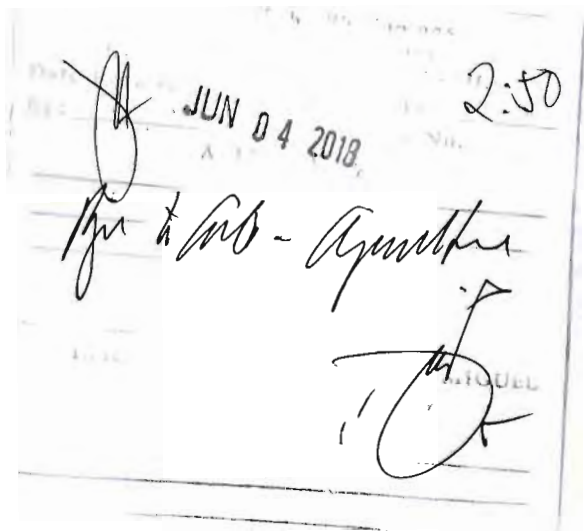

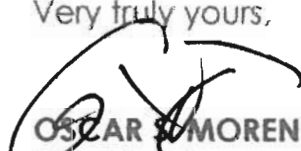

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2018, in _____, by and between:

The BUREAU OF SOILS AND WATER MANAGEMENT (BSWM), a staff Bureau of the Department of Agriculture (DA) with principal address at Elliptical Road, corner Moraga Avenue, Diliman, Quezon City, represented herein by the Executive Director ANGEL C. ENRIQUETA, CHS III, herein after referred to as "BSWM"

The Department of Agriculture - Regional Field Office X (DA-RFO X) a regional office (agency) with office address at A. Luna Street, Cagayan de Oro City, represented herein by the Regional Executive Director, CARLENE C. COLLADO hereinafter referred to as "DA-RFO"

and:

The City Local Government Unit (CLGU) of Cagayan de Oro City, with office address at Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental represented herein by its City Mayor HON. OSCAR MORENO, hereinafter referred to as the CLGU".

- WITNESSETH -

WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture (DA) is implementing the Sustainable Corn Production in Sloping Areas (SCoPSA) to enhance corn productivity and by adopting sustainable adaptive corn-based technologies in sloping areas, herein referred to as the "Project";

WHEREAS, there is a need to broaden the adoption of the Project to local farmers and provide more impacts to farming communities through a community-based and farmer-managed model farm showcasing a variety of appropriate measures and soil fertility management in sloping areas cultivated with corn;

WHEREAS, the BSWM pursuant to its mandated function of promoting the conservation and proper utilization of soil and water resources has received funds from the National Program under the Production Support Service (PSS) that will be utilized to facilitate broader adoption and implementation of the Project through a community-based approach;

WHEREAS, the DA-RFO as the DA local agency in the Region is the institutional partner of the BSWM in the implementation of the Project being a key implementer of the National Program at the regional level;

WHEREAS, as provided in the Local Government Code (LGC) of 1991, Local Government Units "shall have with the national government the responsibility in the management and maintenance of ecological balance within their territorial jurisdiction" with their respective powers and facilities to include water and soil resources utilization and conservation projects, small water impounding and other similar projects.

WHEREAS, the LGU, having its own local resources and logistics, and objectively being closer to the farming communities within its jurisdiction, have the full capability to collaborate in the project's undertaking;

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the implementation of the project, the LGU has agreed to adopt a community-based approach in a timely and expeditious manner for the project's implementation by the BSWM to the LGU;

WHEREAS, the LGU has signified its intent to undertake the implementation of the Project through a community-based approach within the scheduled time and agreed budgetary allocation;

WHEREAS, the LGU, through Resolution No. _____, Series of 2013 of the Sangguniang Lungsod Dalu, authorizing the Honorable _____, Mayor, to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the BSWM, and all its necessary steps for the implementation of the Project;

WHEREAS, all parties hereto have agreed to cooperate and jointly implement the cited project;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto have agreed to the following terms and condition:

OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES:

