



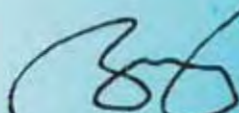

Acebu, for the declaration of its 20-hectare Pueblo Business Park as an Information

Technology (IT) Park, located in Upper Carmen, Cagayan de Oro City, subject to the herein specified conditions, to wit:

- Pueblo de Oro Development Corporation will continue to pay RPT on building or spaces that are leased out to commercial establishments whose activities are "not registrable" with PEZA. These commercial establishments will continue to pay all local government taxes;
- Pueblo de Oro Development Corporation's incentive is limited to the income that will derive from leasing out spaces to PEZA registered IT companies. This particular income thereof will be subject to the special 5% tax on gross income in lieu of all national and local taxes. This 5% tax on gross income will be remitted as follows: 3% to the National Government and 2% directly remitted to the Treasurer's Office of the City of Cagayan de Oro. This means that if Cagayan de Oro Gateway Corporation will not be able to lease out any space to any registered PEZA IT Company, then it cannot avail of this special 5% gross income tax;
- Pueblo de Oro Development Corporation will also pay RPT on machinery, if applicable.

B. ON SPECIAL REPORT

- i. Councilor Reuben Daba announced that the City Council for the Protection for Children will spearhead the month-long National Children's Month celebration, even as he invited his colleagues to support and participate in the various activities lined up to highlight the occasion, among other things.

Action taken: The body noted the report.

- ii. Councilor Ian Mark Q. Nacaya reported about the concerns of some tourism and airline executives about the lack of food outlets in the city offering Halal foods vis-à-vis the foreseen increase of tourists visiting Cagayan de Oro coming from Muslim countries, among other things.

Action taken: The report was referred to the Committees on Economic Enterprises and on Tourism for appropriate action.

- iii. Councilor Teodulfo E. Lao, Jr. reported about the need to constitute the Traffic Management Board by the City Mayor to assist the Roads and Traffic Administration in the crafting of the city's Local Public Transport Route Plan, among others. He also suggested that the City Council expressed its support to Senate Bill No. 1165, entitled: *An Act Requiring Parking Space from Motor Vehicle Buyers in Metropolitan Areas as a Pre-Requisite for the Purchase of a Motor Vehicle and Registration with the Land Transportation Office (LTO)*", as one of the solutions to the traffic congestion caused by the proliferation of vehicles occupying sidewalks and roadsides. He further proposed to request the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB)-Head Office, Metro Manila, to favorably consider the request and petition of taxi drivers in the City to lower the rate of taxi fare in Cagayan de Oro City.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 13219-2017, ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE PRO-FORMA LEASE CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO AND THE STALL AWARDEES OF COGON, CARMEN AND PUERTO PUBLIC MARKETS FOR CY 2017 AND SUBSEQUENT YEARS THEREAFTER; AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AND SIGN THE SAID LEASE CONTRACT", SO AS TO PROVIDE THE COMPOSITION AND FUNCTIONS OF THE CEED-MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (CEED-MANCOM) CREATED AND ORGANIZED THEREIN

BE IT ORDAINED by the 18th City Council (*Sangguniang Panlungsod*) in session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 13219-2017, entitled: "*An Ordinance Approving The Pro-Forma Lease Contract by and Between the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and the Stall Awardees of Cogon, Carmen and Puerto Public Markets for CY 2017 and Subsequent Years Thereafter; and Authorizing the City Mayor to Enter Into and Sign the Said Lease Contract*", is hereby amended by adding therein Sub-Sections 3(A), 3(B) 3(C), 3(D) and 3(E), covering the composition, functions, secretariat, meetings and honorarium, respectively, of the CEED-Management Committee (CEED-ManCom) created and organized therein, to read as follows:

“X-X-X

SECTION 3. *Promulgation of Rules and Regulations, Administration and Enforcement.* - The CEED shall have the primary responsibility for the administration and enforcement of this ordinance. The CEED Management Committee which hereby supersedes the Market Committee shall promulgate the Implementing Rules and Regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance.

