycle units with or/cr as of 1 December 2019 shall be allowed to be included in the pilot implementation.
5. A one motorcycle-one rider must strictly be observed in the implementation.

**SECTION 12. BLACKLISTING:** Ride-Hailing Platform Providers and Riders registered in their platform found operating without authority shall be blacklisted from applying and operating should a law be enacted amending RA 4136 and other related laws allowing Motorcycles as Public Utility Vehicle. All other motorcycle not registered with DOTr/LTFRB but operating as a motorcycle taxi shall be considered as colorum.

**SECTION 13. TERMINATION.** The TWG may recommend for the termination of the pilot implementation upon assessment of the operations. The TWG may likewise pre- terminate the Pilot Implementation in case of violation of ride hailing platform providers and its registered bikers of any provisions of this guidelines.

**SECTION 14. CREATION OF DATABASE.** LTFRB is tasked to register all riders included in the pilot implementation and to create and build a database.

**SECTION 15. EFFECTIVITY.** The Extended Pilot Implementation for the Motorcycle Taxi shall take effect on 23 December 2019.







**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT**

This Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") is entered into by:

The **CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY GOVERNMENT ("CDO LGU")**, a local government unit created under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with principal office address at the City Hall Compound, Capistrano-Hayes Sts., Cagayan De Oro City, represented herein by its City Mayor, **ROLANDO "KLAREX" A. UY**;  
and

**PHILIPPINE BUSINESS FOR EDUCATION, INC. ("PBE")**, a non-stock, non-profit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with principal office address at 2nd Floor, AIM Conference Center, Benavidez Street corner Trasierra Street, Legaspi Village, Makati City, represented herein by its Executive Director, **LOVELAINE B. BASILLOTE**;

With CDO LGU and PBE hereinafter individually referred to as a "Party," and together, as the "Parties."

**WITNESSETH:**

**WHEREAS**, CDO LGU, under the present administration, considers workforce development, employment facilitation, and youth empowerment an important development thrust;

**WHEREAS**, CDO LGU is committed to collaborate with various stakeholders in the efforts to enhance the quality of education in the local government unit;

**WHEREAS**, PBE is the business community's response to the need for sustained and strategic education reform in the Philippines, with core focus on building consensus as a neutral but critical industry voice on specific education to employment programs and policies;

**WHEREAS**, PBE has a local pilot project implementation called "*JobsNext*" with the support of Citi Foundation, primarily to ensure the employability of the Filipino youth by providing industry-relevant, demand-driven, up-to-date, and appropriate skills training programs for jobs of the future;

**WHEREAS**, the Parties acknowledge the synergies among their programs and likewise agree to collaborate in order to leverage support from the business sector to increase access of unemployed and out-of-school Filipino youth to quality training and employment opportunities;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Parties agree as follows:

**ARTICLE 1. SCOPE**

This MOA is made and entered into by the Parties to establish clear and concise guidelines for the local pilot implementation of the JobsNext project.

- 1.1. The Parties shall focus on collaborative activities around the main objectives, to wit:
  - 1.1.1. Leverage available and allowable resources to support JobsNext trainees' needs, such as but not limited to the conduct of skills training and provision of subsidies;
  - 1.1.2. Recruitment of youth trainee-candidates to apply as project beneficiaries;
  - 1.1.3. Facilitation of private sector engagement in the project; and

1.1.4. Providing possible employment opportunities for project beneficiaries after their training.

1.2. The implementation of JobsNext in Cagayan de Oro City has a confirmed funding that aims to benefit the duly identified youth beneficiaries in Cagayan de Oro City. A copy of the JobsNext briefer is attached hereto and made an integral part of this MOA as Annex "A".

The JobsNext Project seeks to mitigate the negative impacts of Industry 4.0 on the employability of the Philippine labor force by providing industry-relevant, demand-driven, up-to-date, and appropriate skilling programs. It will do this by providing a skills voucher to train 1,000 young individuals aged 18-25 on future skills in specific cities/areas of scope and creating a governance and implementing framework that can be replicated by other cities after the end of project life.

This shall be accomplished by partnering with local government units, organizing city-level strategic oversight bodies known as the local Future Skills Councils (FSCs), supporting the JobsNext secretariat, and supporting a community outreach and engagement plan.