- A. The BSWM shall:
 - 1. Maintain close coordination and provide the overall technical and financial support to the LGU during the project implementation;
 - 2. Provide the LGU the technical guidelines and the necessary support for the identification and selection of the site, demonstration site, and the necessary support for the conduct of specialized training on soil and water conservation, and other related activities;
 - 3. Transfer land to the LGU for the procurement of the agricultural machinery for the establishment of a community-based SCoPSA Model in accordance with the activities (farmer's training, field day, monitoring and evaluation, etc.) and covering *45 hectares* of sloping land within corn cluster areas and a project cost of *eight hundred eleven thousand and eight hundred seventy-five pesos* [P811,875.00] upon perfection of this Memorandum of Agreement, and the submission of the following documents:
 - a. Letter of Intent of the LGU;
 - b. SL Resolution allowing the Mayor to enter into a MOA and its annexes for the project;
 - c. Oath of undertakings; and
 - d. List of Beneficiaries report form;

C. The LGU shall	
1.	Prepare the necessary documents as specified in the guidelines for the submission to PSAM;
2.	Acknowledge the receipt of fund by issuing an Official Receipt to the BSWM;
3.	Conduct competitive public bidding and/or appropriate procurement as prescribed in 2016 Revised IRR of RA 9154 in the purchase of agricultural inputs and other agricultural inputs, and lease of venue for trade fairs and events in support to the implementation of the Project;
4.	Undertake the timely procurement and distribution of farm inputs to the beneficiaries/cooperators, once each;
5.	Assign/designate local office (e.g. Office of the Municipal Agriculturist) responsible in the implementation of the project;
6.	In close coordination with BSWM and DA-RFO, assist in establishing and maintaining the model farm;
7.	Be responsible in the accounting and disbursement of transferred funds in accordance with existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations, including submission of verified Liquidation Report on regular basis as prescribed by Circular No. 94-013 dated December 12, 1994;
8.	Submit to the BSWM progress report and assist them in the conduct of activities, and keep records of accomplishment and other related project documents;
9.	Submit full and audited financial liquidation report to PSAM upon the implementation of SCOPSA.

10. Refund/return to BSWM the full amount released in case of:
- a. Misappropriation of funds
 - b. Non-utilization of funds
 - c. Non-compliance of any provisions stated in this agreement

- 3. The **BSWM, DA-RFO** and **LGU** shall promote and implement Good Agricultural Practices in managing sloping areas cultivated to corn;
- 4. The **BSWM, DA-RFO** and **LGU** shall promote the Project through massive Information Education and Campaign (IEC) using tarpaulins, posters and the tri-media;
- 5. All payments and disbursements shall be made in accordance with all existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations;

¹(1) Enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred upon it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants therein.

² Section 10. *Role of LGUs in Solid Waste Management* - Pursuant to the relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local government code, the LGUs shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Act within their respective jurisdictions.

Segregation and collection of solid waste shall be conducted at the barangay level specifically for biodegradable, compostable and reusable wastes; *Provided*, That the collection of non-recyclable materials and special wastes shall be the responsibility of the municipality or city.

**ORDINANCE NO. 1
(SERIES OF 2018)**

"AN ORDINANCE ENACTING ON ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT OF BARANGAY SEVEN (7), CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY."

WHEREAS, the Barangay 7 is committed to the protection, preservation and conservation of the ecosystem;

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the barangay to effectively and efficiently implement the Solid Waste Management System under Republic Act No. 9003 in its territorial jurisdictions;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code (RA 7160) also provides:

"SEC. 16. General Welfare. – Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things . . . promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants."

WHEREAS, the unsystematic waste disposal by households and commercial/industry establishments cause unsightly surroundings and spread of communicable diseases;

WHEREAS, the practice of waste segregation to facilitate reuse and recycling does not only reduce the cost of collection and disposal of garbage but conserves the natural resources of materials and avoid wasteful consumption of goods;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Kag. Raleigh T. Velez duly seconded by Metodio G. Chiong,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY SEVEN (7) OF THE CITY OF CAGAYAN DE ORO ON ITS REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

ARTICLE I – Title

Section 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as “An Ordinance on the Ecological Solid Waste Management of Barangay Seven (7), Cagayan de Oro City.”

