In this connection, kindly be informed that this Office has thoroughly reviewed the above-mentioned proposed Resolution and its attachment. As such, it appears that the Resolution and the Comprehensive Local Juvenile Intervention Program are within the bounds of the law and likewise mandated by RA 9344 otherwise known as the Juvenile Justice and Welfare Act of 2006.¹

For your guidance and information.

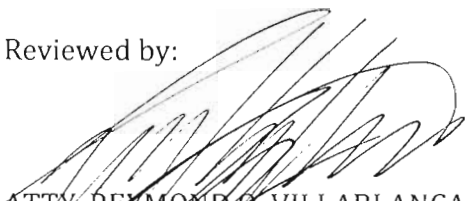
¹ SEC. 18. *Development of a Comprehensive Juvenile Intervention Program*. - A Comprehensive juvenile intervention program covering at least a 3-year period shall be instituted in LGUs from the barangay to the provincial level. The LGUs shall set aside an amount necessary to implement their respective juvenile intervention programs in their annual budget.

The LGUs, in coordination with the LCPC, shall call on all sectors concerned, particularly the child-focused institutions, NGOs, people's organizations, educational institutions and government agencies involved in delinquency prevention to participate in the planning process and implementation of juvenile intervention programs. Such programs shall be implemented consistent with the national program formulated and designed by the JJWC. The implementation of the comprehensive juvenile intervention program shall be reviewed and assessed annually by the LGUs in coordination with the LCPC. Results of the assessment shall be submitted by the provincial and city governments to the JJWC not later than March 30 of every year.

Pursuant to RA 9344 otherwise known as Juvenile Justice Welfare Act of 2006, as amended RA 10630, the Local Government Unit shall formulate or develop a 3 year plan Comprehensive Local Juvenile Intervention Program. Relative to the foregoing, one of the requirements of the construction of the said facility is the formulation and adoption of Comprehensive Local Juvenile Intervention Program.

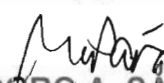

WHEREAS, the alarming incidence of CICL in the City and nearby localities deemed necessary for the construction of Bahay Pagasa.

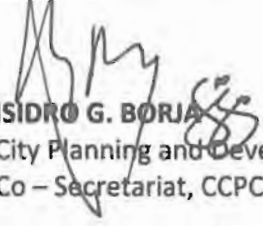

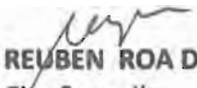

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

"A GOAL WITHOUT A PLAN IS JUST A WISH"

-Antoine de Saint-Exupery

It has been a common norm in the human world that whoever will disobey, will be punished, from the adult sector down to the younger generation - the children. As society evolves through various stages of development, mechanisms of social control with inherent respect to human worth and dignity has been calibrated to maintain order and ensure human species to flourish as time goes on. And that allows every single person to undergo the process of biological development and experiences social, political, and cultural moldings, from being a child into a human adult.

Many social institutions such as families, churches, schools, government agencies and others squarely jolt each other of honing children in preparing them to become assets of the nation, instead of liabilities. Respectively, these institutions establish its own string of policies that regulate a child's action. At some point, these are disjointed from each other, leaving the state, the authority to mend the gaps of other social entities, to save the last hope of every generation – our children.

The challenge is to harmonize all efforts to help the children of becoming responsible members of the state. And that is where the **Juvenile Justice and Welfare Act of 2006 or RA 9344** of the Philippine government, plays its crucial role of maintaining the dignity of a child to continue living his/her dreams despite of being alleged as, accused of, or adjudged as, having committed an offense under Philippine laws. Given emphasis to Article 40 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child:

"the State recognizes the right of every child alleged as, accused of, adjudged, or recognized as having infringed the penal law to be treated in a manner consistent with the promotion of the child's sense of dignity and worth, taking into account the child's age and desirability of promoting his/her reintegration. Whenever appropriate and desirable, the State shall adopt measures for dealing with such children without resorting to judicial proceedings, providing that human rights and legal safeguards are fully respected. It shall ensure that children are dealt with in a manner appropriate to their well-being by providing for, among others, a variety of disposition measures such as care, guidance and supervision orders, counseling, probation, foster care, education and vocational training programs and other alternatives to institutional care".

On the contrary, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro City has been doing its initiatives and duties of helping our children in conflict with the law (CICL) to be reintegrated successfully in the communities and not to reoffend; and our children at risks (CAR) from becoming CICL. Successful stories of children can affirm this journey. However, reality is ruthless that it hastily shows how wider the gap of the local government from its goal when statistical data reveal the increasing number of CICL and CAR in the recent years. As the City Government looks back throughout

the journey, it discovers an important truth, “the absence of a comprehensive plan and program for the children in conflict with the law and children at risk”.

A plan is very significant in undertaking an endeavor. Without it, results are vague and haphazard. Alan Lake in sees the fundamental of having a plan because for him, “failing to plan is planning to fail”. The continuous rise of CICL and CAR cases has proven the importance of possessing a responsive plan.

The City government through the City Council for the Protection of Children (CCPC) is not just wishing to create an illusion environment where children to feeling better to behave better, but a tangible reality. Hence, this is the opportune time that the Comprehensive Local Juvenile Intervention Program (CLJIP) will stand on its feet and not on its head – the product of committed LGU of Cagayan de Oro City, in the protection of our Children.

5. Outcome 3: Decrease number of Reoffending Cases

CHAPTER IV

PROGRAM COMPONENT

The Cagayan de Oro City Local Comprehensive Juvenile Intervention Program, the brainchild of the City Council for the Protection of Children (CCPC), a three-year comprehensive program designed to address causes and consequences that lead to the children of becoming at risk and children in conflict with the law. To address squarely at all fronts, the CCPC embedded it with Preventive, Curative, and Rehabilitative and Developmental Components envisioning for a more deeper approach of addressing not only the tip of an iceberg about matters concerning CICL and CAR, but its the multi-faceted factors in general as well.

The Cagayan de Oro City Council for the Protection of Children (CCPC) and City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) orchestrated the Juvenile Intervention Program, based on the Comprehensive National Juvenile Intervention Program Framework, on the following levels:

1) PRIMARY INTERVENTIONS (Developmental)

These wide range of interventive activities include general measures to promote social justice and equal opportunity which will indirectly tackle perceived root causes of offending. These shall include programs on advocacy, and socio-economic, health and nutrition, training and education services.

2) SECONDARY INTERVENTIONS (Protective and Preventive)

It includes measures to assist children-at-risk and to prevent them from offending. Interventions are focused on problem areas in the child, family and community. That in resolving such problems, the circumstances of the child would return to a healthy and functioning state.

3) TERTIARY INTERVENTIONS (Remedial)

It includes measures to address the needs of children who have committed an offense to prevent them from reoffending and to avoid unnecessary contact with the formal justice system and other measures to prevent reoffending. These include diversion programs, rehabilitation, re-integration and after care services.