‘A. COMPOSITION. – The CEED-Management Committee (CEED-ManCom) shall be composed of the following:

- '1) Chairman (Regular Member) - CEED Manager
- '2) Vice Chairman (Regular Member) - CEED Asst. Manager
- '3) Regular Voting Members:
 - i. Representative from the City Mayor's Office
 - ii. Chairman of the SP Committee on Economic Enterprise
 - iii. City Administrator or his/her representative
 - iv. Legal Officer or his/her representative
 - v. Representative of the Department of Trade & Industry-10
- '4) Regular Non-Voting Members (per specific agenda):
 - i. CEED Component Heads and/or concerned CEED employees.
 - ii. City Finance Task Force on CEED Components.
 - iii. CEED Component Association President or his/her representative.

‘B. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS. - The CEED-ManCom shall exercise the following duties and functions:

- 'a) To conduct the drawing of lots and the opening and canvassing of bids or applications to lease in connection with the adjudication of vacant stalls or rentable spaces on components under CEED.

- 'b) To declare assigned stalls or rentable spaces vacant in cases of default on the part of the winning applicant and those abandoned in violation of City Ordinance No. 13219-2017 constituting the Lease of Contract in effect of market stalls and such others including those provided for under City Ordinance No. 4373-94 and other related local ordinances.
- 'c) To certify to the CEED Manager those applicants for the lease of vacant stalls or rentable spaces who won the bidding and drawing of lots.
- 'd) To recommend to the City Mayor to enter into a memorandum of agreement or other contract or covenant with the vendor's association, any other legitimate association or any private company/individual for the operation and management of any facility within the public markets and other CEED components.
- 'e) To advise the CEED Manager, the City Health Officer and the City Mayor on all matters affecting the management, operation, expansion, improvement and administration, and to advise and recommend to the City Council on matters relating to legislation, affecting all components under CEED control and supervision.
- 'f) To act as liaison between the component stall occupants or space lessees and/or associations and the City Government.
- 'g) To exercise such other duties and functions as may be prescribed by law or ordinance incidental and necessary for public welfare and good governance.

'It shall be the duty of the CEED Manager to implement the recommendation/s of the CEED-ManCom and/or to undertake measures to improve the cleanliness, maintain peace and order, and re-arrangement and distribution of stalls and facilities, and the aesthetic appearance of the public markets and other CEED components.

'C. SECRETARIAT. - The CEED Manager shall identify the members of the Secretariat of the CEED-ManCom.

'D. MEETINGS. - The CEED-ManCom shall meet quarterly or as the need arises.

'E. HONORARIUM. - The chairperson, vice chairperson and regular voting members shall receive honorarium at the rate of ₱1,000.00 and its Secretariat at ₱500.00 per meeting actually attended, subject to accounting and auditing regulations.

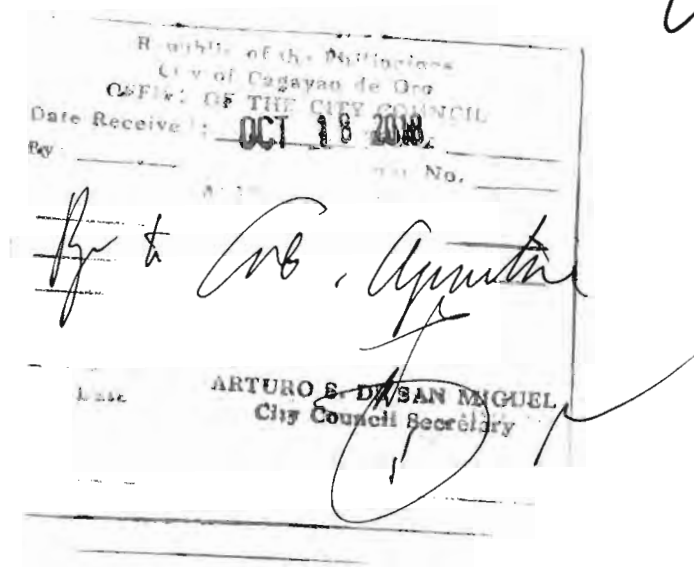

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Agreement entered into by and among:

The **AGRICULTURAL TRAINING INSTITUTE (ATI)**, the extension and training arm of the **Department of Agriculture**, through its **Regional Training Center-X** with official address at El Salvador City, Misamis Oriental represented by its OIC- Center Director, **MARIA LYDIA A. ECHAVEZ** and hereinafter referred to as **ATI**;

The **CITY GOVERNMENT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO**, with official address at City Hall, Capistrano Street, Cagayan De Oro City represented by its City Mayor, **OSCAR S. MORENO** and hereinafter referred to as **City Agriculture Office**;

and

The **CAMAMAN-AN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL**, with official address at Camaman-an, Cagayan De Oro City represented by its Secondary School Head, **ROWENA G. CONCEPCION**, and hereinafter referred to as **CNHS**;