ARTICLE II – Coverage

Section 2. Coverage. This Ordinance shall apply to all residential houses; commercial establishments such as restaurants, eateries, department stores, groceries, sari-sari stores and establishments of any kind situated within the territorial jurisdictions of “Barangay Seven (7), Cagayan de Oro City.”

ARTICLE III – Legal Basis, Purpose, Goal and Objectives

Section 3. Legal Basis. This Ordinance is enacted to implement the provisions of Republic Act No. 9003 which mandates the proper segregation and collection of household wastes.

SECTION 4. Purpose. This Ordinance is enacted for the following purposes:

- 4.1 To guide, control and regulate the generation of solid wastes within the Barangay and promote an orderly and sanitary system for the same;
- 4.2 To enhance the total environment of the locality through the necessary control and mitigation of negative environmental impacts of solid waste;
- 4.3 To promote and protect the health, safety, peace and convenience of the general welfare of the inhabitants of the Barangay;
- 4.4 To minimize the generation of solid waste and maximize possible resource/recovery/recycling and utilization by:

- a. Maximizing the use of goods and consumption of foods;
- b. Encouraging the salvaging of possible “recoverables” from solid wastes for re-use and/or recycling back to production process; and
- c. Encouraging the recycling and resource recovery of wastes in own backyards through composting.

SECTION 5. Goal. The primary goal of this Ordinance is to enhance ecological balance of the community through sustainable and integrated waste management.

SECTION 6. Objectives. The objectives of this Ordinance are the following:

- 6.1 To ensure round-the-clock cleanliness through the orderly management of waste;
- 6.2 To eradicate unsightly, uncovered and overflowing waste containers in streets, public places and open spaces;
- 6.3 To maximize and optimize sanitary resource recovery for feeds, materials and others; and
- 6.4 To minimize pollution arising from harmful gases, smoke particulates produced by needless burning/dumping, polluted runoffs into water sources/supply, and hazardous substances.

ARTICLE IV – Definition of Terms

Section 7. Definition of Terms. As used in this Ordinance, the following term has its meaning as follows:

7.1 Biodegradable – any material that can be reduced into finer particles (degraded or decomposed) by microbiological organisms or enzymes (synonymous with compostable).

7.2 Biodegradable Wastes – fruit & vegetable peelings, spoiled food & leftovers, vegetable trimmings, fish scales, egg shells, seafood shells, animal entrails & carcasses, corn cobs & sheaths, rice hulls, peanut shells, wet newspapers & cardboards, wet papers & cartons, coconut shells & husks, seeds, garden & grass clippings, pet/poultry/livestock manure, chipped branches and sawdust;

7.3 Compost – decayed organic material for use as soil conditioner or fertilizer.

7.4 Composting – biological degradation under controlled conditions; the process of making biodegradables such as food waste, garden waste, animal waste and human waste into compost by mixing them with soil, water, biological additives/activators (optional) and air.

7.5 Domestic Waste – refuse from households, as distinguished from industrial waste, hospital waste, etc. which may be classified as biodegradable (compostable) or non-biodegradable (non-compostable).

7.6 Recyclable Wastes – dry papers & newspapers, dry cardboards & cartons, plastic materials like plastic containers, plastic water bottles, plastic bottle caps, PVC & PE pipes, computer casing, tin cans & covers, aluminum cans, iron steel, copper wires, broken transparent glasses, glass bottles, toner cartridges, computer ink cartridges.

7.7 Residual Wastes – sando bags, packing wrappers, styropors/styrofoams, cigarette butts, worn out plastic sacks, dirt from sweepings, worn out rags, sanitary napkins, disposable diapers, plastic straws, parlor & barbershop waste, household medicine bottles, broken ceramics, colored broken glasses, coco fiber from cushions, poultry feathers.

7.8 Special Wastes – paint & thinner containers, spray canisters, household batteries, pharmaceutical waste, spoiled, spilled, expired cosmetic waste, lead-acid batteries, used oil filters, broken tiles.

7.9 Bulky Wastes – used rubber tires; garden debris; destroyed TV sets, radios, stereos, washing machines, dryers, stoves, refrigerators, & dishwashers; broken furniture, filing cabinets, book cases, beds & cushions.