The City Government of Cagayan de Oro City through the CCPC, with the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) in all the Eighty (80) barangays in Cagayan de Oro City ensures the protection and the provision of responsive interventive services for proper development of children in the city giving utmost emphasis on safety, health, and good moral environment that consequently facilitate their wholesome development. It shall provide:

- 1) Intervention Programs for children fifteen (15) years old and below who have committed a non-serious offense;

- 2) Intervention programs for children more than fifteen (15) years old but less than eighteen (18) years old who acted without discernment; and
- 3) Diversion Programs for children more than fifteen (15) years old but less than eighteen (18) years old who acted with discernment and who have committed an offense with an imposable penalty of not more than six (6) years of imprisonment. If diversion is conducted at the BCPC level, and COCPO level and Prosecutor's level of not more than 12 years of imprisonment and if diversion is resorted to by the family court.
- 4) Intervention program is to be provided to CAR as part of the strengthening of the preventive mechanisms of CAR becoming CICL.

MENU OF INTERVENTION:

The CCPC as established body responsible for the monitoring, coordination, recommending body for local legislation and implementation of programs and other children related policies works hand in hand with various stakeholders to ensure that preventive mechanisms, rehabilitative and developmental interventions are well-placed to abate incidence of minor offending at status of being at risk.

Based from the assessment of the handling social worker, the intervention plan of a CICL and a CAR may include interventive activities or combination of various interventions

The Intervention Programs in the City of Cagayan de Oro are the following:

CHAPTER V

LOCAL REFERRAL NETWORK AND COORDINATION MECHANISMS

The City Government of Cagayan de Oro ensures that effective and efficient referral mechanism or schemes shall be established to track the status of CAR/CICL. Stakeholders who have direct involvement to CAR/CICL (CSWDO, CCPC, BCPC, PROSECUTOR, and the COURTS) are adherent to mandatory registry of CAR/CICL as provided in Juvenile Justice Welfare Act to ensure that records and data of children have no discrepancies. Thus, the steady flow of referral system will speed up or hasten the disposition of the case of the child.

If the apprehended CICL is 15 years old and below shall commit non-heinous crime, the duty bearers after accumulating relevant information from the child for online registry, shall turn-over the child to his immediate family and likewise subject to community-based intervention program. The City Social Welfare and Development Office shall facilitate the diversion proceedings and Intervention program of the child. The Barangay Council for the Protection of Children then shall monitor the compliance of the child to intervention programs conferred to the child and his family.

On the other hand, if the apprehended CICL is 15 years old above and below 18 shall commit heinous crime, the duty bearers after accumulating relevant information from the child for online registry, shall refer the child to CSWDO (Tahanan ng Kabataan) for temporary shelter and determine the level of discernment of the child.

The CSWDO (Tahanan ng kabataan) who takes custody of the CICL while waiting for the proper disposition of their case, shall ensure that their basic needs are met: food, clothing and shelter and their basic rights are faithfully upheld. The Cagayan de Oro City BAHAY PAG-ASA (Tahanan ng Kabataan) is more than ready to attend to CICL/CAR's needs.

The aforesaid flow of referral system may be fully implemented once the stakeholders and duty bearers will obtain sufficient knowledge on the fundamental features of Juvenile Justice and Welfare Act, and will be capacitated to prevent irregularities. Thus, the CSWDO should be consistent in their to conduct building and skills enhancement activities to WCPDs and BCPCs thru the technical assistance provided by the Regional Juvenile Justice and Welfare Committee.

On the other hand, the referral system might delay the resolution/disposition of the case if bureaucracy and red tapes get in the way. It is essential, therefore, to institutionalize the referral flow and coordination mechanism.

Moreover, more effective IEC on children's rights should be institutionalized to enhance community awareness on children's protection and development. This should be coupled with education/values formation trainings.

MONITORING AND EVALUATION

The need to institutionalize the online-registry system for CAR/CICL or Local Juvenile Justice Information System is imperative scheme for continuous update of the local profile of CICL and CAR which is basis for the formulation of the CLJIP. It is also the basis for research and in-depth study on CAR/CICL's situation. The City Government shall then have an access to this updated record and data for program innovations and implementation.

The CLJIP contains programs and strategies that are relevant and responsive to the diverse needs of CICL and CAR from prevention, rehabilitation to reintegration. The LGU's Program design should be coherent to the synchronized standard and framework crafted by Juvenile Justice and Welfare Council. However, the LGU is encouraged to formulate contextualized program design. The program will be in manual form and will be submitted to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for adoption and to the Cagayan de Oro City Council for the Protection of Children for implementation.

Monitoring and evaluation (M&E) should be institutionalized as well for it is a very important strategy and often overlooked component of Public Sector Management (PSM), especially among Philippine Local governments. It involves the systematic collection and analysis of information about events/activities associated with the implementation of development programs and projects. It also provides the framework for improving or facilitating project implementation.

The local Project Monitoring Committee as the monitoring arm is mandated to look closely all development projects (economic, social, infrastructure and other development projects) of the city. The Results Based Matrix will be used as a tool for reporting and monitoring of the progress of CICL/CAR.

DATA ON CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY

PROFILE OF THE CITY OF CAGAYAN DE ORO

BRIEF Historical Background

- At the time when the first Spanish Missionaries came in 1622, the people of Cagayan had a tributary relation to Kudarat, the Muslim Sultan of Maguindanao Empire in Cotabato. Yet the people had not embraced Islam. Instead, many became Christian after sometime. Because of this, Muslim warriors began to attack the settlement. As a defense strategy, the priests persuaded the people to transfer from the hilltop to a better location which is the present site of Saint Augustine Cathedral. The Cagayanons were able to defend themselves for almost 25 years from Muslim harassment.
- In 1738, Spanish dominance was felt in Cagayan. When Misamis gained status of province in 1818, one of its four districts was the Partidos de Cagayan. In 1871, the "Partidos" became a town and was made permanent capital of Misamis. In 1833, the town became seat of the Spanish government in Mindanao for the provinces of Misamis Oriental, Misamis Occidental, Bukidnon, Lanao del Norte and Zamboanga del Norte. Consequently, from a purely farming-fishing area, Cagayan emerged into a booming commerce and trade center.
- The war years in Cagayan were prompted by the presence of the Americans in 1898. The Americans were initially and successfully repulsed by the local forces led by Major Apolinar Velez at the historic battle of Macahambus in June 4, 1900. After the troubled years, peace finally brought back economic activities to normal but under the tutelage of Lourdes College, was inaugurated in 1928.
- On June 15, 1950 President Elpidio Quirino signed Republic Act. No. 521 which granted the status of a chartered city to the municipality of Cagayan de Oro. Following these events, the socio-economic order underwent some far-reaching changes. Activities grew in scale and importance until it developed as the administrative for the entire Northern Mindanao.