## ARTICLE 2. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under this partnership, the LGU's role shall be:

### 2.1. Manpower Commitments

- 2.1.1. Lead the implementation of the Project in their territorial jurisdiction;
- 2.1.2. Identify Local Government Unit personnel who, in coordination with PBEd, shall lead the implementation of projects, activities, and programs relevant to the purpose of this MOA;
- 2.1.3. Assign personnel who shall act as local secretariat and focal person for the project;
- 2.1.4. Ensure participation of LGU personnel assigned to this Project in relevant capacity-building activities and other workshops or training programs to be hosted by the other Party;
- 2.1.5. Ensure collaboration between and among LGU sub-units, other offices and/or individuals of the local government concerned with workforce development, employment facilitation, and youth development to provide support in the recruitment of potential trainees for JobsNext;
- 2.1.6. Lead the creation of the Local Future Skills Council (LFSC) and ensure that all members of the LFSC are performing their duties;
- 2.1.7. Monitor and evaluate trainee performance, in coordination with PBEd; and
- 2.1.8. Identify a focal person in the implementation of this MOA.

### 2.2. Data Commitments

- 2.2.1. Share relevant and allowable information on the employment and unemployment status of youth constituents and the key employment generating and emerging growth sectors and business in the City, in order to identify training and employment opportunities that would need JobsNext intervention;
- 2.2.2. Ensure participation and representation of the LGU in project-related monitoring and evaluation activities, including relevant research and policy studies, to be conducted by other Partner organizations; and
- 2.2.3. Cooperate in other areas that are consistent with the objectives of both Parties and the spirit of this MOA.

### 2.3. Other Commitments

- 2.3.1. Identify and recruit potential beneficiaries of the project;

- 2.3.2. Connect training completers to potential employment opportunities through appropriate employment-related activities such as job fairs and the like;
- 2.3.3. Promote participation of employer-companies, schools, and training institutions in hosting trainees for various components of the program;
- 2.3.4. Invite PBE to activities where JobsNext can be promoted and potential beneficiaries for youth trainee recruitment and private sector engagement can be encouraged to join;
- 2.3.5. Encourage participation of the City's partner companies and schools or training institutions in hosting JobsNext trainees for the various training components of the program;
- 2.3.6. Provide mechanisms and support that will aid the beneficiaries in having access to technical-vocational education and skills development training programs;
- 2.3.7. Facilitate relevant partnerships with companies, education and training institutions, and other government agencies, as appropriate and feasible; and
- 2.3.8. Undertake to provide logistics and budget support, where feasible and appropriate, including but not limited to provisioning of training facilities, conduct of training programs, and other related requirements.

**2.4. PBE shall:**

- 2.4.1. Co-lead in the local pilot implementation of the project;
- 2.4.2. Share relevant and allowable information on the JobsNext status including, but not limited to, the research results conducted by its consultant/s relevant to the project;
- 2.4.3. In coordination with the CDO LGU, shall lead in the discussions with the City's partner companies and schools or training institutions in hosting JobsNext trainees for the various training components of the program;
- 2.4.4. Participate in the activities of the other Party where JobsNext can be promoted and potential beneficiaries for youth trainee recruitment and private sector engagement can be encouraged to join, as may be required;
- 2.4.5. Conduct and share relevant information from JobsNext-related monitoring and evaluation activities, including other relevant research studies;
- 2.4.6. Invite representatives of the other Party to relevant capacity-building activities and other workshops or training programs;
- 2.4.7. Assist in youth mobilization and communication matters of the project;
- 2.4.8. Connect PESO to companies and/or organizations for possible partnerships in providing employment opportunities to training completers; and
- 2.4.9. Cooperate in other areas that are consistent with the objectives of both Parties and the spirit of this MOA.

**ARTICLE 3. EFFECTIVITY AND TERMINATION**

- 3.1. This Agreement shall be in effect until September 30, 2023, unless earlier terminated or extended upon written agreement of the Parties. The Party requesting termination shall submit at least thirty (30) days written notice to the other Party specifying the reason.

**ARTICLE 4. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

- 4.1. **Relationship of Parties.** Each Party has made an independent decision to enter into this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as constituting the Parties as partners, principal-agent, or



employer-employee as defined under the law or as authorizing one Party to create any obligation on behalf of another Party.

