Forwarded to this Office for appropriate action, is the herein attached letter of Maria Carla Larrazabal-Licayan, Local Legislative Staff Officer V, Chief, Legislative Committees Division, dated 09 November 2016 referring to this Office Ordinance No. 001 Series of 2016 of Barangay Macasandig.

In this connection, kindly be informed that upon review of the documents submitted, this Office poses no legal objection to the Barangay Ordinance as it is within the scope granted under R.A. 9003 otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000; of which the pertinent provisions are quoted as follows, to wit:

REPUBLIC ACT No. 9003

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE
MANAGEMENT PROGRAM, CREATING THE NECESSARY
INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISMS AND INCENTIVES, DECLARING
CERTAIN ACTS PROHIBITED AND PROVIDING PENALTIES,
APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

x X x

Section 10. Role of LGUs in Solid Waste Management. -

Pursuant to the relevant provisions of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code, the LGUs shall be primarily responsible for the implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this Act within their respective jurisdictions.

Segregation and collection of solid waste shall be conducted at the barangay level specifically for biodegradable, compostable and reusable wastes: Provided, That the collection of non-recyclable materials and special wastes shall be the responsibility of the municipality or city.

x X x

Section 32. Establishment of LGU Materials Recovery Facility. - There shall be established a Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) in every barangay or cluster of barangays. The facility shall be established in a barangay-owned or leased land or any suitable open space to be determined by the barangay through its Sanggunian. For this purpose, the barangay or cluster of barangays shall allocate a certain parcel of land for the MRF. The determination of site and actual establishment of the facility shall likewise be subject to the guidelines and criteria set pursuant to this Act. The MRF shall receive mixed waste for final sorting, segregation, composting, and recycling. The resulting residual wastes shall be transferred to a long-term storage or disposal facility or sanitary landfill.

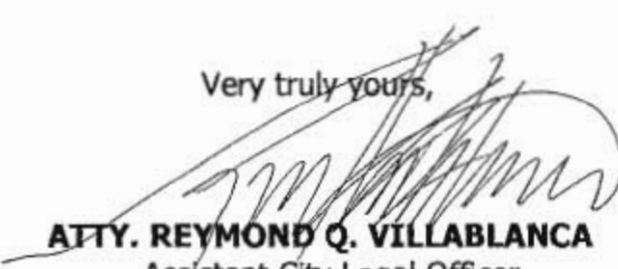
Section 44. Establishment of Common Waste Treatment and Disposal Facilities. - Pursuant to Sec. 33 of R.A. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code, all provinces cities, municipalities and barangays, through appropriate ordinances, are hereby mandated to consolidate, or coordinate their efforts, services, and resources for purposes of jointly addressing common solid waste management problems and/or establishing common waste disposal facilities. The Department, the Commission and local solid waste management boards shall provide technical and marketing assistance to the LGUs.

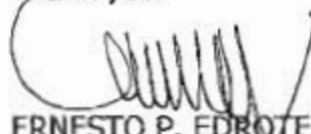

A BARANGAY ORDINANCE ON MANDATORY WASTE SEGREGATION, IMPLEMENTING SORT AT SOURCE, AT THE HOUSEHOLD LEVEL AND OR AT THE RE-ESTABLISHED MRF, A FINAL WASTE SEGREGATION STATION LOCATED AT KALA-KALA WITH ITS RESIDUAL IS BROUGHT TO THE CITY LANDFILL DUMPING SITE AND TO REIMPOSE THE COLLECTION OF MONTHLY GARBAGE FEE PER HOUSEHOLD AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS AS STIPULATED IN SECTION 15 OF THE APPROVED BARANGAY REVENUE CODE 004-SERIES 2008.

Whereas, there is a mandatory requirement of implementing the RA 9003 known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, the National Solid Waste Management Commission (NSWMC) through the Environment Management Bureau to be complied by all Local Governments Units;

Whereas, Section 10 of the Act, segregation and collection of solid waste shall be conducted by the household and barangay levels specifically for biodegradable and reusable wastes, provided that the collection of non-recyclable (residuals) shall be the responsibility of the City or Barangay Government;

Whereas, Barangay Macasandig has re-established the MRF –Material Recovery Facility, a final waste segregation station at Kala-Kala and is now operational coupled with the program on Door-to-Door garbage Collection in all areas of Barangay Macasandig.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Barangay Council of Barangay Macasandig in its 68th regular session duly assembled that;

SECTION 1: TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as ORDINANCE ON MANDATORY WASTE SEGREGATION, IMPLEMENTING SORT AT SOURCE AT THE HOUSEHOLD LEVEL AND OR AT THE RE-ESTABLISHED MRF, A FINAL WASTE SEGREGATION STATION LOCATED AT KALA-KALA WITH ITS RESIDUAL IS BROUGHT TO THE CITY LANDFILL DUMPING SITE AND TO REIMPOSE THE COLLECTION OF MONTHLY GARBAGE FEE PER HOUSEHOLD AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS AS STIPULATED IN SECTION 15 OF THE APPROVED BARANGAY REVENUE CODE 004-SERIES 2008.