POPULATION SIZE, GROWTH AND DISTRIBUTION

- The earliest population estimates was in 1650 which shows that the population of Cagayan de Oro was barely 900. Records show that in 1903, when the first census was taken, the population of Cagay-an was placed at 10, 937. This excluded Iponan (former Municipality of Bukidnon Province) and (then a barrio of Agusan Municipality, Bukidnon). (N.B Iponan, Gusa and Agusan are now barangays of this city.)
- In 1939, the population had reached 53,194 which covered Barrio Sungay and the Poblacion of the former municipal district of Lourdes. (N.B Sungay and entire Lourdes are now barangays of Alubijid, Misamis Oriental)
- The City showed an extreme increase in population. Migration and high birth rate were the contributory factors in population growth. People from neighboring provinces, Cities and municipalities moved to the City for job and income opportunities. Sprouting subdivisions in the city is one attraction for the people to live in Cagayan de Oro City.
- The City is also one of the highly urbanized cities which comprise 80 barangays. Of this, barangay Carmen was the most populated barangay, followed by barangay Lapasan, Balulang, Kauswagan and Bulua. The rest of the barangays had share of less than five percent each to the total population of the City as of 2013.
- The average population density of the city was 11 persons per hectare as of 2013. The most densely populated barangay was Barangay Macabalan with a population density of 456 persons per hectare. It was followed by Barangay 35 (Poblacion) 330 persons per hectare, and barangay 15: 327 persons per hectare. Barangay Besigan had the lowest population density of about 0.27 persons per hectare.