- WITNESSETH -

WHEREAS, **ATI** is the over-all extension and training arm of the Department of Agriculture and is mandated to train agricultural extension workers and their clientele including farmers and their families through appropriate training and extension activities;

WHEREAS, the **ATI** fully recognizes that the number of youth who manifest interest in agriculture and fisheries is dwindling, and that the youth has a very big important role in attaining food security and poverty alleviation in the country;

WHEREAS, the **City Agriculture Office**, is a department of the City Government of Cagayan de Oro, responsible for the provision of appropriate, time tested and technologically sound agricultural practices that promote resource conservation, and protection of the environment and the ecosystem;

WHEREAS, it is the role of the **City Agriculture Office** to encourage and assist the youth of Cagayan de Oro City to engage in agriculture and fishery activities not only on production but also on entrepreneurship;

WHEREAS, the **CNHS** is a public high school with the role of molding the young minds of the students and developing them into responsible citizens of the country;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, **ATI**, **City Agriculture Office**, and the **CNHS**, hereto decided to collaborate in disseminating and creating an environment that would bring back agriculture and urban gardening into the minds and hands of the youth.

ARTICLE I – THE PROJECT

Section 1. Project Title. The Project shall be entitled “*Glamourizing Farming Through Urban Agriculture*”.

Section 2. Implementer. The Project shall be implemented by the ATI, the City Agriculture Office and the Camaman-an National High School;

Section 3. Implementation. The Project shall be implemented within the months of August to December 2018;

Section 4. Modification. Modification of the agreements that is contained herein shall be allowed with the written consent of all **PARTIES** provided that it is jointly agreed.

ARTICLE II – OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

This program envisions the urban youth to engage in urban agriculture by establishing urban gardens and instill 4-H thrusts by organizing 4-H Clubs in their own localities.

ARTICLE III – RESPONSIBILITIES OF EACH PARTY

SECTION 1. *Obligations of ATI*

- a. Provide orientation/seminar, training programs and extension needs of the target beneficiaries;
- b. Provide basic gardening tools, protective equipment, and supplies for gardening;
- c. Provide funds for the graduation ceremony/field day;
- d. Provide follow-up training programs needed by the beneficiaries/students;
- e. Provide PCIC insurance for the participants/students;
- f. Conduct regular monitoring activities.
- g. Produce a process documentation of the program.

SECTION 2. *Obligations of the City Government of Cagayan de Oro*

- a. Initial coordination and identification of the target beneficiaries (barangay/community/school);
- b. Provide one Technical Staff as Focal Person of the program;
- c. Provide Resource Person/Lecturers on the needed subject matters
- d. Encourage participants/students to apply what they have learned in their respective homes or areas;
- e. Document and inform ATI of the activities applied by the participants/students in their respective homes/communities;
- f. Inform ATI of the other training needs of the participants/students;
- g. Conduct regular (weekly) monitoring of the projects.

SECTION 3. *Obligation of the Camaman-an National High School (CNHS), Camaman-an, Cagayan de Oro City*

- a. Identify and allow the target students to participate in the program;
- b. Provide a space/area for demonstration projects of the students, with available water supply that can be used in the project;
- c. Provide other needed materials for the construction of the demonstration garden, such as recyclable materials for gardening;
- d. Provide protection and security to the established projects ;
- e. Require the students to apply what they learned in their individual homes/communities;
- f. Conduct regular monitoring of the projects of the students;
- g. Assist the students in maintaining and sustaining the projects;
- h. Inform ATI of the training needs of the students to sustain the program
- i. Provide a weekly report to City Agriculture.

ARTICLE IV – PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect unless sooner terminated by mutual consent of all parties, provided a ten (10) working days written notice by any of the parties shall have been fully served to other Parties.

ARTICLE V

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Section 1.** This agreement and all rights and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by either of the parties hereto to another party unless otherwise permitted in the provision of this agreement or with the prior written consent thereto by the other parties.
- Section 2.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof and there are no understanding, representations or warranties of any kind except this expressly set forth herein.
- Section 3.** This agreement does not create an employer/employee relationship between the City Agriculture Office, its employees, agents or sub-contractors; ATI, its employees, staff and coordinators; and Camaman-an National High School (CNHS), its teachers, participants and students.
- Section 4.** The regular courts or competent quasi-judicial bodies of Cagayan de Oro City shall have the exclusive jurisdiction over any disputes and/or claims arising thereto.