SECTION 2: SEGREGATION/SORT AT SOURCE

- a) All houses, business establishments, offices and other institutions are required to sort/segregate waste materials from their level before disposing and be collected by the garbage collectors.
- b) Household to strictly observe time of disposal, No hanging of garbage to prevent being strewn by scavengers and animals.
- c) Fliers and Leaflets informing all households to do segregation at their levels, collecting schedules; time of the day and strictly implementing "No Segregation, No Collection" policy, will be distributed.

- d) The Barangay shall undertake short seminar/lecture on Proper Waste Disposal to focus on Waste Segregation by sitios/subdivisions/Homeowners Asso. or group of residents.

SECTION 3: COLLECTION: DOOR TO DOOR GARBAGE COLLECTION WITH "NO SEGREGATION NO COLLECTION" policy.

There shall be one permanent Staff assigned to supervise/guide all collectors in the operation of Door-to-door collections and segregation at MRF.

The 2 dumptrucks must be manned with 3 to 4 persons; 1 Driver with 2 to 3 helpers. These 2 dumptrucks are assigned to collect garbage at the main streets: Dump Truck 1: Tomas Saco to Upper St. Ignatius, Tibasak, Tambo, Biasong and Box 1/Elena Homes. Dump Truck 2: Aluba-Mandumol Road to Sta. Cruz and Buena Oro junction to Mandumol, Aluba, Sta. Cruz and Buena Oro.

Each Cargorelas must be manned with 1 driver and 1 helper: These 3 Relas are assigned to collect garbage in all inroads and iskillitas which the big trucks can not penetrate.

There shall be a regular/standard collection in every area; time/day. All main roads shall be collected daily; Monday to Sunday.

SECTION 4: FINAL SEGREGATION AT MRF

- a) All collected garbage are brought directly to MRF. Persons assigned to each vehicle shall conduct immediate and final segregation: Recyclables, Reusable shall be put in proper places and the remaining residuals shall be loaded back to the trucks to be brought to the City Landfill dumping site in Upper Dagong, Carmen this City.
- b) All Recyclable materials; plastic, cartons, papers, pieces of steel/iron/metal/aluminum, are separately placed and store at designated area for easier disposal.
- c) There shall be a proper monitoring and record keeping of total number of kilos collected per vehicle, total number of kilos of segregated waste per compartment.

SECTION 5: APPROPRIATIONS

The Sangguni-ang Barangay of Barangay Macasandig has appropriated the amount of 2 MILLION PESOS every year to cover expenses of the following:

15 Garbage Collectors at P 121,000 per month	x 12	=	P 1,452,000.00
Diesel Fuel of 2 dump Trucks at P 16,000 per month	X12		192,000.00

SECTION 6: PENALTY

Any person, natural or judicial, found violating any of the provisions of this Code shall be penalized with a fine of not less than P 500.00 but not more than P1,000.00.

SECTION 7: SEPARABILITY

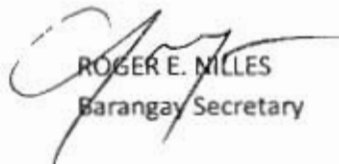
If for whatever reason, any provision of the Ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof not so affected shall continue in full force and effect.

ISSUE PAPER

- Subject:** Prevalent problems on messy, unsecured wires and cables around the city of Cagayan de Oro
- Initial Solution:** Cleaning-up/bundling of wires and cables along the streets of Cagayan de Oro
- Participants:** Spearheaded by NTC10, ICT Task Force on Cables and Wires was established in December 2002. Cepalco as well as the telecommunications and cable TV companies have volunteered in providing the manpower requirement in cleaning up the wires and cables along the streets in Cagayan de Oro.
- Significant Results:**
1. ICT Task Force was created with NTC-10 as the overall coordinator;
 2. Implemented the project with minimal fund mostly for snacks , uniforms, hard hats and working globes;
 3. Wires and Cables along the following streets were cleaned and secured, These areas are:
 - a. Velez Street,
 - b. Coralles Street,
 - c. Tomas Saco,
 - d. Masterson Avenue,
 - e. 12th & 21st Streets, Nazareth;
 - f. Divisoria;
 - g. Part of Burgos & Capistrano;
 - h. Ysalina Bridge, and
 - i. Vamenta Blvd, Carmen;
 - j. Some areas in Nazareth/Macasandig
 4. Customized bracket are manufactured by CEPALCO;
 5. Concept was replicated by a number of Cities in the country;
 6. Passage of an Ordinance on Structured Cabling in Cagayan de Oro; and
 7. Received Commendations from various government and non-government organizations.
- Present status:**
1. Ordinance is not being implemented;
 2. New wires and cables were seen hanging on the previously cleaned and secured lines along the streets;
 3. Multiple posts are still around;
 4. Many business establishments in the City are asking to clean the messy wires in their premises; and

5. Others

Initial Conclusion:

The cleaning of wires and cables along the streets **are just interim solution**. The presence of new hanging wires along the streets that were previously cleaned, *are clear indication of failure*. The non-implementation of the ordinance leads to resurrection of messy, sagging and un-secured wires. Thus, there is a need to assess the following:

- 1) Whether the ordinance needs to be amended;
- 2) Whether the City Engineer is aware about their role in the implementing the Ordinance; and
- 3) Whether there is a need to reconvene the Task Force or Establish a Committee to be created by the City Council or by the City Chief Executive Officer.