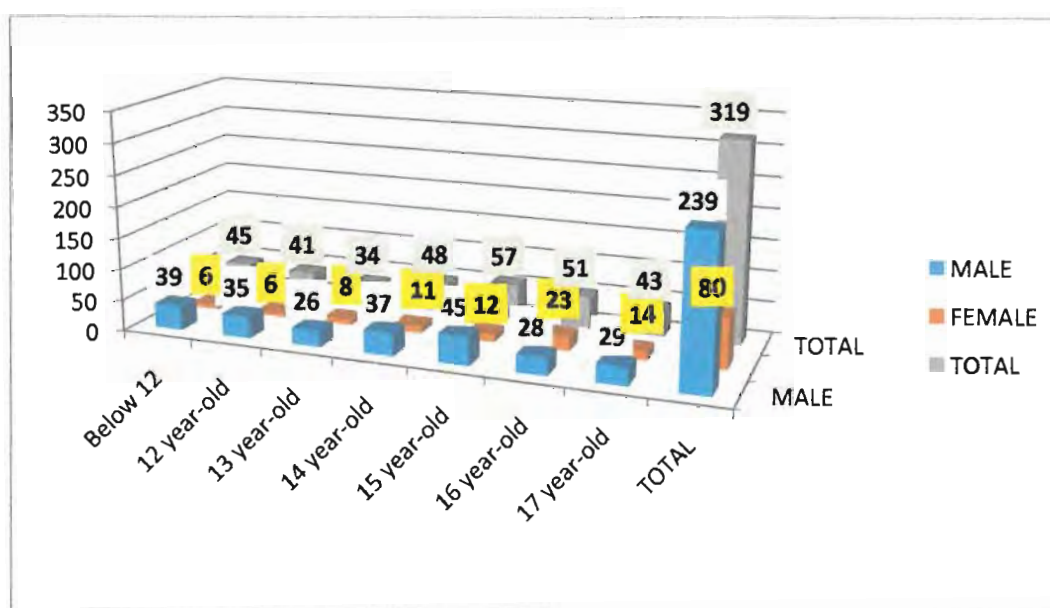

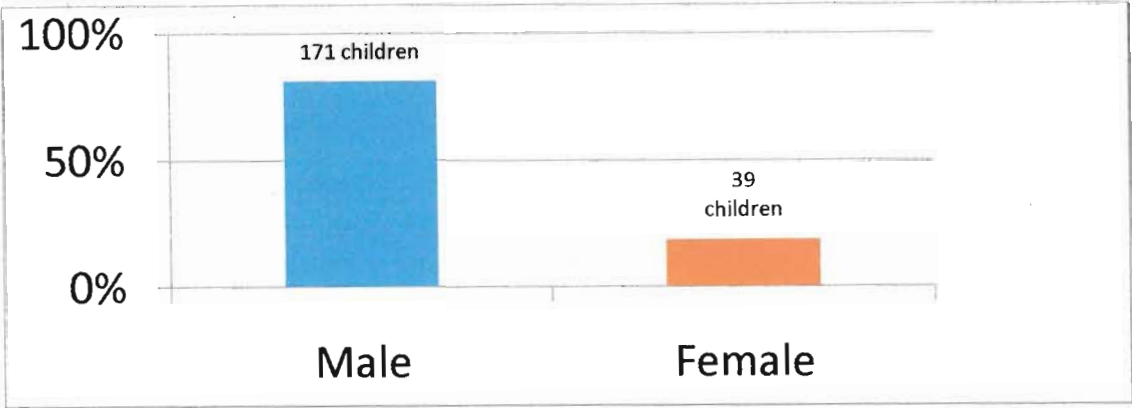

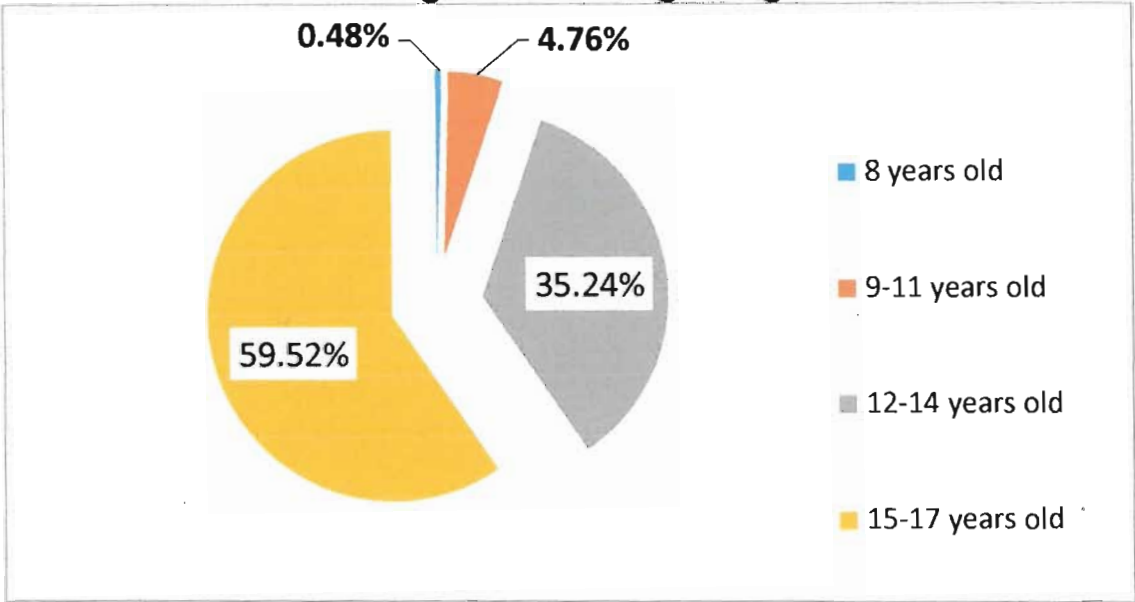
Fig 1- According to Gender

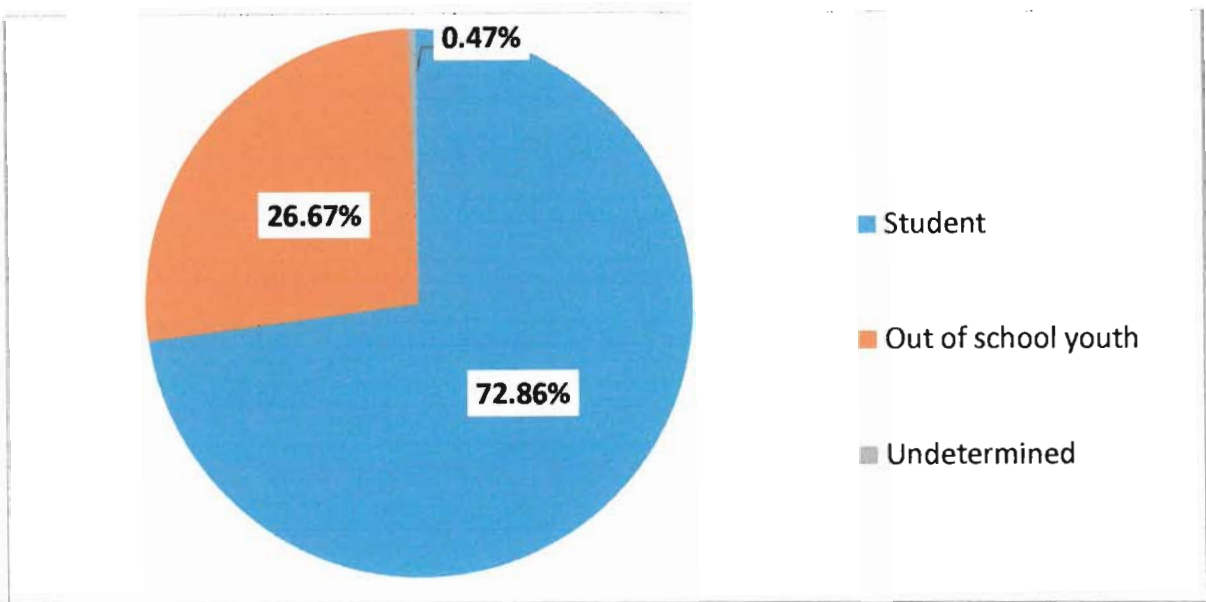
Fig 2- According to Age

Likewise, it will be noted that the youngest offender is 8 years old.

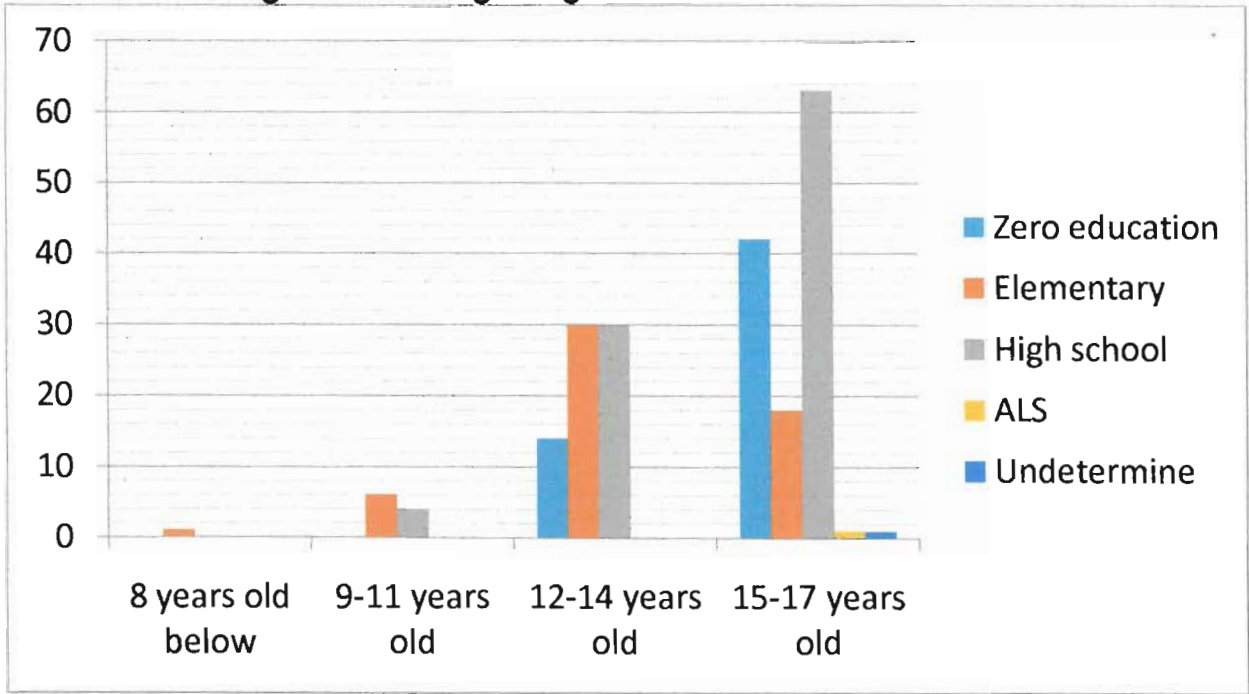
Fig. 3 According to Educational Profile

According to PNP data, majority of the offenders is students and only 26.67% are out of school. The data show that it is not a right assumption that minors committing offenses are dominated by the out of school children. Moreover, this can be interpreted as well that during apprehension and recording of cases at the PNP Station, CICL are usually claiming that they are into schooling as common alibi to prevent the police officers from filing formal complaints and turn-over the CSWD for shelter.