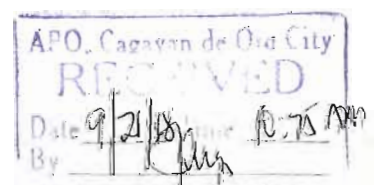
2. Article V. Section 3.

Thus, should the City Government find the terms and conditions in the Memorandum of Agreement amenable and for the best interests of the City Government, and assuming that the City can fully comply with it, then this Office recommends that the Memorandum of Agreement be duly forwarded to the Honorable Members of the City Council for their favorable consideration, with a request for an Ordinance authorizing the City Mayor to enter into and sign the same, pursuant to Sec. 455 (1) (vi)¹ of the Local Government Code.

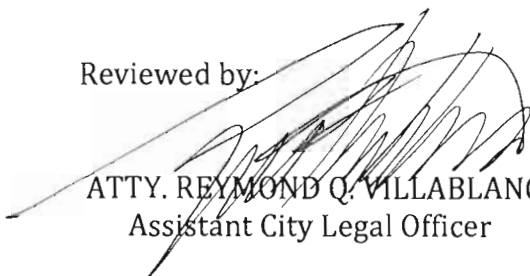

THE PUBLIC IS INFORMED:

This Agreement is executed between:

Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO), a government owned and controlled corporation, existing by virtue of Republic Act No. 1169, as amended by Batas Pambansa Blg. 42, holding office at 4F Sun Plaza Building, 1507 Shaw Boulevard corner Princeton Street, Mandaluyong City, represented by its General Manager, Alexander F. Balutan, authorized for this purpose under PCSO Board Resolution No. 382, series of 2015, as contained in the Secretary's Certificate subscribed on 6 October 2015, a copy of which is attached as "Annex A;"

-AND-

_____ (Chartered City), a local government unit existing under Philippine law, with principal office at _____, represented by its Mayor _____, as authorized in _____ Resolution No. _____ a copy of which is attached as Annex "B."

ANTECEDENTS:

The PCSO, under the Office of the President, is the principal government agency for raising and providing funds for health programs, medical assistance and services and charities of national character through the conduct of sweepstakes races, lotteries and other similar activities;

The **Chartered City** is recognized as a vital instrument in providing the needed basic medical services to its constituents;

In pursuit of its mandate and directives of the President of the Philippines, the PCSO is committed to raise revenues for the government through the Small Town Lottery (STL). The STL shall be the only legal and authorized numbers game nationwide and for this purpose, the PCSO shall strictly implement the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) for STL, a copy of which is made an integral part of this Agreement as Annex "C";

Accordingly, the parties have agreed as follows:

1. The PCSO Board launched the nationwide market expansion of the STL operations in other provinces and cities to maximize sales potential of the STL in the country, to increase charity fund generation of the PCSO, to increase BIR contribution, to increase shares of the LGU and PNP, and to combat illegal numbers game in provinces where there is no STL operations. To this end, the PCSO needs the

cooperation of the **Chartered City** for its successful implementation within its jurisdiction,

2. The Chartered City commits to give its full support and cooperation in PCSO's STL operations by recognizing PCSO's Authorized Agent Corporations (AACs) as extensions of PCSO in the implementation of the STL, provided that such AAC shall adhere strictly of the conditions of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) which shall form part of this Agreement.

Moreover, in order to distinguish STL Outlets of AACs apart from illegal ones, PCSO shall enjoin the ACC to require its Outlets to secure a Mayor's Permit.

3. The PCSO shall

- a. Allocated from the Charity Fund, in favor of the Chartered City where STL tickets are sold.

i. Medical / Dental Missions	iv. Procurement of medical supplies/equipment
ii. Medicine Donation	v. Milk feeding / nutrition program
iii. Hospitalization Assistance	vi. Calamity assistance