ARTICLE V – Segregation of Wastes

SECTION 8. Mandatory Segregation of Solid Wastes. The segregation of wastes shall primarily be conducted at the source, to include household, institutional, industrial, commercial and agricultural sources: Provided that wastes shall be segregated into the categories provided in Section 2 of this Article.

SECTION 9. Requirements for the Segregation and Storage of Solid Waste Pending Collection. The following shall be the minimum standards and requirements for segregation and storage of solid waste pending collection:

9.1 There shall be a suitable container such as a plastic bag or the like for the ecological solid waste before these are brought out along the streets or being brought out at the assigned dumping areas.

9.2 There shall be a separate container for each type of waste from all sources: Provided, that in the case of bulky waste, it will suffice that the same be collected and placed in a separate and designated area; and

9.3 The solid waste container depending on its use shall be properly marked or identified for on-site collection as follows:

- a. Biodegradables/Compostables or “Nabubulok”;
- b. Recyclables or “Di-nabubulok na maaari pang pakinabangan”; and
- c. Residuals & Special Wastes or “Di-nabubulok na ‘di na mapakinabangan.”

ARTICLE VI – Collection and Disposal

Section 10. Collection/Drop-off Points. All street organizations must have a designated strategic collection/drop-off points to facilitate the hauling of segregated solid waste materials of the barangay.

10.1. Only segregated solid waste materials must be brought to the collection points at the time and date of collection; and

10.2. A personnel must be assigned in every collection points to ensure that the delivered solid wastes by the household are properly segregated.

Section 11. Sanitary Crews/Sanitary Aides. The barangay must assign at a sanitary crews/sanitary aides to check the delivered solid waste materials and handle the transfer of segregated solid waste materials from the Barangay MRF or from the collection points to the garbage truck during collection.

Section 12. Collection of Segregated Waste Materials at the Barangay. The City Garbage Compactor through the City Ecological Solid Waste Management Task Force shall be the responsible agent in the collection of segregated solid waste materials at the MRF or at its collection points because the barangay has no capacity of transporting their segregated solid waste materials.

Section 13. Schedule of Segregated Solid Waste Materials Collection at the Barangay. The schedule of collection for the accumulated segregated solid waste materials at the barangay will be determined in coordination with the barangay concern and be properly disseminated by the CENRO.

SECTION 14. Residential Areas. The garbage shall be collected through the present system of collection within the barangay. Independent collection systems of the composite barangays shall be followed.

SECTION 15. Schools, Churches, and Business Establishments. All garbage in these locations shall also be collected in the same manner as in Section 10.

SECTION 16. Time of Dumping. Time of dumping of ecological solid wastes for collection at the collection point/sites shall be from eight thirty in the morning and three o'clock in the afternoon (8:30 AM and 3:00 PM) while two thirty in the afternoon (2:30 PM) at J.R. Borja Street alone on the day of collection of the garbage scheduled to be collected only.

ARTICLE VII – Prohibited Acts

SECTION 18. Prohibited Acts. The following acts are prohibited and its corresponding Fines and Penalties:

18.1 Bringing out and dumping of garbage outside of collection day and proper time of dumping for collection, indiscriminately dumping garbage, littering, throwing, dumping of solid waste matters in public places, such as roads, sidewalks, canals, drainage systems, curbs and gutters, esteros or parks, creeks, rivers, tributaries, rivulets and other natural waterways, and establishment, or causing or permitting the same;

18.2 The open and indiscriminate burning of residual and special wastes;

18.3 Causing or permitting the collection of non-segregated or unsorted waste/non-segregation of wastes into biodegradable, recyclable, and residual/special; and

18.4 Unauthorized removal of recyclable materials intended for collection by authorized persons.

ARTICLE VIII – Penal Provisions

SECTION 19. Fines and Penalties. The following fines and penalties shall be imposed to any person who violates specific provisions of this ordinance. He/she shall be issued with a CITATION TICKET or NOTICE OF VIOLATION by an enforcer duly assigned/designated by the Punong Barangay.