Fig. 4- According to Age and Educational Profile

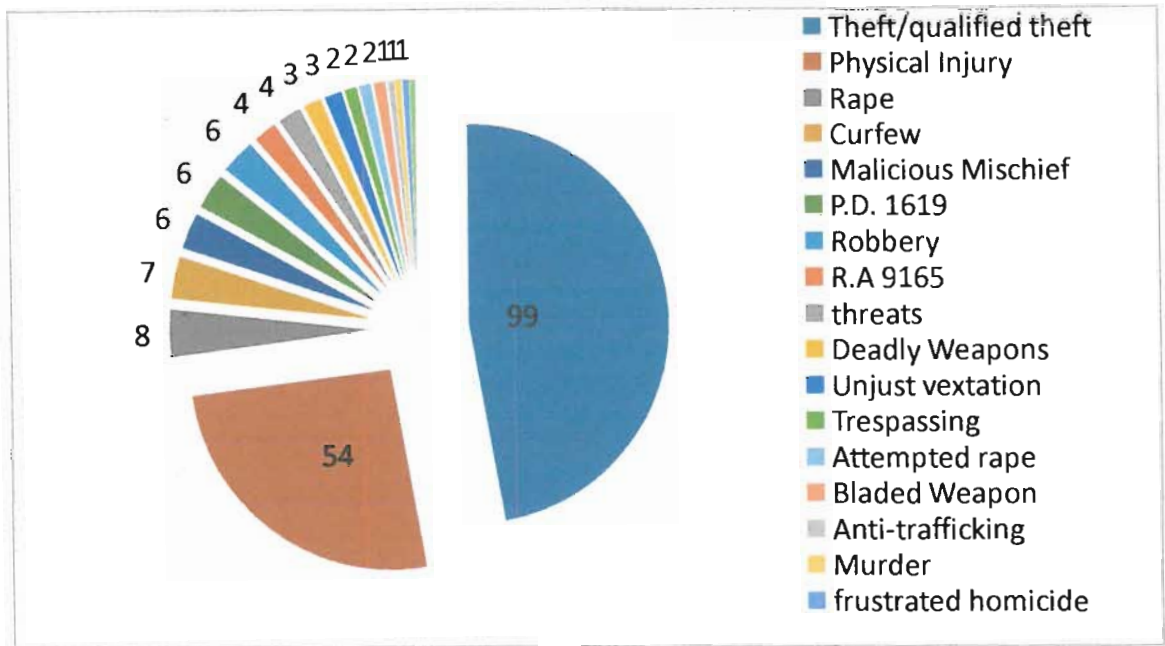

interesting to note too, that there are CICL whose education status cannot be determined by the PNP.

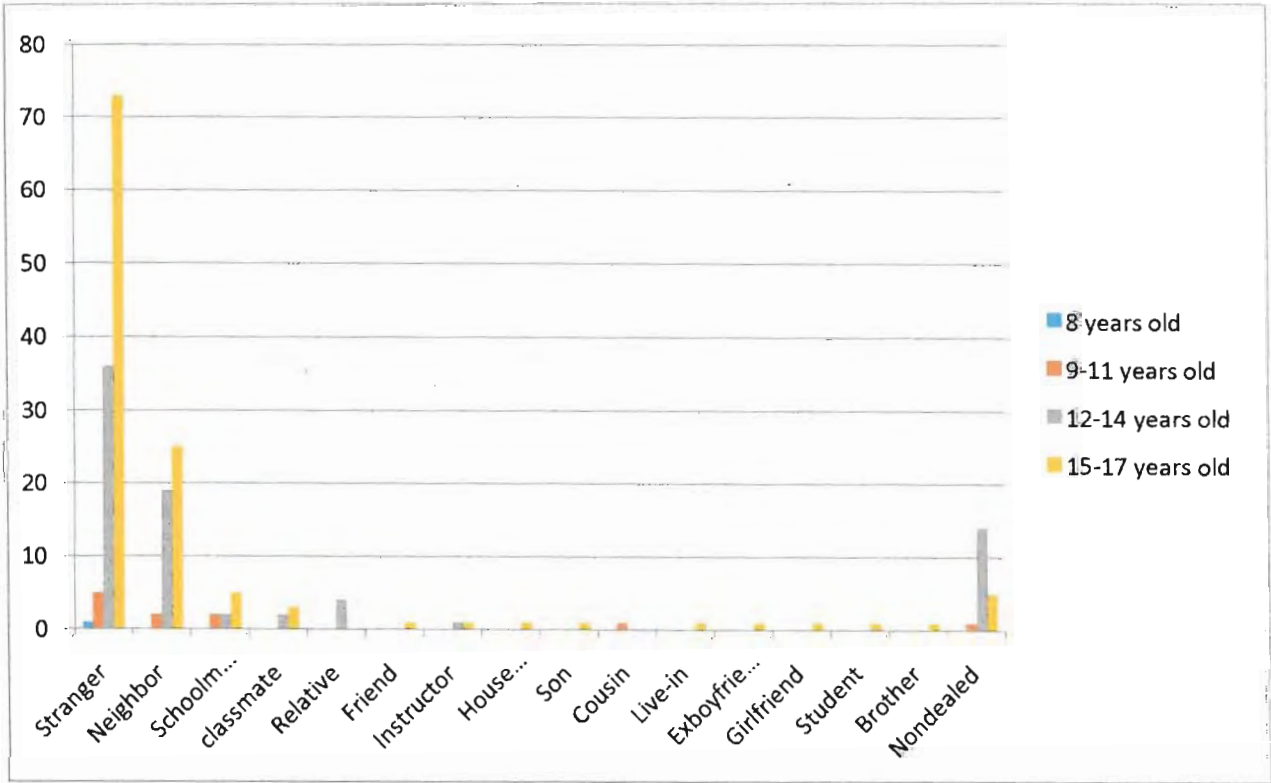
Fig. 5- According to Crime Committed

It can be deduced that with the high incidence of solvent sniffing minor and street kids in the City, theft has been the common crime committed by a minor due to their cravings to maintain the effect of the solvent which also alters their mental faculty and reasoning. Physical injury is the second highest crime committed by minors.

Fig. 8 shows the relationship of the offender to the victim where majority of the victims are not known to the offenders or strangers. It implies that these children are

not always staying on their respective homes and are wandering the densely populated streets of the City.

Causes of CAR and CICL Incidence (Assessment from Personal Accounts of children)

There are three (3) identified causes that contribute to the incidence of CICL/CAR problem based from the personal accounts of minors. Firstly is poverty where most families of these children belong to the poor families, informal settlers and some are homeless. The children at risk who stayed on streets become solvent sniffers to overcome hunger temporarily. Consequently, to feed themselves, they resulted to theft, robbery, begging and other illegal activities.

The poor family relationships that include weak parenting over the children, co-habitation set up of parents where previous children are neglected due to new family, and child abuses that take place within a home. According to CWC and UNICEF Study in 2016, most children experience violence in their own homes where supposedly they should feel safest.

Lastly, peer influence plays contributory factor where children go to streets and remain on streets. Children who are-felt unloved from home find acceptance and social connection to children on and of the streets.

ORDINANCES AND POLICIES FOR CHILD PROTECTION, CICL AND CAR

From 1994 to 2012, the City Council of Cagayan de Oro City has crafted useful ordinances that champion the rights of CICL and CAR and children sector in general. These range from regulatory ordinances to policies that promote rights of children.

LOCAL PROGRAMS (Intervention, services and facilities for CAR and CICL)

PROGRAMS AND INTERVENTIONS

The City government has implemented programs for children that are categorized in three (3) components based from OSCAR (Operation Save Children Atong Responsibilidad) Framework; the Preventive Component, the

Developmental Component and Curative Component which address the four (4) broad rights of a child such as 1) survival, 2) development, 3) protection and 4) participation.