Some Recommended interventions:

Alternative No 1 (Using Fiscal Policies):

1. Impose higher tax or penalty on users of messy wires and cables that are hanging on streets;
2. Telcos and other users would be given a certain period to clean their messy wires and cables using a specific standard. Non-compliant would be required to pay higher tax. Tax or penalty collected could be used to clean the wires and cables;
3. Classify streets that can be allowed to use poles (aerial cabling) and streets that should be free from hanging wires and cables (aerial cables). Aerial cables on restricted streets would be subjected to higher than usual tax or penalty; and
4. Other methods.

Alternative No 2 (Using Infrastructure Policies as recommended by Councilor President Elipe):

1. Abandon the existing City Ordinance and come out with a new one;
2. Establishment of a customized ring (from a previous bracket system) and to be assigned to a specific telecom provider;
3. Identify an area where ring method will be implemented. And subsequently orders telecom providers to transfer and attach their wires to the assigned ring. Thereafter, all wires that are not complaint will be forcefully remove.
4. Multiple poles won't be allowed. And initially, all un-necessary poles in an identified area will be removed. Removed poles will be either transferred to areas or be bought and sold in order to compensate the owners of the poles.

Alternative No 3 (Strict Implementation of JPA (Joint Pole Agreement) between the pole owners and users) – Private party participation

1. Encourage CEPALCO to order pole users to strictly comply with the provisions of JPA. Non-compliant would result to detachment of wires and cable owners on poles.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. _____ 2016

**SUBJECT: IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING
THE INSTALLATION AND CONSTRUCTION OF POLES
AND ATTACHMENTS ON OVERHEAD LINES WHICH
INCLUDE POWER, TELECOMMUNICATIONS, AND
CABLES ALONG MAJOR THOROUGHFARES AND
SUBURBS WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF
THE CITY OF CAGAYAN DE ORO**

Pursuant to City Ordinance No. 12130-2011 enacted on September 13, 2011, the following rules and regulations governing the installation and construction of poles and attachments on overhead lines which include power, telecommunications, and cables along major thoroughfares and suburbs within the territorial jurisdiction of the City of Cagayan de Oro, are hereby promulgated:

1. PURPOSE

The primary purpose of this Executive Order is promulgated for the following purposes:

- 1.1 To adopt the challenges brought about by modernization and development particularly on electrical power, telecommunications and cable industries in the City of Cagayan de Oro;
- 1.2 To improve and prescribe standards in the installation of electrical power, telecommunications and cable lines in accordance with the existing standards;
- 1.3 To provide the City populace an ambience of internationally accepted designs and specifications regarding electrical power, telecommunications, and cable lines within the major thoroughfares and suburbs of the City;

1.4 To maintain at all times an orderly and properly marked cables and any other lines installed overhead to avoid accidents and obstructions to all kinds of traffic; and

1.5 To project a City Government that is internationally competitive and capable of attracting more investments and sustaining development in the midst.

2. COVERAGE

This Executive Order shall find application to all electrical power, telecommunications and cables along the major thoroughfares and suburbs within the City of Cagayan de Oro.

3. DEFINITION OF TERMS

3.1 Cables – pertains to the supply of television, data and satellite cable facilities;

3.2 Construction – all works including excavation, erection and embedding of pole structures, line hardware and accessories;

3.3 D.P. – refers to distribution points or distribution box;

3.4 Dominant pole owner – refers to the owner of the pole selected by the affected public utilities which has the capacity to meet the technical requirements of said utilities, with respect to loading capacity including other appurtenance of telecommunications carriers such as but not limited to alley arms, guying, extension arms distribution points (DP) and other accessories;

3.5 Drop wire/multiple wire/dangling wire and cable wire – refers to all wires used as service entrance wire for power, telephone, data and cable network;

3.6 Idle poles – refer to all poles installed and serving no purpose;

3.7 Improper connections - refer to any connection not in conformity to the standards of the Philippine Electrical Code;

3.8 Installation - all works involving fastening attachments, connections and lay-out of overhead lines and accessories;

3.9 Joint Pole Agreement - an agreement between the dominant pole owner and the player using the said pole;

3.10 Juridical person - refers to corporations, institution and entities engaged in the business mentioned in this Executive Order;