- 4.2. **Representations and Warranties.** Each Party represents to the other Party that it has the full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligation and that this Agreement will not violate any of its contracts.
- 4.3. **Compliance with Law.** In carrying out its obligations under this Agreement, a Party shall comply with applicable laws, rules, and regulations, including those relating to data privacy and anti-graft and corrupt practices.
- 4.4. **Confidentiality.** A Party shall not disclose, without the written consent of the other Party, any confidential information that may come to its knowledge by virtue of this Agreement.
- 4.5. **Data Privacy Compliance.** The Parties shall each be responsible for their respective compliance with Data Privacy Law, rules and regulations. Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as constituting either party as a personal information controller or personal information processor of other parties herein, except that the Parties are free to subsequently enter into such agreements, to be embodied in the appropriate Agreement.
- 4.6. **Intellectual Property.** The Parties shall each be responsible for ensuring their respective use of intellectual property of third persons are not infringing. Any intellectual property generated by virtue of the instant Agreement shall respectively belong to its originators, as applicable.
- 4.7. **Use of Name and Logo.** The name and logo of the Parties or any of their programs and projects may be used for collaterals (digital and large-format publicity and event materials) only if: a) the prior written consent of the concerned Party is obtained; b) the use is consistent with the objectives of the Agreement; c) there is no alteration; and d) the use shall not be for any misleading, fraudulent, immoral, or illegal purpose. The tarpaulin size required under accounting and auditing rules and regulations shall be observed.
- 4.8. **Assignment.** This Agreement may not be assigned by a Party without the written consent of the other Party.
- 4.9. **Force Majeure.** In the event of force majeure, the affected Party shall promptly send written notice to the other Party and shall use its best efforts to remove or remedy its inability to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement as a result of the force majeure.
- 4.10. **Separability.** In case any of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall be declared invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.
- 4.11. **Settlement of Dispute.** In the event of any dispute between the Parties, the Parties shall first seek to resolve the dispute amicably. Should the Parties fail to amicably resolve the dispute within sixty (60) days, this Agreement may be terminated upon written agreement.
- 4.12. **Binding Effect.** This Agreement shall be binding on the Parties and their respective assigns or successors-in-interest.
- 4.13. **Amendment.** This Agreement may be amended upon the written agreement of the Parties.
- 4.14. **Exclusion from Liability.** Cagayan de Oro LGU shall be free from any and all liability, damages, or financial burden arising from this MOA.

4.15. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be signed in any number of copies or counterparts, each of which when so signed and delivered shall be deemed an original, but all the counterparts shall together constitute one and the same instrument.

4.16. **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

## The JobsNext Project

### Background

Industry 4.0 or the Fourth Industrial Revolution describes a digitally connected system of hardware and software that drastically improves the efficiency of operations. These advancements in technologies offer new opportunities for growth to companies taking the next step forward. Sectors in the Philippines are starting to begin their transition, and its effects will soon be felt by not only the industry but also those in the labor force. The current pandemic accelerated the increased displacement of workers, with the Philippine unemployment rate at 6.4% in February 2022, as reported by the Philippine Statistics Authority. This number may increase when routinary occupations at risk for automation become obsolete.

According to a 2016 International Labor Organization study, almost half of the Philippine population will be employed in occupations at high risk of automation by the year 2025 and will be at risk of not being employed. With available population projection data, that is estimated to be 42 million unemployed working-age Filipinos.

Meanwhile, In a survey conducted by the World Economic Forum (WEF) in 2020, problem-solving, self-management, social skills, and knowledge of the use of technology will be the top skills by 2025. As for jobs, the WEF estimates that though many occupations will become obsolete, more jobs will emerge in their place.

Current and projected trends will see the loss of jobs in sectors at risk for automation, making it important to prepare people, especially youth working in entry-level and more informal and at-risk roles, for potential jobs of the future.

### About JobsNext

JobsNext seeks to mitigate the negative impacts of Industry 4.0 on the employability of the Philippine labor force by providing industry-relevant, demand-driven, up-to-date, and appropriate skilling programs. It will do this by providing a skills voucher to train 1,000 young individuals on future skills in one specific city, and creating a governance and implementing framework that other cities can replicate after the end of project life.

### Project Features:

1. **Establishment of Future Skills Council (FSC)** The JobsNext project will be accomplished by partnering with an identified local government unit (LGU)/city government, organizing a city-level strategic oversight body known as the local Future Skills Council (FSC), supporting the JobsNext secretariat, and supporting community outreach and engagement plan. The FSC will be composed of 51% private sector and 49% public sector and will be co-sponsored by the LGU.