19.1 For paragraphs (19.1) to (19.4):

First Offense – Warning
Second Offense – Php100.00
Third Offense – Php300.00
Subsequent – Php500.00

19.2 Households and establishments that do not provide receptacles/containers for their refuse/solid waste;

First Offense – Warning
Second Offense – Php100.00
Third Offense – Php150.00
Subsequent – Php250.00

19.3 Not keeping the surrounding areas and immediate premises clean by establishments, institutions, households and other concerned occupants. Streets shall be kept clean by occupants or owners of properties lining the street from the line of the property to the middle of the street and from one property to the other.

First Offense – Warning
Second Offense – Php150.00
Third Offense – Php300.00
Subsequent – Php500.00

19.4 If the offense is committed by a corporation, partnership, or other juridical entity duly organized in accordance with law, the chief executive officer, president, general manager, managing partner or such other officer-in-charge shall be liable for the commission of the offense penalized under this Ordinance.

19.5 Violators shall not be given barangay clearances and certifications until he/she has paid and/or served his/her fines/penalties. Their names also shall be posted at conspicuous places in the barangay.

19.6 Violations shall be accounted per household and the head of the family shall be responsible in the implementation of the Ordinance in their respective household. In effect, any violation committed by the household shall be carried by all members of the said household except household helps, transient visitors, and other temporary or visiting individuals.

SECTION 20. Utilization of Collected Fines. Thirty percent (30%) of the collected fines shall accrue to the General Fund for appropriations for the next fiscal year and the remaining Seventy percent (70%), which shall be called as Barangay Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) Fund, shall be used for the following within the fiscal year of which the fines were collected:

20.1 Creation of Barangay 7 Green Brigade of Eco-aides;

- a. Its task is to apprehend the violators of this ordinance.
- b. It is responsible for monitoring proper waste segregation.

20.2 Procurement of Materials, Equipment, Protective Gears and other items necessary for the proper implementation of the Ecological Solid Waste Management of Barangay 7;

20.3 Information, education, communication and monitoring activities of the Ecological Solid Waste Management of Barangay 7;

- 20.4 Acquisition of products, facilities, technologies and processes necessary to enhance proper ecological solid waste management;
- 20.5 Transportation/Hauling of ecological solid wastes;
- 20.6 Awards and incentives;
- 20.7 Research programs;
- 20.8 Technical assistance;
- 20.9 Capability-building activities; and
- 20.10 Maintenance and other related activities, programs, etc. for the Materials Recovery Facility of Cluster.

ARTICLE IX – Miscellaneous Provisions

SECTION 21. Citizen Suits. For purposes of enforcing the provisions of this Ordinance, any citizen may file an appropriate civil or criminal action in the barangay against any person who violates or fails to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance. The Barangay concerned shall exempt such action from payment of filing fees.

SECTION 22. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of such provision to any person or circumstances is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this Ordinance or the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected by such declaration.

SECTION 23. Repealing Clause. All existing ordinances and resolutions of this barangay found to be inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 24. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991.

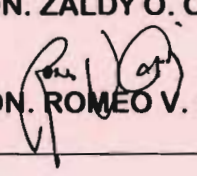

Oro City hereby resolves, to adopt, WITHOUT THIRD READING, the following:

BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO. 095-17

**AN ORDINANCE ENACTING ON ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT
OF BARANGAY BAYABAS, CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY, MISAMIS ORIENTAL**

WHEREAS, the Barangay Bayabas is committed to the protection, preservation and
conservation of the ecosystem;

WHEREAS, Section 16 (General Welfare) of the Local Government Code of the(R.A. 7160),
provides that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those
necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its
efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general
welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and
support, among other things....promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a
balanced ecology, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their
inhabitants.”

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the barangay to effectively and efficiently implement the
Ecological Solid Waste Management System under Republic Act No. 9003 in its territorial
jurisdictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Bayabas,
Cagayan de Oro City on its Regular Session assembled;

ARTICLE I – Title

Section 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as “An Ordinance on the Ecological
Solid Waste Management of Barangay Bayabas, Cagayan de Oro City.”