3.11 Major thoroughfares - pertains to main roads, avenues and highways;

3.12 Line wires - these are duplex wires used as service drop wire for telephones;

3.13 Nuisance - pertains to any act, omission, establishment, condition of property, or anything else which injures or endangers the health or safety of others;

3.14 Overhead lines - all kinds of wires and cables installed overhead;

3.15 Overhead line accessories - refer to all kinds of pole hardware used for carrying, fastening, stringing, guying, connecting and attachments of overhead lines and cables;

3.16 Pole - refers to all kinds of poles used as structure, support and attachment for all kinds of overhead lines, cables and accessories;

3.17 Power - pertains to electrical power supplier or distributor;

3.18 Splice joints - refer to connection joints;

3.19 Suburbs - pertains to streets, access roads and "eskinitas";

3.20 Sub-standard structures - any pole structure and accessories not in conformity with the standards of the Philippine Electrical Code and Philippine Electronics Code;

3.21 Tap-Off point - refers to connection point/box for cable networks;

3.22 Telecommunications – pertain to the supply of telephone equipment and communication lines, and

3.23 Wires – refer to electrical and telecommunication wires.

4. GENERAL PROVISION

It shall be unlawful for any electrical power supplier, telecommunication company, or cable network or any persons to:

4.1 Install, erect or construct telephone posts, electric posts, telecommunications posts and the like without securing a permit from the City Engineer and approved by the City Mayor, or from the Department of Public Works & Highways (for national highways) as the case may be;

4.2 Install a pole in any particular location along major thoroughfares and suburbs within the territorial jurisdiction of the City of Cagayan de Oro, where a pole is already existing, or install two (2) or more poles, unless it is necessary and with prior express approval from the City Engineer's Office;

4.3 Install line/drop wires exceeding 100 meters from the last DP of Tap Off Point in the Central Business District (CBD);

4.4 Install cables, wires and accessories below 15 feet above the ground;

4.5 Install unmarked telecommunication wires and cables or temporary wires and cables without permission and agreement of removal after use;

4.6 Install dangling, loose, untied wires and cables;

4.7 Install improper connections, splices joints and other termination works not in conformity with existing standards of the industry;

4.8 Retain idle poles, wires and cables and other overhead line accessories without further use; and

4.9 Digging and excavating in streets for purposes of laying electric wires, telecommunication and television cables without securing a permit from the

City Engineer's Office and approved by the City Mayor of from the Department of Public Works & Highways as the case may be.

5. OPERATING GUIDELINES

The following shall be observed in the implementation of this Executive Order:

5.1 JOINT POLE AGREEMENT – major players of this Executive Order shall undertake a Joint Pole Agreement which shall be headed by the power supplier or any entity as agreed upon by the players as the dominant pole owner. The dominant pole owner shall accommodate all the authorized players and to charge certain amount as they may agree upon in the use of the major supplier's pole.

5.2 REMOVAL OF NUISANCE AND SUB-STANDARD STRUCTURES – by virtue of this Executive Order, any structures and accessories that are not removed after the lapse of sixty (60) days from receipt of written notice, or such period required by the City Building Office, shall be removed by the Office of the City Public Services and the cost incurred of the removal shall be charged to the owner of the said structure.

5.3 INSTALLATION OF CABLES, ATTACHMENTS AND ACCESSORIES ON POLES – in order to ensure safety, orderliness and cleanliness, the installation of cables, attachment and accessories on any pole, shall conform with the Philippine Electrical Code, City Ordinance No. 12130-2011, and the electric utility's installation standards or guidelines as stipulated in their Joint Pole Agreement.

5.4 INSTALLATION OF POLES – only one pole shall be erected at a certain location and all other pole users shall share in the use of this pole.

5.4.1 Right of first refusal to the electric distribution franchise to erect a pole. As the franchisee with obligation to serve the electric power needs of the public, it is given the right of first refusal to erect or install poles, towers, support structures along public roads, bridges and other public places.

5.4.2 In the event the electric distribution franchisee fails or refuses to install the pole within 30 days from written notice from Office of the Building Official (OBO), the OBO may grant authority in writing to other persons or entities for it to be allowed to install a pole, provided that in any case such installation shall be subject to certain specifications and requirements to be prescribed by the OBO.

5.4.3 The Office of the Building Official shall find ways and means to eliminate existing multiple poles within the City.

Multiple poles refer to the installation or existing of two or more poles situated within forty (40) meters from each other, provided that in extreme and justifiable situations the City Engineer's Office may grant in writing such installation.

6. PERMIT AND APPLICATIONS

6.1 No entity or person shall commence the installation, erection or construction of telephone posts, electric posts, telecommunication posts and the likes without a valid PERMIT issued by the City Engineer's Office and approved by the City Mayor.

6.2 An application for PERMIT may be filed with the City Engineer's Office with the accompanying documents and requirements in compliance with City Ordinance No. 12130-2011:

6.2.1 Duly certified true copy of SEC Registration Certificate and the Articles of Incorporation or DTI Registration Certificate and Business Permit from the City Government indicating that the entity is engaged in providing power, or telecommunications, or cable television and/or internet/data services.