The FSC, through its program-supported working secretariat, will accomplish the following activities:

- a. **Local Supply Chain Analysis:** The FSC will conduct a nationally-benchmarked labor market assessment to determine priority emerging jobs and map out training programs for these jobs and skills requirements. The FSC shall also set the standards for accrediting training programs and/or institutions and shall create a list of programs where trainees can enroll and use their vouchers.
  - b. **Partnership building and accreditation of programs:** The FSC secretariat will work with institutions and companies to develop/accredit training programs, which will be part of the roster of training programs under JobsNext. The PESO office (in charge of recruitment) shall keep a database of all these training programs and schools or training institutions.
  - c. **Capacitation of PESO office for communications and recruitment:** The FSC will develop a communication and recruitment plan and support the PESO in recruiting and advertising JobsNext to constituents.
2. **Communication and Recruitment:** The PESO shall start communicating about JobsNext and recruiting beneficiaries. The beneficiaries will go through a selection and matching process through PESO, and will then be deployed to partner companies.
  3. **Training and deployment:** Once beneficiaries are selected, the PESO will connect them to the programs or academic institutions on the roster, to start their training. The PESO office shall monitor and report the deployment of trainees, and eventually, support them in finding jobs locally and/or abroad once they have completed the training programs.

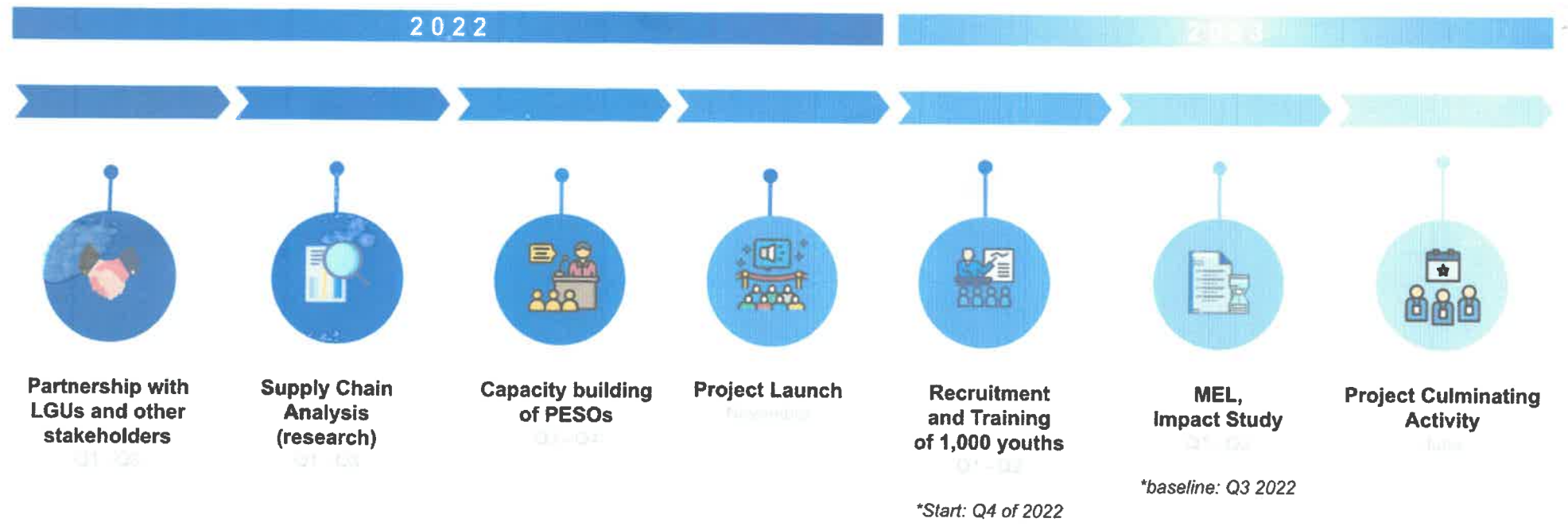

4. **Connection to employers (Enrollment to Employment):** PESO will help match and connect the training completers to local and international jobs.
5. **Monitoring and Impact Evaluation:** All activities and achievements will be documented in accordance with the Monitoring, Evaluation, and Learning (MEL) Plan to be developed during the inception of the program. PBEEd aims that this program becomes a model for other cities to emulate as each prepares for the anticipated negative effects of Industry 4.0 in their localities. As such, an impact study will be conducted to objectively gauge the effects of the JobsNext.