ARTICLE II - Coverage

Section 2. Coverage. This Ordinance shall apply to all residential houses; commercial
establishments such as restaurants, eateries, department stores, grocery stores, sari-sari stores,
auto-repair shops; institutions like hospitals, schools including daycare centers, churches, public
and private offices; industrial establishments of any kind; agricultural and industrial areas
situated within the territorial jurisdictions of Barangay Bayabas, Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis
Oriental.

Article III– Legal Basis, Purpose, Goal and Objectives

Section 3. Legal Basis. This Ordinance is enacted to implement the provisions of Republic Act No. 9003 which mandates the proper segregation and collection of household wastes.

Section 4. Purpose. This Ordinance is enacted for the following purposes:

- 4.1 To guide, control and regulate the generation of solid wastes within the barangay and promote an orderly and sanitary system for the same;
- 4.2 To enhance the total environment of the locality through the necessary control and mitigation of a negative environmental impacts of solid waste;
- 4.3 To promote and protect the health, safety, peace and convenience of the general welfare of the inhabitants of the barangay;
- 4.4 To minimize the generation of solid waste and maximize possible resource/ recovery/recycling and utilization by:
 - a. Maximizing the use of goods and consumption of foods;
 - b. Encouraging the salvaging of possible “recoverables” from solid wastes for re-use and/or recycling back to production process.
 - c. Encouraging the recycling and resource recovery of wastes in own backyards through composting.

Section 5. Goal. The primary goal of this ordinance is to enhance ecological balance of the community through sustainable and integrated waste management.

Section 6. Objectives. The objectives of this Ordinance are the following:

- 6.1 To ensure round-the-clock cleanliness through the orderly management of waste;
- 6.2 To eradicate unsightly, uncovered and overflowing waste containers in streets, public places and open spaces;
- 6.3 To maximize and optimize sanitary resource recovery for feeds, materials and others;
- 6.4 To minimize pollution arising from harmful gases, smoke particulates produced by needless burning/dumping, polluted runoffs into water sources supply, and hazardous substances.

Article IV- Definition of Terms

Section 7. Definition of terms. As used in this ordinance, the following term has its meaning as follows:

- 7.1 Biodegradable – any material that can be reduced into finer particles (degraded or decomposed) by microbiological organisms or enzymes (synonymous with compostable).
- 7.2 Biodegradable Wastes – fruits & vegetable peelings, spoiled food & leftovers, vegetable trimmings, fish scales, egg shells, seafood shells, animal entrails 7 carcasses, corn cobs & sheaths, rice hulls, peanuts shells , wet newspapers & cardboards, wet papers & cartons, coconuts shells & husks, seeds, garden & grass clippings, pet/poultry/livestock manure, chipped branches and saw dust;
- 7.3 Compost – decayed organic materials for use as soil conditioner or fertilizer.
- 7.4 Composting – biological degradation under controlled conditions; the process of making biodegradable such as food waste, garden waste, animal waste and human waste into compost by mixing them with soil, water, biological additives/activators (optional) and air.

- 7.5 Domestic Waste – refuse from households, as distinguished from industrial waste, hospital waste, etc. which may be classified as biodegradable (compostable) or non biodegradable (non-compostable).
- 7.6 Recyclable Wastes – dry papers & newspapers, dry cardboards & cartons, plastic materials like plastic containers, plastic water bottles, plastic bottle cap, PVC & PE pipes, computer casing, tin cans & covers, aluminum cans, iron steel, copper wires, broken transparent glasses, glass bottles, toner cartridges, computer ink cartridges.
- 7.7 Residual Wastes – sando bags, packing wrappers ,styropors/styrofoams, cigarette butts, worn out plastic sacks , dirt from sweepings , worn out rags , sanitary napkins, disposable diapers , plastic straw, parlor & barbershop waste, household medicine bottles, broken ceramics, colored broken glasses , coco fiber from cushions, poultry feathers.
- 7.8 Special Wastes – paint & thinner containers, spray canisters, household drycell/batteries, pharmaceutical waste, spoiled , spilled , expired cosmetics waste, lead- acid batteries , used oil filters, broken tiles.
- 7.9 Bulky Wastes – used rubber tires; garden debris; destroyed television sets, radios, stereo, washing machine, dryers, stoves, refrigerator. & dishwashers; broken furniture, filling cabinet , book cases , bed &cushions, junk vehicles.