6.2.2 In case of Telecommunications Provider, a certified true copy of a Congressional Franchise, Certificate of Public Convenience and/or Provisional Authority issued by the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC).

6.2.3 In case of Cable Television Provider (CATV), a certified true copy of a Certificate of Authority (PA) or Provisional

Authority (PA) issued by the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC).

6.2.4 Engineering Plan duly signed and sealed by Professional Electronics Engineer (PECE) in case of telecommunications, cable television (CATV) and internet/data services.

6.2.5 Engineering Plan duly signed and sealed by Professional Electrical Engineer (PEE) in case of power services.

6.3 The following are the fees and charges:

Filing Fee	Php 150.00 (?)
Permit Fee	1,000.00 (?)
Inspection Fee	800.00 (?)

6.4 Non-payment of any of the required fees shall be a ground for the denial, disapproval, suspension and revocation of permits.

7. VALIDITY OF PERMIT

A permit shall be valid for one (1) year from the time of issuance and may be extended upon written justification and approval by the City Mayor.

8. INSPECTION, MONITORING AND REMOVAL ON NON-COMPLIANT STRUCTURES AND ACCESSORIES

8.1 The Office of the Building Official of the City shall conduct periodic inspection to monitor compliance of the permittee and if found to be non-compliant, issue a notice of violation.

8.2 The Office of the City Administrator shall accept, hear and evaluate appeals and submit recommendation to the City Mayor.

8.3 The Office of the City Public Services shall remove any electrical, telecommunications and cable structures and accessories that are considered nuisance and sub-standard and shall charge the cost to the account of the owner(s) of said structure and accessories.

9. PENAL PROVISIONS/ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTIONS

The following penalties shall be imposed on any or all violations of this Executive Order:

9.1 For First Offense – any person who violates this Order for the first time shall be fined the amount of Php3,000.00 and or imprisonment of one (1) month or both at the discretion of the proper court;

9.2 For Second Offense – any person who violates this Order for the Second time shall be fined the amount of Php4,000.00 and or imprisonment of six (6) months or both at the discretion of the proper court;

9.3 For Third and Subsequent Offense – any person who violate this Order for the Third and subsequent time shall be fined the amount of Php5,000.00 and or imprisonment of one (1) year and the absolute perpetual disqualification to indulge in public utilities' business as embodied in this Order or all of these penalties shall be imposed at the discretion of the proper court; In case of Juridical persons, the latter is under obligation to notify its employees about the violations and penalties imposed under this Order.

If violation is committed by partnership, corporation, association or firm, or other juridical entity including government owned or controlled corporation, the penalty shall be imposed on the president, general manager and each of the officers of these entities. In addition, the penalty shall be imposed on any worker or personnel of these entities who are directly involved in the violation.

10. REMEDIES AND APPEAL

10.1 In addition to other remedies cited herein or otherwise provided by the Local Ordinance of this City, this Order maybe enforced by the issuance of Notice of Violation(s) to the owner(s) of the aforesaid structures found to be in violation of this Order.

10.2 The City/Dominant Pole Owner may recover any civil penalty associated with this Order within the prescribed number of hours after issuing a citation or Notice of Violations. Failure to pay a penalty may be subject the owner(s) to civil action to recover the damages if the penalty is not paid in the prescribed time.

10.3 The issuance of a Notice of Violation and the assessment of a penalty maybe appealed to the Office of the City Mayor through the City Administrator. The appeal must be made in writing to the City Mayor through the City Administrator within thirty (30) days upon receipt of the notice.

10.4 Such appeal shall be heard by the City Administrator within Thirty (30) days of the filing of the appeal and the assessment of penalties shall be stayed pending the result of the appeal. The stay on the running of the penalty shall begin on the day on which an appeal is filed with the City Mayor through the City Administrator.

10. REPEALING CLAUSE

Any order, memorandum, circular or parts therefor inconsistent with the provisions of this order shall be deemed amended or superseded accordingly.

11. EFFECTIVITY

This Order shall take effect fifteen (15) days after publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Cagayan de Oro and posting of the same in conspicuous places of the City.

ORDINANCE NO. 12130-2011

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE INSTALLATION AND CONSTRUCTION OF POLES AND ATTACHMENTS ON OVERHEAD LINES WHICH INCLUDE POWER, TELECOMMUNICATIONS, AND CABLES ALONG MAJOR THOROUGHFARES AND SUBURBS WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE CITY OF CAGAYAN DE ORO

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council (*Sangguniang Panlungsod*) of the City of Cagayan de Oro in session assembled that:

ARTICLE I
TITLE AND SCOPE

SECTION 1. TITLE - This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the Pole Construction Regulation Ordinance of 2011.