A. Preventive Component

This includes the Immunization Program and Vitamin Supplementation, 54 Barangay Health Stations are PhilHealth Accredited for Maternal Care Package, Barangay Health Stations are PhilHealth Accredited Primary Care Package, Nutrition Program, 12 Basic Emergency Obstetrical and Neo-Natal Care (BeMonc) Facilities, Information and Education Campaign against Mendicancy and Parental Responsibility Code, Annual Search for A Child-Friendly Barangay, Strengthening of Barangay Council for the Protection of Children, and Education on the Benefits of Sound Family Planning.

B. Curative Component

This includes the 24 hour Reach-out (ORPC), Temporary Custodial Care (Bio-psychosocial Processing), Mother Theresa (Operated this year)= for children at risk (street children and solvent sniffers), BoysTown, Psychosocial Intervention for Street Children, Case Management (After Care), Implementation of Parental Responsibility Code and Accredited Home Care for Girls.

C. Development Component

This includes, the programs and services on Formal and non-formal education for children, Parent Education Seminar/PES, Skills and Livelihood Training For the Parents, Livelihood Capital Assistance, Supervised Neighborhood Play, Construction of School Buildings and Classrooms, SPES, City Government Internship Program, Standardization of ECCD services, Accreditation of Teachers and Centers and Standard Center Facility

FACILITIES FOR CICL & CAR

The City Government of Cagayan de Oro City has an existing facility, the Tahanan ng Kabataan, a one storey facility for male that serves as a custodial center for CICL who are waiting for the disposition of the court, whose assessment of discernment is on-going and above 15 but below 18 solvent sniffers. This facility is farfetched from the standards set by the DSWD for a facility for CICL. It is located in Barangay Lumbia.

CICL Female cases are very few. The City has no existing facility that caters to female CICL. For custody purposes while waiting trial, Home Care for Girls, a facility for female abused children caters to the female CICL, but separate the CICL female from abused female residents.

LGU AND COMMUNITY STRUCTURES, MECHANISMS FOR CHILD PROTECTION

FUNCTIONALITY OF THE LCPC AND BCPCs

The CCPC at the City level and the BCPC at the Barangay level are very important mechanisms in addressing the concerns/issues of the CAR & CICL. Both structures can be described as basic, responsive, mature and ideal. The Cagayan

de Oro City Council for the Welfare and Protection of Children was rated as basic, 59 out of the Councils for the Protection of Children (BCPC) are considered basic while the remaining 5 BCPC's were rated as mature, and 5 were rated as ideal.

MECHANISMS FOR CHILD PROTECTION

The City Council for the Protection of Children of Cagayan de Oro City in coordination with the CSWD Department has established unified mechanism in handling children for protection. This mechanism helps the various stakeholders concerned to take part and perform their mandates from the Barangay Level to the City level.

BCPCs have been given the task as primary responders of reports about violation of rights of children. WCPD of various stations are tasked to assist the various BCPCs or VAWC Desk Officer upon request of security and enforcement. Complex cases that require the expertise and assistance of Social Workers imperatively require the intervention of the CSWD Department. Furthermore, if minors based on the assessment of the social workers require admission for

temporary shelter as security measures, CSWD Centers are ready to cater to their needs.

However, in cases where number of residents goes beyond the center's capacity, the partner NGOs are open for admission. Case Management is being conducted through MDT to all assisted minors.

The City Social Welfare and Development Office are supported by the 5 NGO's in the City which cater to the needs of abandoned/neglected children.

SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS

Cagayan de Oro City, a highly-urbanized city, and considered as the hub of the Northern Mindanao has enjoy the inflow of businesses, commerce, trade, finance and job opportunities. Consequently, many informal settlers are displaced due to development. Influx of migrants looking for better opportunities in the city is high. With the high demand of work, such as construction, many jobless families were given opportunities, and eventually, their respective families live with them in the city.

Many of these families resorted to rent in a cheaper house, and boarding houses which are usually located in the hazard prone areas of the city and are not trained on sound family planning. The City has a total of 35,000 families to be resettled in the identified resettlement areas. With influx of migrants, it proposes a major housing problem.

Street kids are becoming prevalent. Increase of solvent sniffing minors can be seen in major business areas of the city. The increase of CICL and CAR in the City has affected the peace and order of the City. Though primarily, the CAR and CICL lives are at stake in this condition. Their behavior towards the mass public creates fears and negative reactions. Likewise, their presence is offensive among business establishments and nuisance to the customers. These are the problems being identified in the situation of CICL and CAR in the city, to wit:

1. Majority of the BCPCs are non-functional
2. Lack of parents' participation in the intervention program of the child
3. Absence of leverage between parents and the child in the intervention program
4. Poor and inadequate community programs for Children
5. Absence of unified data collection and management system
6. lack of capacity development and training of barangay personnel in handling children
7. Need for Focal Person Handling BCPC Matters - a non-elected officer
8. Poor monitoring of BCPC to Interventions on BCPC Cases
9. Poor Participation Rate on ECCD Program
10. Absence of Bahay Pag-asa in the City

It is high time that the City Government pursue interventions that have sustainability on change and require the vital contribution from various stakeholders directly and indirectly affected by these conditions.

DESCRIPTIVE PROFILE of CAR /CICL

From 2013-2016, the City Government of Cagayan de Oro City through the City Social Welfare and Development Office has served 1,518 children that involved cases on CNSP, CAR and CICL. Sixty three percent (63%) of the children served is CICL, a quite alarming condition that needs to be addressed squarely by the local government.

The children's population specifically the 15-19 year-old population is the highest of all ages which implied that the city government should strengthen the programs and services that directly addresses the FOUR BROAD RIGHTS of Children. This is to ensure a healthy workforce and balance major players in sustaining the development gains of the City.

In 2014 to 2016, there was a decrease of 87% CNSP clients being catered by the city government. This could be attributed to the two (2) major events, the Search for Child Friendly Police Station and Child Friendly Barangay that helped PNP Stations and BCPCs to fulfill their mandates.

On the other hand, crimes committed by children, theft and robbery were the highest cases recorded. This can be attributed to the number of street children who

sniffed solvents that resort to theft and robbery just to sustain the addiction. It is worthy to note that from 2014 to 2015, there was a decrease of 52% and from 2015 to 2016, a decrease of 79%. The decline of cases can be attributed to the Operation Save Children Responsibilidad (OSCAR) Reach-out team launched by CSWD Department in coordination with the concerned barangays and WCPD Offices of Police Stations.

Majority of CAR and CICL are 15 - 17 years old which implied that assessment of discernment by the local social workers had to be undertaken as basis of the prosecutor for filing of case. Likewise, majority of CAR and CICL were males, an important reminder to look into the aggressive tendencies of male teens and involvement to solvent sniffing. Though the number is quiet few, it cannot be disregarded that if not addressed, there is a possibility of increase cases of female CICL.

Lastly, majority of the CICL are in-school and out of school males, particularly in Grades 4 to 6. It can be deduced that children who committed the crimes are either in-school and out-school children. The intervention to be designed should be parallel for in-school and out-of-school.