6 ~~OPhercas~~, RA 7279, otherwise known as the Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992  
7 provides that it shall be the policy of the state to undertake a comprehensive and continuing urban  
8 development and socialized housing program;

9 ~~OPhercas~~, the National Urban Development and Housing Framework (NU DHF 2017-2022),  
10 adopting the vision as articulated in the Philippine New Urban Agenda (2016), aims to have a better,  
11 greener, smarter urban systems in a more inclusive Philippines: "Better Cities are globally  
12 competitive, economically vibrant, and livable. Greener Cities are environmentally sustainable,

**WHEREAS**, Section 130 of the Local Government Code, requires that the exercise of the taxing power and other revenue raising powers of LGUs shall be governed by the principle of equitability and based as far as practicable on the taxpayer's ability to pay, levied and collected only for public purposes, not be unjust, excessive, oppressive or confiscatory, and not be contrary to law, public policy or in the restraint of trade;

**WHEREAS**, with the enactment of Universal Health Care (UHC) Act, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PHIC) implemented a modification of the rates of benefit packages under All Case Rates (ACR) Policy including the COVID-19 benefit packages under PHIC Circular 2021-0012;

**WHEREAS**, DILG-DOF Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2019-01 dated May 17, 2019, issued "Guidelines for the Review, Adjustment, Setting and/or Adoption of Reasonable Regulatory Fees and Charges of Local Government Units" was taken into consideration on the deliberation on the matter presented;

**WHEREAS**, it was conferred that the existing rates pursuant to Ordinance No. 12860-2014 under Article BBB, Section 225. Rates "The Schedule of fees and charges imposed for facilities used and for services rendered by the JR Borja General Hospital", has been determined to be outdated as to the current high cost of overheads and that, it requires to be revised at just and reasonable rates sufficient to recover the cost of services rendered;

**WHEREAS**, the proposal presented by the JR Borja General Hospital are found to be commensurate with the cost of regulations on the fees and charges and reasonable enough to breakeven at least with the existing Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PHIC) rates as for the usage of facilities, for services rendered and also, to ensure long-term sustainability for the hospital's operations;

**WHEREFORE**, on motion by Ms. Jasmin T. Maagad, City Treasurer and duly seconded by all members present, the Committee, be it

**RESOLVED**, "TO RECOMMEND FAVORABLE APPROVAL OF HONORABLE CITY MAYOR ROLANDO "KAREX" A. UY, THIS CITY, FOR HIS ENDORSEMENT TO THE CITY COUNCIL ON THE PASSAGE OF AN ORDINANCE FOR THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE BBB, SECTION 225 UNDER ORDINANCE NO. 12860-2014, ON THE IMPOSITION OF

**SUBJECT** : GUIDELINES FOR THE REVIEW, ADJUSTMENT, SETTING AND/OR ADOPTION OF REASONABLE REGULATORY FEES AND CHARGES OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS

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**1.0 Background**

- 1.1 The regulation of business and activities as well as the delivery of services to the people, through local government entail costs to the government, and equity requires that person/s benefitting from the services to share the cost of providing such services.
- 1.2 If the primary purpose of the imposition is generation of revenue and that regulation is merely incidental, the imposition is a "tax", but if regulation is the primary purpose and the fact that revenue is incidentally obtained does not make the imposition a tax, but merely a "fee"<sup>1</sup>.
- 1.3 However, the determination of the amount of the fees and charges shall be finding the balance between recovering the cost of services rendered and ease of doing business. But any revision of fees and charges need to be coordinated with stakeholders to ensure that the rates are just and reasonable and to minimize, if not avoid, unintended impacts on established priorities and the general public.
- 1.4 In order to help local government units (LGUs) build strong enabling environment for good local governance and serve our constituents fairly, particularly the business sector, we enjoin all LGUs to review, adjust, and/or revise their local revenue ordinances in accordance with the rationalized procedure for setting fees and charges.

**2.0 Purpose**

- 2.1 This Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) is being issued for the guidance of LGUs to ensure uniform procedure in setting reasonable fees and charges as provided for by the provisions of Republic Act (RA) No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991 and in order to set a balance between recovering the cost of services and the ease of doing business in compliance with RA No. 11032, otherwise known as the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery (EODB EGSD) Act of 2018.