Article V – Segregation of wastes

Section 8. Mandatory Segregation of solid wastes. The segregation of wastes shall primarily be conducted at the source, to include household, institutional, industrial, commercial and agricultural at the source, to include the households, institutional, industrial, commercial and agricultural sources, provided that wastes shall be segregated into the categories provided in this article.

Section 9. Requirements for the segregation and storage of solid waste pending collection. The following shall be minimum standards and requirements for segregation and storage of solid waste pending collection.

- 9.1 There shall be suitable container such as a plastic bag or the like for the ecological solid waste before these are brought out along the designated pick up stations or being brought out at the assigned dumping areas.
- 9.2 There shall be a separate container for each type of waste from all sources: Provided, that in the case of bulky waste, it will suffice that the same be collected and placed in a separate and designated area:
- 9.3 The solid waste container depending on its use shall be properly marked or identified for on-site collection as follows:
- a. Biodegradable/compostable or “nabubulok”;
 - b. Recyclables or “Di- nabubulok na maari pang pakinabangan”;
 - c. Residuals & special wastes or “di-nabubulok na ‘di na mapapakinabangan.”

Article VI – Collection and Disposal

Section 10. Collection/pick stations or drop-off points. All zone/sectors organizations must have a designated strategic collection/pick up stations/drop-off points to facilitate the hauling of segregated solid waste materials of the barangay.

10.1 Only segregated solid waste materials must be brought to the collection points at the time and date of collection;

10.2 A personnel/eco-warriors must be assigned in every collection points to ensure that the delivered solid waste by the household are properly segregated.

Section 11. Sanitary crews/sanitary aides/eco-warriors. The barangay must assign at a sanitary crews/sanitary aides/eco-warriors to check the delivered solid waste materials and handle the transfer of segregated solid waste materials from barangay MRF or from the collection points to the garbage truck during collection schedule.

Section 12. Collection of segregated waste materials at the barangay. The city garbage compactor through the City Ecological Solid Waste Management task force shall be the responsible agent in the collection of segregated solid waste materials at the Zone MRF or at its collection points because the barangay has no capacity of transporting their segregated solid waste materials.

Section 13. Schedule of segregated Solid Waste Materials Collection at the Barangay. The schedule of collection for the accumulated segregated solid waste materials at the barangay will be determined in coordination with the barangay concern and be properly disseminated by the City Local Environment and Natural Resources Office(CLENRO).

Section 14. Residential Areas. The garbage shall be collected through the present system of collection within the barangay. Independent collection systems of the composite barangays shall be followed.

Section 15. Schools, Churches, and Business Establishment. All garbage in these locations shall also be collected in the same manners in section 10.

Section 16. Agricultural Areas. Agricultural areas shall convert organic wastes into compost in their respective areas.

Section 17. Industrial Areas. All factories and plants shall separate their garbage into toxic and non – toxic. It is mandatory that all factories contact the industrial waste exchange (IWE) to exchange their waste with others who may be able to use them. Existing Industrial areas already having their proper way of collection and disposal shall continue practicing the same.

Section 18. Time to Dumping. Time of dumping of ecological solid waste for collection at the collection points/sites shall be from six o'clock to eight o'clock in the morning on the day of collection of the garbage scheduled to be collected only.

Article VII - Prohibited Acts

Section 19. Prohibited Acts. The following acts are prohibited and its corresponding fines and Penalties:

- 19.1 Bringing out and dumping of garbage outside of collection day and proper time of dumping for collection, indiscriminately dumping garbage, littering, throwing, dumping of solid waste matters in public places, such as roads, sidewalks, canals, drainage system, curbs and gutters, esteros or parks, creeks, rivers, tributaries, rivulets and other natural waterways, establishment, or causing or permitting the same;
- 19.2 The open and indiscriminate burning of residual and special wastes;
- 19.3 Causing or permitting the collection of non segregated of wastes/non-segregated of wastes into biodegradable, recyclable, and residual/ special;
- 19.4 Unauthorized removal of recyclable materials intended for collection by authorized persons.