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS - As used in this Ordinance the following terms shall mean:

- a) Cables - pertains to the supply of television and satellite cable facilities;
- b) Construction - all works including excavation, erection and embedding of pole structures, line hardware and accessories;
- c) D.P. - refers to distribution points or distribution box;
- d) Dominant pole owner - refers to the owner of the pole selected by the affected public utilities which has the capability to meet the technical requirements of said utilities, with respect to loading capacity including other appurtenances of telecommunications carriers such as but not limited to alley arms, guyings, extension arms distribution points (DP) and other accessories;
- e) Drop wire/multiple wire/dangling wire and cable wire - refers to all wires used as service entrance wire for power, telephone and cable network;
- f) Idle Poles - refers to all poles installed and serving no purpose;
- g) Improper connections - refers to any connection not in conformity to the standards of the Philippine Electrical Code;
- h) Installation - all works involving fastening, attachments, connections and lay-out of overhead lines and accessories;
- i) Joint Pole Agreement - an agreement between the dominant pole owner and the player using the said pole;
- j) Juridical person - refers to corporations, institution and entities engaged in the businesses mentioned in this Ordinance;
- k) Major thoroughfares - pertains to main roads, avenues and highways;
- l) Line wires - these are duplex wires used as service drop wire for telephones;
- m) Nuisance - pertains to any act, omission, establishment, condition of property, or anything else which injures or endangers the health or safety of others;
- n) Overhead lines - all kinds of wires and cables installed overhead;



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- o) Overhead line accessories – refers to all kinds of pole hardware used for carrying, fastening, stringing, guying, connecting and attachments of overhead lines and cables;
- p) Pole – refers to all kinds of poles used as structure, support and attachment for all kinds of overhead lines, cables and accessories;
- q) Power – pertains to electrical power supplier or distributor;
- r) Splice joints – refers to connection joints;
- s) Suburbs – pertains to streets, access roads and “eskinitas”;
- t) Sub-standard structures – any pole structure and accessories not in conformity with the standards of the Philippines Electrical Code and Philippine Electronics Code;
- u) Tap-Off point – refers to connection point/box for cable networks;
- v) Telecommunications – pertains to the supply of telephone equipment and communication lines; and
- w) Wires – refers to electrical and telecommunication wires.

SECTION 3. COVERAGE – This Ordinance shall find - application to all electrical power, telecommunications and cables along the major thoroughfares and suburbs within the City of Cagayan de Oro.

SECTION 4. PURPOSE – This Ordinance is enacted for the following purposes:

- a) To adopt the challenges brought about by modernization and development particularly on electrical power, telecommunications and cable industries in the City of Cagayan de Oro;
- b) To improve and prescribe standards in the installation of electrical power, telecommunications and cable lines in accordance with the existing standards;
- c) To provide our populace an ambience of internationally accepted designs and specifications regarding electrical power, telecommunications, and cable lines within the major thoroughfares and suburbs of the City of Cagayan de Oro;
- d) To maintain at all times an orderly and properly marked cables and any other lines installed overhead to avoid accidents and obstructions to all kinds of traffic; and
- e) To project a City Government that is internationally competitive and capable of attracting more investments and sustaining development in its midst.

**ARTICLE II
REGULATED ACTS**

SECTION 5. PROHIBITIONS. – It shall be unlawful for any electrical power supplier, telecommunication company, or cable network or any other person to:

- a. Install, erect or construct telephone posts, electric posts, telecommunication posts and the like without securing a permit from the City Engineer and approved by the City Mayor, or from the Department of Public Works & Highways (for national highways) as the case may be;
- b. Install a pole in any particular location along major thoroughfares and suburbs within the territorial jurisdiction of the City of Cagayan de Oro, where a pole is already existing, or install two (2) or more pole, unless it is necessary and with prior express within approval from the City Engineer's Office;



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- c. Install line/drop wires exceeding 100 meters from the last DP of Tap Off Point in the Central Business District (CBD);
- d. Install cables, wires and accessories below 15 feet above the ground;
- e. Install multiple line/drop wire serving the same building that has a provision for telecommunications and cable lines;
- f. Install unmarked telecommunication wires and cables or temporary wires and cables without permission and agreement of removal after use;
- g. Install dangling, loose, untied wires and cables;
- h. Install improper connections, splices joints and other termination works not in conformity with existing standards of the industry;
- i. Retain idle poles, wires and cables and other overhead line accessories without further use; and
- j. Digging and excavating in streets for purposes of laying electric wires, telecommunication and television cables without securing a permit from the City Engineer's Office and approved by the City Mayor or from Department of Public Works & Highways as the case may be.