### 3.0 Legal Compliance

#### 3.1 RA No. 7160: Local Government Code of 1991

- 3.1.1 Sections 134, 142, 151 and 152 allow provinces, cities, municipalities and barangays to impose and collect taxes, fees and charges on business and occupation and on the practice of any profession and calling.
- 3.1.2 Section 147 provides that fees and charges imposed by municipalities should be reasonable and commensurate with the cost of regulation, inspection and licensing before any person may engage in such business or occupation, or practice of such profession or calling. Furthermore, Article 233 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the LGC provides that no such fee or charge shall be based on capital investment or gross sales or receipts of the person or business liable therefore.
- 3.1.3 Section 153 stipulates that LGUs may collect reasonable fees and charges for services rendered.
- 3.1.4 Section 130 requires that the exercise of the taxing and other revenue-raising powers of LGUs shall be governed by the following principles: a) uniform in each local government unit; b) equitable and based as far as practicable on the taxpayer's ability to pay, levied and collected only for public purposes, not be unjust, excessive, oppressive, or confiscatory, and not be contrary to law, public policy, national economic policy, or in the restraint of trade; c) collections shall in no case be let to any private person; d) collections shall inure solely to the benefit of, and be subject to the disposition by the local government unit levying the tax, fee, charge or other imposition; and e) evolve a progressive system of taxation.
- 3.1.5 Section 132 stipulates that the power to impose a tax, fee or charge to generate revenue under the LGC shall be exercised by the LGU concerned through an appropriate ordinance.
- 3.1.6 Sections 444(3)(iv), 455(3)(iv) and 465(3)(iv) provide that the licenses and permits are to be issued by the local chief executives.
- 3.1.7 Section 55 (c) provides that the local chief executive may veto an ordinance or resolution only once. The sanggunian may override the veto of the local chief executive by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all its members, thereby making the ordinance effective even without the approval of the local chief executive concerned.
- 3.1.8 Section 187 stipulates that public hearing is mandatory prior to the enactment of the LGC.
- 3.1.9 Sections 56 and 57 provide that sangguniang panglungsod or sangguniang bayan and sangguniang barangay shall forward to the sangguniang panlalawigan and sangguniang panglungsod or sangguniang bayan respectively the approved ordinances. Within the time prescribed therein, the appropriate sanggunian shall review the forwarded approved ordinance to determine whether such is beyond the power of the sangguniang panglungsod or bayan concerned or whether the barangay ordinance is consistent with law and city or municipal ordinances.



- 3.1.10 Section 56 (d) provides that if no action has been taken by the sangguniang panlalawigan within thirty (30) days after submission of such ordinance or resolution, the same shall be presumed consistent with law and therefore valid.
- 3.1.11 Section 188 requires that within ten (10) days after their approval, certified true copies of all provincial, city, and municipal tax ordinances or revenue shall be published in full for three (3) consecutive days in a newspaper of local circulation; the same shall be posted in at least two (2) conspicuous and publicly accessible places.
- 3.2 RA No. 11032: Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery (EODB EGSD) Act of 2018
- 3.2.1 Section 5 provides that all proposed regulations of government agencies under Section 3 of the same Act shall undergo regulatory impact assessment to establish if the proposed regulation does not add undue regulatory burden and cost to these agencies and the applicants or requesting parties.
- 3.2.2 Section 6 provides that all government agencies including departments, bureaus, offices, instrumentalities, or government-owned and/or -controlled corporations, or LGUs shall set up their respective most current and updated service standards to be known as the Citizen's Charter in the form of information billboards which shall be posted at the main entrance of offices or at the most conspicuous place, in their respective websites and in the form of published materials written either in English, Filipino, or in the local dialect, that detail:
- "(a) A comprehensive and uniform checklist of requirements for each type of application or request;
  - "(b) The procedure to obtain a particular service;
  - "(c) The person/s responsible for each step;
  - "(d) The maximum time to conclude the process;
  - "(e) The document/s to be presented by the applicant or requesting party, if necessary;
  - "(f) The amount of fees, if necessary; and
  - "(g) The procedure for filing complaints."
- 3.2.3 Section 21 provides that imposition of additional cost not reflected in the Citizen's Charter constitutes a violation and holds persons responsible liable under the same Act.

#### 4.0 Scope/Coverage

- 4.1 This Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) covers all Local Chief Executives (LCEs), Vice-Governors, Vice-Mayors, Sanggunian Members, Punong Barangays, Regional Directors of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the Department of Finance - Bureau of Local Government Finance (DOF-BLGF), Provincial/City/Municipal/Barangay Treasurers and Heads of Department or Offices in the LGU and others concerned.

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## 5.0 Definitions

- 5.1 **Cost of Service** - refers to the sum of (a) direct costs such as supplies, materials, salaries/wages of personnel directly involved and proportionate share in the overhead expenses incurred by the LGU in rendering service, and (b) such expenses incurred by the LGU in rendering the service, and (c) such other readily identifiable incidental expenses incurred in rendering the service. The cost of service shall be considered in the regular budget of the operating department/division/unit rendering the pertinent service as authorized in the appropriation ordinance<sup>2</sup>.
- 5.2 **Cost recovery** - refers to the process of compensating the cost associated with the provision of services (including regulation), which involves the collection of user or regulatory fees to ensure long-term sustainability<sup>3</sup>.
- 5.3 **Charges** - refers to the pecuniary liability, as a rent or fees against a persons or property in exchange for the use or utility of a facility or service of the government<sup>4</sup>.
- 5.4 **Fee** - refers to a charge fixed by law or ordinance for the regulation or inspection of a business or activity<sup>5</sup>.
- 5.5 **Imposition** – pertains to the act of levying a tax, fee or charge on a particular subject, which is done by way of an ordinance.
- 5.6 **Taxes** – A monetary charge imposed by the government on persons, entities, transactions, or property to yield public revenue<sup>6</sup>.