Article VIII- Penal Provisions

Section 20. Fines and Penalties. The following fines and penalties shall be imposed to any person who violates specific provision of this ordinance. He/She be issued with a CITATION TICKET or NOTICE OF VIOLATION by an enforcer duly assigned/designated by the Punong Barangay.

20.1 For paragraphs (19.1) to (19.4)

First Offense – Warning
Second Offense - Php100.00
Third Offense – Php150.00
Subsequent – Php250.00

20.2 Household and establishment that do not provide receptacles/container their refuse/solid waste;

First Offense – Warning
Second Offense- Php100.00
Third Offense – Php150.00
Subsequent – Php250.00

20.3 Not keeping the surrounding areas and immediate premise clean by establishment, institutions, household and other concerned occupants or owners of properties lining the streets from the line of the property to the middle of the street and from one to the other.

First Offense – Warning
Second Offense - Php150.00
Third Offense – Php300
Subsequent – Php550.00

20.4 If the offense is committed by a corporation, partnership, or other Juridical entity duly organized in accordance with law ,the chief Executive officer, president, general manager, managing partner or Such other officer-in- charge shall be liable the commission of the Offense penalized under this ordinance.

20.5 violators shall not be given barangay clearances and certification until he/she has paid and or served his/her fines/penalties. Their names also shall be posted at conspicuous places in the barangay.

20.6 violators shall be accounted per household and the head of the family shall be responsible in the implementation of the ordinance in their respective households. In effect, any violation committed by the household shall be carried by all members of the said household helps, transient visitors and other temporary or visiting individuals.

Section 21. Utilization of Collected Fines. Thirty percent (30%) of the collected fines shall accrue to the general fund for appropriations for the next fiscal year and the remaining Seventy percent (70%), which shall be called as Barangay Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) fund, shall be used for the following within the fiscal year of which the fines were collected:

- 21.1 Honoraria for the Barangay Bayabas Green Brigade of Eco-aids;
- 21.2 Procurement of Materials, Equipment, Protective Gears and other items necessary for the proper implementation of the Ecological Solid Waste Management of the Barangay Bayabas;

- 21.3 Information, Education, communication and monitoring activities of the Ecological Solid Waste Management of Barangay Bayabas;
- 21.4 Acquisition of products, facilities, technologies and process necessary to enhance proper ecological solid waste management;
- 21.5 Transportation/hauling of ecological solid waste;
- 21.6 Awards and Incentives;
- 21.7 Research Program;
- 21.8 Technical Assistance;
- 21.9 Capability- Building activities;
- 21.10 Maintenance and other related activities and program for the Material Recovery Facility (MRF) of cluster.

Article IX – Miscellaneous Provisions

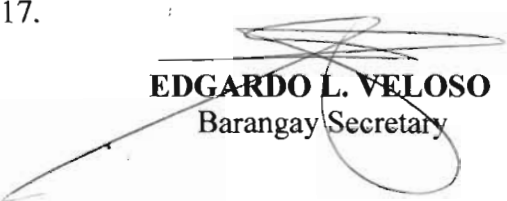
Section 22. Citizen suits. For purposes of enforcing the provisions of this ordinance, any citizen may file an appropriate civil or criminal action in the barangay against any person who violates or fails to comply with the provisions of this ordinance. The Barangay concerned shall exempt such action from payment of filing fees.

Section 23. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of such provision to any person or circumstances is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this ordinance or the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected by such declaration.

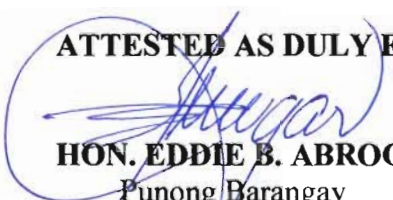
Section 24. Repealing cause. All existing ordinances and resolution of this barangay found to be inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 25. Effectively. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991.

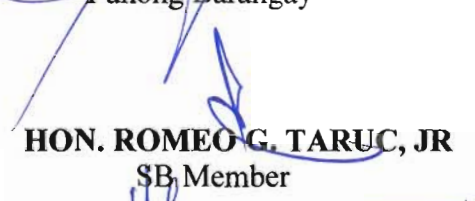