CAUSES OF HIGH INCIDENCE OF CAR AND CICL

There are three (3) identified causes that contribute to the incidence of CICL/CAR problem based from the personal accounts of minors. Firstly is poverty, where most families of these children belong to the poor families, informal settlers and some are homeless. The children at risk who stayed on streets become solvent sniffers to overcome hunger temporarily. Consequently, to feed themselves, they resulted to theft, robbery, begging and other illegal activities.

The poor family relationships that include weak parenting over the children, co-habitation set up of parents where previous children are neglected due to new family, and child abuses that take place within a home. According to CWC and UNICEF Study in 2016, most children experience violence in their own homes where supposedly they should feel safest.

Lastly, peer influence plays contributory factor where children go to streets and remain on streets. Children who felt unloved from home find acceptance and social connection to children on and of the streets.

As Cagayan de Oro City is moving towards metropolization and being the center of commerce in Region 10, it is expected that in succeeding years there will be influx of migrants. This will likely result to increase in informal settlers in the city which will aggravate the situation if not properly attended.

ORDINANCES AND POLICIES

It is noted that Ordinances and Administrative policies of the City Government are well crafted to address matters concerning children. However, policies which are promulgated more than decades are need to be revisited and amended.

The Children's Code of Cagayan de Oro City needs to be reviewed since some of provisions of the Ordinance are lenient, not applicable in today's situation and should include among others provisions that can protect and promote the rights of children such as policies in addressing child trafficking cases and BCPCs' non-functionality.

Moreover, the memberships of the City Council for the Protection of Children need to be expanded to include important stakeholders that can contribute largely in complementing the Program components of OSCAR.

Proposed Ordinance on Travel clearance for Travelling Minor shall be pursued as vital key in preventing trafficking against children from the city and into the City who are usually exploited and used by organized crime syndicate to commit crimes.

FACILITIES

The existence facilities for CAR and CICL being managed by the CSWD Department is quietly alleviate the situation of temporary custodial care (Bahay Pag Asa-Tahanan Ng Kabataan, Mother Teresa Home Care for Children, SDC- Home For Girls, Boys Town Center). However, there is really a need for the construction of Bahay Pag-asa that is in accordance to the standards of the DSWD.

COMMUNITY MECHANISMS

The referral system from the barangay up to the CSWD has been effective since it readily responds to concerns of CICLs/CARs due to the presence of BCPC Focal Persons and VAWC Desk Officers. Fifteen (15) below CICL and CAR undergo intervention in the barangay but need to be paralleled with the Parental Responsibility Code Provisions that give emphasis to parental responsibility.

CICL/CARs' needs are being provided in the Centers upon admission and center social workers' assist CICL in their court appearances.

On the other side, there are still cases where Police Stations detain CICL on their custody especially during weekends and need to secure the order from the Office of the Prosecutors. This is one critical area that the city government should address.

The City Council for the Protection of Children through a resolution appointed the PNP as the baseline source of all data regarding CICL Cases and violations of RA 7610 and other child related laws to avoid discrepancies of data. Moreover, it has been established that all cases being handled by the partner agencies and barangays shall be put into PNP records for data monitoring.

IEC on children's rights shall be given importance by the CCPC as a major strategy in preventing violation of children's rights in partnership with BCPCs and other stakeholders.

COMMUNITY STRUCTURES

The composition and membership in the Cagayan de Oro City Council for the Protection of Children has been expanded. It is not only confined to what is being provided under the law. To squarely address all matters concerning children, NGOs and POs that are operating in the City were invited and they agreed to sit as members in the Council.

However, the availability of council members remains a concern. Due to the multiplicity of functions and heavy workload, some members find difficulty in attending the meetings.

All barangays have BCPCs but some are not functional. The City DILG has been providing technical assistance to these BCPCs in discharging their responsibilities.

Political loyalty to the former Mayor of the City is one of the major ordeals that the CCPC and the city is facing. It made barangays passive in responding to the needs of Children especially CICL and CAR.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

Based from the premises discoursed, the CICL and CAR problem cannot be addressed only by few agencies and non-comprehensive interventions that lack the accountability of the BCPCs, Family and the Social Workers. The multi-factors that interplay in aggravating the circumstances of CICL and CAR, the multi-layers of problems besetting the sector from the child, to the family, to the community and to the city in general require deliberate and inclusive approach. Hence, these are the things that will to be put forward that straightforwardly and in some way help to alleviate the problem, viz:

1. Approve the Enhanced Children's Code which covers the penalty of non-participative barangays in the Annual Search for Child Friendly Barangays and the CCPC shall start to assess the needs of the BCPCs and shall provide technical assistance from thereon from the first quarter of every year to help the barangay officials become effective and functional to their mandate. Furthermore, the new Children's Code will eventually enforce the 1% allocation for the program of children from the IRA of the Barangay.
2. Strict Implementation of the Parental Responsibility Code in coordination with the BCPCs in the monitoring of the intervention and diversion program of the CICL and as well the CAR and file formal charges against the parents as provided by the code in cases of parental failure.
3. Continuous improvement of the Recording system of the CICL and CAR Cases using the national database as provided by the JJWC.
4. CCPC in coordination with the CSWD shall continue to capacitate duty bearers at the barangay level to maintain child-friendly service among CICL and CAR Cases. Moreover, semestral evaluation and forum shall be institutionalized among VAWC Desk Officers and BCPC Focal Persons to maintain rights-based service.

5. Sustainability of Handling Children's Cases at the Barangay Level. This is affected by the electoral process since it disrupts provision of services to the children when new Barangay Captains are elected. To sustain the gains of the BCPCs, it is highly recommended that all BCPCs shall appoint a non-elected official as BCPC Focal Person.
6. The City Government through the City Social Welfare and Development Office shall create an after-care team that will look into the interventions and diversion program of the CICL and the CAR so that needs of the children will be provided timely and appropriately.
7. Supervised Neighborhood Play shall be instituted by the CSWD Department as one of the mechanisms to increase participation rate among ECCD Preschoolers. Moreover, strict implementation in coordination with the BCPCs on the Parental Responsibility Code to sanction parents if pre-school children are not enrolled in Child Development Centers. Likewise, abolition of registration fees and other miscellaneous shall be implemented. Monthly dues among parents are to be considered if agreed unanimously through a resolution among parents' association.
8. Establishment of Bahay Pag-asa is crucial and needs to be implemented the soonest time possible. The CCPC through the CSWD shall convey an intent letter to the JJWC of constructing a Bahay Pag-asa based on the standards as provided by the Council. It shall comply all the prerequisites being set by the Council as counterpart of the City Government. The establishment of the facility will surely provide quality services to the residents where rights of a CICL and CAR will be given utmost priority and attention.

Sir,

We have requested from the National Government through Juvenile Justice and Welfare Council (JJWC) funding support for the establishment of Bahay Pag-asa in Cagayan de Oro City. This project we aimed at is one of our commitments to protect Children in Conflict with the Law (CICL).