**ARTICLE III
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

SECTION 6. GUIDELINES. - The following shall be observed in the implementation of this Ordinance:

- a. **JOINT POLE AGREEMENT** - major players of this Ordinance shall undertake a Joint Pole agreement which shall be headed by the power supplier or any other entity as agreed upon by the players as the dominant pole owner. The dominant pole owner shall accommodate all the authorized players and to charge certain amount as they may agree upon in the use of the major supplier's pole.
- b. **REMOVAL OF NUISANCE AND SUB-STANDARD STRUCTURES** - by virtue of this Ordinance, any structures and accessories that are not removed after the lapse of sixty (60) days from receipt of written notice, or such period required by the City Building Office, shall be removed by the Office of the City Public Services and the cost incurred of the removal shall be charged to the owner of said structures.

SECTION 7. INSTALLATION OF CABLES, ATTACHMENT AND ACCESSORIES ON POLES - In order to ensure safety, orderliness and cleanliness, the installation of cables, attachment and accessories on any pole, shall conform with the Philippines Electrical Code, this ordinance and the electric utility's installation standards or guidelines as stipulated in their Joint Pole Agreement.

SECTION 8. INSTALLATION OF POLES - Only one pole shall be erected at a certain location and all other pole users shall share in the use of this pole.

- a) Right of first refusal to the electric distribution franchisee to erect a pole. As the franchisee with obligation to serve the electric power needs of the public, it is given the right of first refusal to erect or install poles, towers, support structures along public roads, bridges and other public places.
- b) In the event the electric distribution franchisee fails or refuses to install the pole within 30 days from written notice from Office of the Building Official (OBO), the OBO may grant authority in writing to other persons or entities for it to be allowed to install a pole, provided that in any case such installation shall be subject to certain specifications and requirements to be prescribed by the OBO.

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- c) The Office of the Building Official shall find ways and means to eliminate existing multiple poles within the city.

Multiple poles refer to the installation or existence of two or more poles situated within Forty (40) meters from each other, provided that in extreme and justifiable situations the City Engineer's Office may grant in writing such installation.

SECTION 9. IMPLEMENTING AGENCIES - This Ordinance shall be implemented by the following:

- City Engineer's Office - shall accept, evaluate and issue permits and other authorization for the erection of poles and street diggings intended to lay electric, telecommunication wires & cables, except for national and provincial roads which are under the jurisdiction of Department of Public Works & Highways;
- Local Building Official - shall monitor compliance of the permittee and issue notice of violation;
- City Administrator - shall accept, hear and evaluate appeals and submit recommendation to the City Mayor;
- City Public Services Office - shall remove any electrical, telecommunications & cable structures and accessories that are considered nuisance and sub-standard and shall charge the cost to the account of the owner(s) of said structure and accessories.

ARTICLE IV
PENAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 10. PENALTY PROVISION - The following penalties shall be imposed on any or all violators of this Ordinance:

- For First Offense - Any person who violate this Ordinance for the First time shall be fined the amount of ₱3,000.00 and or imprisonment of One (1) month or both at the discretion of the proper court;
- For Second Offense - Any person who violate this Ordinance for the Second time shall be fined the amount of ₱4,000.00 and or imprisonment of Six (6) months or both at the discretion of the proper court;
- For Third and Subsequent Offense - Any person who violate this Ordinance for the third and subsequent time shall be fined the amount of ₱5,000.00 and or imprisonment of One (1) year and the absolute perpetual disqualification to indulge in public utilities' business as embodied in this Ordinance or all of these penalties shall be imposed at the discretion of the proper court; In case of Juridical persons, the latter is under obligation to notify its employees about the violations and penalties imposed under this Ordinance.

If the violation is committed by partnership, corporation, association, firm, or other juridical entity including government owned or controlled corporation, the penalty shall be imposed on the president, general manager and each of the officers of these entities. In addition, the penalty shall also be imposed on any worker or personnel of these entities who are directly involved in the violation.

SECTION 11. REMEDIES -

- In addition to other remedies cited herein or otherwise provided by the Local Ordinance of this City, this Ordinance maybe enforced by the issuance of Notice of Violations to the owner(s) of the aforesaid structures found to be in violation of this Ordinance.
- The City/Dominant Pole Owner may recover any civil penalty associated with this Ordinance within the prescribed number of hours after issuing a citation or Notice for Violations. Failure to pay a penalty may subject the owner(s) to civil action to recover the damages if the penalty is not paid in the prescribed time.



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- c. The issuance of a Notice for a Violation and the assessment of a penalty maybe appealed to the Office of the Mayor through the City Administrator. The appeal must be made in writing to the City Mayor through the City Administrator within Thirty (30) days upon receipt of the notice.
- d. Such appeal shall be heard by the City Administrator within Thirty (30) days of the filing of the appeal and the assessment of penalties shall be stayed pending the result of the appeal. The stay on the running of the penalty shall begin on the day on which an appeal is filed with the City Mayor through the City Administrator.

SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE – The provisions of City Ordinance No. 9013-2003 and other Ordinances, Resolutions, Orders, Rules and Regulations that are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

SECTION 13. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – If any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional and or illegal, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected by such declaration and shall therefore, be in full force and effect.

SECTION 14. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE – This Ordinance shall take effect after fifteen (15) following satisfaction of its required publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Cagayan de Oro and the posting of the same in conspicuous public places of the City.