## 6.0 Policy Content and Guidelines

- 6.1 This Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) shall apply to all fees and charges being imposed by LGUs rendering services to the public, whether regulatory or service fees, the purpose of which is to recover the cost of service rendered, except when the rate or the method for determining the rate has already been prescribed under the LGC and/or other special laws.

(c) **Barangay Clearance** - No city or municipality may issue any license or permit for any business or activity unless a clearance is first obtained from the Barangay where such business or activity is located or conducted. For such clearance, the Sangguniang Barangay may impose a reasonable fee. The application for clearance shall be acted upon within seven (7) working days from the filing thereof. In the event that the clearance is not issued within the said period, the city or municipality may issue the said license or permit.

(d) **Other Fees and Charges** - The Barangay may levy reasonable fees and charges:

(1) On commercial breeding of fighting cocks, cockfighting an cockpits;

(2) On places of recreation which charge admission fees; and

(3) On billboards, signboards, neon signs, and outdoor advertisements.

### 6.3 Determination of Reasonable Rates of Fees and Charges

6.3.1 The rates of fees and charges shall be revised at just and reasonable rates sufficient to recover the cost of services rendered taking into consideration the Local Fees and Charges (LFC) Toolkit to be issued by the Department of Finance which comprises the direct fixed cost and variable costs of rendering services:

#### 6.3.1.1 Variable costs shall include the following:

- 6.3.1.1.1 salaries and wages of personnel directly involved in delivering the service;
- 6.3.1.1.2 costs of supplies and materials;
- 6.3.1.1.3 transportation and travel expenses; and
- 6.3.1.1.4 supplies, materials, and other resources.

#### 6.3.1.2 Fixed costs consist of proportionate share in the overhead expenses comprising depreciation rates of equipment and utilities used, which includes:

- 6.3.1.2.1 cost of water;
- 6.3.1.2.2 electricity; and

The permit to extract sand, gravel and other quarry resources shall be issued exclusively by the provincial governor, pursuant to the ordinance of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan.

6.3.1.2.3 other regular services rendered to the applicants.

6.3.1.3 The DOF, through the BLGF, shall issue within thirty (30) days the LFC Toolkit and issue the necessary amendments thereto.

6.3.2 Other Considerations:

6.3.2.1 In the succeeding revision of the rates, LGUs may have an option to adjust the rate of imposition or last revision of the subject rates of fees and charges by indexing approach: Provided, that there are no changes in the variables used in the computation and subject to the guidelines to be issued by the DOF, through the BLGF.

6.3.2.2 Subsequent to the adjustment of the rate of imposition, such revision shall be as much as possible, be uniform for similar or comparable services and functions offered by LGUs.

6.3.2.3 The revised rates shall be imposed through the issuance of an appropriate ordinance and compliance to all legal requirements including the conduct of a public hearing and publications.

6.4 Creation of an Oversight Committee on the Revision of Fees and Charges

6.4.1 Within three (3) months after the effectivity of this Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC), LCEs are advised to issue an Executive Order creating an oversight committee on the revision of fees and charges composed of the following:

6.4.1.1 Composition

6.4.1.1.1 For Provinces:

Chairperson:	Local Chief Executive
Co-Chairperson	Provincial Treasurer
Members:	Provincial Budget Officer Provincial Planning and Development Coordinator Provincial Accountant Sanggunian Secretary

Additional members may be identified depending on the type of fees and charges being reviewed and the department/office in-charge of the service e.g., Assessor, Environment Officer, Health Officer, etc.

6.4.1.1.2 For Cities and Municipalities:

Chairperson:	Local Chief Executive
Co-Chairperson	City/Municipal Treasurer
Members:	City/Municipal Budget Officer City/Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator City/Municipal Accounting Sanggunian Secretary Liga ng mga Barangay Representative

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Additional Members may be identified depending on the type of fees and charges being reviewed and the department/office in-charge of the service e.g., Assessor, Business Permits and Licensing Officer (BPLO), Building Official, Environment Officer, Sanitary Officer, Zoning Officer, etc.