Relative to this, we have an approved budget of P 8,630,000.00 CY-2017 for the Construction, Operation and Maintenance of Bahay Pag-asa following the Rules and Regulations of R.A 9344 amended by R.A 10630.

However, to get the funding support of P10, 000,000.00 from National Government, we need to submit a resolution from the Sangguniang Panglungsod which includes the following commitments:

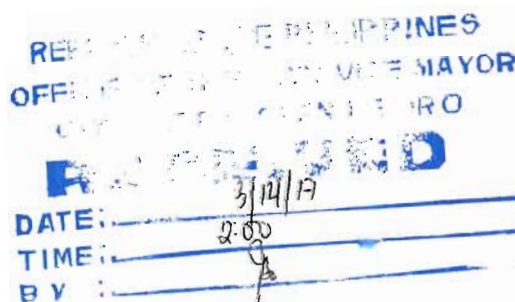
- Resolution attesting the availability of land 10, 000 square meters from the land donated to LGU of Cagayan de Oro City where the Bahay Pag-asa will be constructed and which is located at Maitum, Upper Puerto, CDO. This land is very accessible to community facilities to meet the basic needs of the children.
- Resolution which signifies the availability of funds in the Annual Budget through the Local Social Welfare and Development Office for the Construction, Operation and Maintenance of Bahay Pag-asa in the amount of 8,630,000.00 which includes P5, 000,000.00 counterpart/ share of LGU, Cagayan de Oro for the construction of the Bahay Pag-Asa as required by the standard design of said facility
- Resolution from Sangguniang Panlungsod that signifies availability of funds for maintenance and operation of Bahay Pag-Asa for the next three calendar years in the amount of P 5,000,000.00, through the annual budget of the City Social Welfare and Development Office.
- This budget also includes LGU commitment to hire personnel on plantilla positions and under contract services following the minimum requirement in the guidelines.

Attached herewith is the Deed of Donation of the 10 hectares of Land located at Maitum, Upper Puerto, Cagayan de Oro City and the letter to the Honorable City Mayor Oscar S. Moreno from JJWC.

We hope for your full support to make this project possible.

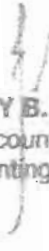

This DEED OF DONATION made and executed by and between:

CAGAYAN CAPTOL COLLEGE, a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Philippines, with business and office address at Corrales Ext., Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, represented at this instance by Atty. CASIMIRO B. JUAREZ, JR. President, of legal age, Filipino citizen, married with residence at Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, hereinafter referred to as the DONOR;

The City of CAGAYAN DE ORO, Philippines represented at this instance by Mayor PABLO P. MAGTAJAS, likewise of legal age, married, Filipino citizen and resident of the City of Cagayan de Oro, Philippines, hereinafter referred to as the DONEE;

W I T N E S S E T H, that:

The DONOR is the owner in fee simple of that certain property situated in Cagayan de Oro City, Island of Mindanao, Philippines and more particularly described in TRANSFER CERTIFICATE OF TITLE NO. T-2389 of the Office of the Register of Deeds for the City of Cagayan de Oro, as follows, to wit:

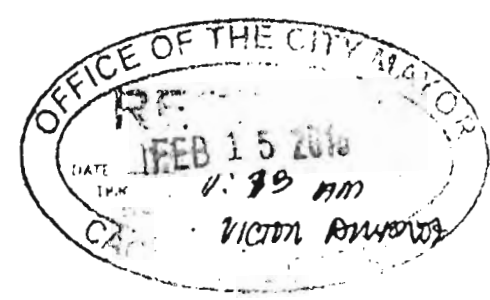

Excerpt from the Guidelines on the Selection of Priority LGUs and on the Procedure of Allocating Five Million National Government Contribution for the Construction, Completion or Improvement of Bahay Pag-asa:

Selection Criteria

- a) The LGU has high incidence of CICL served from CY 2010 to 2015, certified by the Regional Director of DSWD Field Office;
- b) The LGU has no Bahay Pag-asa or Residential Care Facility (RCF) catering to CICL certified by the Regional Director of DSWD Field Office;
- c) There is no nearby LGU with Bahay Pag-asa or Residential Care Facility (RCF) exclusively catering to CICL without prejudice to Highly Urbanized Cities (HUCs) certified by the Regional Director of DSWD Field Office. Section 49 of RA 9344 as amended by RA 10630 mandates the establishment of Bahay Pag-asa in every province and Highly Urbanized Cities in the country.
- d) In instances that the LGU has existing Bahay Pag-asa, priority shall be given to the following to meet the standards of Bahay Pag-asa:
 - * partially constructed- the construction of the facility is still on progress and needs completion
 - * needs improvement- the facility lacks Intensive Juvenile Intervention Support Center (IJISC) and other features are not compliant with the standards of Bahay Pag-asa
- e) The LGU has a Comprehensive Local Juvenile Intervention Program (CLJIP) developed in accordance with RA 9344 as amended and its RIRR and certified/validated by the DSWD-Field Offices;
- f) The Sangguniang Panlalawigan/Panglungsod has issued a Resolution identifying the source of funds for the separate annual budget for the operation and maintenance of the Bahay Pag-asa in the next three calendar years and identifying the source of funds for the allocation of at least five million pesos (Php 5,000,000.00) LGU counterpart share or higher as required by the standard design for the construction/completion/improvement of the facility;
- g) The LGU's Sangguniang Panlalawigan/Sangguniang Panglungsod has issued a Resolution attesting to the availability of land where the Bahay Pag-asa will be constructed. In addition, the Resolution shall indicate that the land is owned or donated to the LGU and is free from any lien and encumbrances;
- h) The land where the Bahay Pag-asa will be constructed is not prone to any disaster as certified by the authorized government authority. Likewise, the location of the land is accessible to community facilities to meet the basic needs of the children (e.g. schools, hospitals, churches).
- i) The LGU has not received/granted previous funding support from the national government for the establishment/construction of BPA or RCF for CAR and CICL e.g. Bottom-Up Budgeting (BUB).

LGU Counterpart Resources and Responsibilities

- (1) Land with a minimum area of 1,000 square meters for provinces and Highly Urbanized Cities (HUCs) where the Bahay Pag-asa will be constructed owned or donated to the LGU. Moreover, the land surface area should be relatively plain and flat without hilly and sloping area;

- (2) LGU counterpart share of at least Five Million Pesos (Php 5,000,000.00) or higher as required by the standard design for the construction/completion/improvement of the facility;
- (3) The LGU will issue a resolution showing commitment to create plantilla items or hire personnel under MOA/Contract of Service status following the minimum staffing requirements under the Guidelines on the Operation of Bahay Pag-Asa;
- (4) LGUs' willingness to serve children from municipalities within the province on a cost-sharing scheme (for provinces);
- (5) The LGU shall agree to follow the standard physical design or architectural plan adopted or approved by the JJWC;
- (6) The DPWH shall provide for a work plan detailing the stages and timeframe for the construction based on the approved Standard Design of the Bahay Pag-asa.