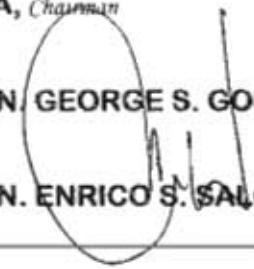

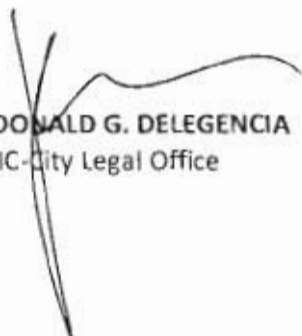

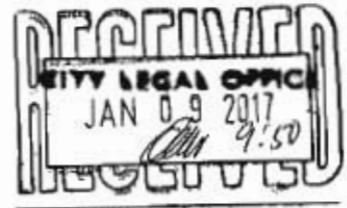

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

The Memorandum of Agreement executed and entered into by and between:

The **DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, REGIONAL FIELD OFFICE 10**, Cagayan de Oro City, represented herein by the OIC-Regional Director, **CARLENE C. COLLADO, CPA**, herein referred to as "**DA RFO 10**";

-and-

The **LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY** with office address at Cagayan de Oro City represented herein by the City Mayor, **HON. OSCAR S. MORENO**, herein referred to as the "**LGU/PROPONENT**";

-WITNESSETH-

WHEREAS, the **DA RFO 10** pursuant to its mandated function of promoting agricultural development through a bottom-up self-reliant farming systems approach that will emphasize equity, productivity and sustainability in the use of agricultural resources is providing integrated services to ensure the increase in the farm productivity as well as farmers income;

WHEREAS, **DA RFO 10** projects and interventions, are vital undertaking in increasing agricultural productivity and the agency also need to secure and install mitigating measures against the unpredictable calamities which will affect the agricultural areas of the region;

WHEREAS, **DA RFO 10** implementation is undertaken in partnership with the Municipal/City Local Government Units with various project components addressing the convergence area and strategic production zones;

WHEREAS, projects and interventions from **DA RFO 10** such as the Machinery Pool for the Quick Response Brigade intended for LGUs will be implemented during calamities and temporarily lend only to affected farmers within and neighboring Cities/Municipalities through the City/Municipal Agriculture Office (CAO/MAO);

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the parties hereto mutually agreed to undertake the project, in accordance with the following terms and conditions;

Section 1. The DA RFO 10 shall:

1. Transfer to **LGU Cagayan de Oro City** the **2 units water pump and engine set with accessories** with an estimated cost of **98,184.38** per unit;
2. Regularly monitor the activities of the **LGU/Proponent** including the operation and maintenance of the equipment;
3. Ensure the installation/trial run/testing and evaluation of the equipment;
4. Provide such other support or assistance as maybe required by the composite teams to ensure the successful implementation of the project;
5. Reserve the right to intervene, institute corrective measures and repossess the equipment when not fully utilized, or properly used and in case of non-compliance of the parties with the stipulations of this Agreement; and
6. Turn -over to the **LGU** the equipment without cost.

Section 2. The LGU/Proponent shall:

1. Take charge as caretaker and temporarily lend the equipment to farmer's organization/ beneficiaries or neighboring Cities/Municipalities during calamity through the City/Municipal Agriculture Office (CAO/MAO);
2. Responsible in shouldering the operating and maintenance cost of the equipment;
3. Where necessary secure all legal documentations e.g. permit to operate from DENR, etc. and shall have full accountability to any problem or issue arising to it;
4. Acknowledge receipt of the equipment and be responsible in its operation and maintenance;
5. Responsible in coming up with the guidelines and policy of operation, operating scheme, cost and strategies that is appropriate to them in consonance to the project objectives. Such will be submitted to DA for concurrence and be part of this agreement;
6. Utilize the equipment in accordance to its intended use, allow access and use by farmers and shall not in any way sell or mortgage the same;
7. Maintain a complete and detailed logbook of the equipment's operation and whenever requested, allow the DA Agencies/line bureaus monitoring team access to the same;
8. Responsible and accountable for the security of the equipment while in their custody and must ensure optimum utilization of the equipment; and
9. Strictly abide and follow the provisions, terms and conditions of the agreement as stipulated in this MOA.

Section 3. Breach of Agreement:

The DA-RFO shall confiscate the equipment from the LGU when:

1. Not properly maintained and utilized for one year;
2. Not settling any problem arising in the use of the equipment for a period of one year;
3. There is a written complaint and any sanction arising from using, coming from the residents nearby and government unit/s; and
4. Not complying with the Memorandum of Agreement.

This agreement shall take effect on the date of the signing hereof of the parties concerned and shall terminate upon the satisfactory fulfillment of the terms and conditions embodied herein. Any modification or amendment shall be mutually agreed in writing by the parties concerned.