#### 6.4.2 Functions and Responsibilities

6.4.2.1 The Committee on Revision of Fees and Charges shall have the following functions and responsibilities:

6.4.2.1.1 Ensure that the guiding principles as prescribed under the LGC and this JMC are observed;

6.4.2.1.2 Review the rationale for fees and user charges imposed by the LGU and methodology for determination of the fee schedule or rates;

6.4.2.1.3 Gather data on the cost of delivering regulatory, service fees and charges, in order to compute the appropriate rates that will recover the cost, using the LFC Toolkit;

6.4.2.1.4 Submit to the LCE and the sanggunian the recommended proposed local revenue ordinance including a program of action to institute reforms.

#### 6.5 Roles and Responsibilities of Oversight Agencies and Local Government Units

##### 6.5.1 Local Government Units (LGUs)

6.5.1.1 The LCE shall call for the immediate review and appropriate updating of their respective Local Revenue Code (LRC). Furthermore, LCE shall ensure that their LRCs, schedule of fees and charges and result of the review of such via the LFC Toolkit are published online in their website and/or in three (3) conspicuous places in their localities.

6.5.1.2 In the case of municipalities and cities, once approved by the sangguniang bayan or panlungsod, the recommended proposed local revenue ordinance shall be submitted to the sangguniang panlalawigan concerned. If the sangguniang panlalawigan finds that such an ordinance or resolution is beyond the power conferred upon the sangguniang panlungsod or sangguniang bayan concerned, it shall declare such ordinance or resolution invalid in whole or in part.

6.5.1.3 The sanggunian panlalawigan shall review the revenue codes/ordinances passed in their jurisdiction in connection with the imposition of fees and charges of their component cities and municipalities.

6.5.1.4 In the case of barangays, once approved by the sanggunian members, the recommended proposed local



revenue ordinance shall be submitted to the sangguniang bayan or sanggunian panlungsod concerned.

- 6.5.1.5 The sangguniang panlungsod and sangguniang bayan, shall review the revenue codes/ordinances passed in their jurisdiction in connection with the imposition of fees and charges of their component barangays. If the sangguniang panlungsod or sangguniang bayan, as the case may be, finds the barangay ordinances inconsistent with law or city or municipal ordinances, the sanggunian concerned shall, within thirty (30) days from receipt thereof, return the same with its comments and recommendations to the sangguniang barangay concerned for adjustment, amendment, or modification; in which case, the effectivity of the barangay ordinance is suspended until such time as the revision called for is effected.
- 6.5.1.6 The concerned city and municipal treasurers shall guide and assist the component barangays in determining and setting of the rates of fees and charges within their respective jurisdictions to ensure uniformity and compliance with the law and this Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC).
- 6.5.2 Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)
- 6.5.2.1 The DILG shall advocate with the LGUs, through the leagues, the importance of the utilization of the LFC Toolkit in updating their revenue ordinances and/or codes.
- 6.5.2.2 The DILG shall take the necessary measures and institutionalize a monitoring system to ensure compliance of LGUs.
- 6.5.2.3 Through their Regional Offices, disseminate this Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) to all LGUs and others concerned.
- 6.5.3 Department of Finance (DOF)
- 6.5.3.1 The DOF, through the BLGF, shall prepare, update and issue the necessary guidelines and/or advisories on the LFC Toolkit for LGUs containing the cost accounting framework in the determination of the reasonable rate of fees and charges and for the primary purpose of analyzing the efficient cost-recovery of the LGUs. The LFC Toolkit shall be available in two modes: 1) Excel-based template; and 2) Local Fees and Charges Estimation System (LFCES) incorporated in the LGU Integrated Financial Tools (LIFT) System.
- 6.5.3.2 The DOF, through the BLGF and the Philippine Tax Academy (PTA), in coordination with the DILG, shall conduct capacity building, training, and technical assistance programs for concerned personnel relative to the review, setting, and/or adoption of reasonable regulatory fees and charges by using the LFC Toolkit in revising their fees and charges.





6.5.3.3 The DOF, through the BLGF, shall regularly monitor the fees and charges imposed by LGUs through the DOF-BLGF online portal, and shall ensure that the schedule of rates and analysis of such are regularly published online and readily available to the different stakeholders and the general public.

6.5.3.4 The DOF, through the BLGF, shall coordinate with the DILG in monitoring the compliance of the LGUs in the implementation of this Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC).

6.5.3.5 The DOF, through the BLGF Regional Offices, hereby instructs to disseminate this Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) to all local treasurers and others concerned for their information and guidance.

## 7.0 Repealing Clause

7.1 All rules, regulations, orders, and/or Circulars previously issued by the DILG and DOF that are contrary to, or inconsistent with the provisions of this Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.