- c. Submit every six (6) months to PCSO Internal Audit Services (IAS) a Fund Utilization Report with statement of receipt, as verified by the Commission on Audit (COA)
- d. Report to PCSO or any of its offices or branches, any STL AAC or any of its officers of employees, or any person, who attempts or offers to give, deliver, remit, grant, pay or contribute any money, cash or anything of value or consideration, directly or indirectly, to any public office in the provincial government, officer or employee, in consideration for, by reason of, or otherwise related to the conduct of STL operations.
5. This agreement shall be effective upon signing by the Parties and shall be in full force during the effectivity of the STL Agency Agreement of the AAC within its jurisdiction, subject to renewal, whenever applicable. Notwithstanding the condition stipulated under paragraph 3 (e) of this Agreement.
6. It is hereby understood however that in case of violation of any of the provisions of this agreement, the same may be rescinded or terminated in writing by any of the parties.
7. If this agreements is terminated for whatever cause and for violation of any of the provisions here, any rights and obligations of any party, which have arisen on or before such termination, shall remain unaffected.
8. If any section, paragraph, clause, phrase or provision of this agreement shall be rules invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of this agreement as a whole or any part of its provisions, other than that so judged to be invalid or unconstitutional.
9. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties relating to the subject matter. Any revisions, amendments or modifications shall be made only in writing upon mutual agreement by the parties.

ORDINANCE NO. 11075-2008

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE INSTALLATION OF CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION (CCTV) OR VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM IN THE PREMISES OF PRIVATE ESTABLISHMENTS AND PUBLIC PLACES, PROVIDING PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Whereas, crime syndicates nowadays have become daring in their operations, often using high-powered firearms in their heists;

Whereas, new technologies have been designed to address problems of this nature and has in fact been used by other cities nationwide;

Whereas, with the use of video cameras in and outside of establishments, they can record all persons coming in and out of their premises and monitor the goings-on inside;

Whereas, with the use of CCTVs, police investigators would have easier time piecing together information about the suspects, and experiences of successful solutions of crimes in other cities have been acknowledge;

Whereas, the CCTV equipment would deter robberies and aid the police in their investigations;

Now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council (*Sangguniang Panlungsod*) of the City of Cagayan de Oro in session assembled that:

SECTION 1. - TITLE. – This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the CCTV Installation Ordinance of 2008.

SECTION 2. - OBJECTIVES. – This Ordinance aims:

- A. To provide a deterrent to crimes and vandalism.
- B. To enable clear identification of miscreants within the range of the cameras.
- C. To provide continuous recording of all cameras in the system.
- D. As a tool for early solution in identifying the perpetrators of crimes.

SECTION 3. - DEFINITION OF TERMS. – The definitions and provisions contained in this section shall govern the construction, meaning, and application of the following words and phrases used in this Ordinance.

- A. “Bank” means an establishment whose primary function is related to the custody, loan, exchange, issuance of money, extension of credit, or transmission of funds.
- B. “Shopping Mall” means a building or series of buildings containing a mix of four (4) or more commercial establishments in a single development or on a single parcel.
- C. “Video Surveillance System” means a digital surveillance system including cameras, cabling, monitors, and digital video recorders (DVR) that records in color with cameras and lens of a type, minimum resolution, number and location approved by the City Police Director or his/her designee. This system must be capable of producing a retrievable and identifiable images and video recordings on approved media that can be enlarged through projection or other means, and can be made a permanent record for use in a criminal investigation. It shall also include



without limitation any closed circuit video cameras (CCTV) or other cameras, video recorders, digital cameras [or], digital recorders or other technological devices used in the above manner.

- D. "Feeds". The visual information transmitted by the CCTV Cameras.
- E. "Monitors". The screen or other devices on which the Feeds are viewed.
- F. "Schools" refers to secondary schools, colleges and universities with 1,000 or more student population.

SECTION 4. - VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SYSTEMS REQUIREMENT -

- (A) Every bank, department store, shopping mall, secondary school, college and university, gasoline station, pawnshop, lending institution, convenience store and all similar establishments that are open for more than twelve (12) hours a day is hereby required to install a Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) or video surveillance system.
- (B) The City Government and concerned national agencies shall likewise install Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) in public buildings or places where the public frequently converge like markets, terminals, plazas or parks, main thoroughfares or in the entrance and exit points of the City as maybe recommended by the City Police Director.
- (C) Such establishments or government agencies, which installed surveillance systems prior to the effective date of this ordinance, shall ensure they are in full compliance with this Ordinance.
- (D) The video surveillance systems shall be maintained in proper working order at all times and shall be in operation at least during office hours and at the option of the owner 24 hours, seven (7) days a week, and shall meet the minimum technological standards established in this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. - FEEDS; VIDEO RECORDINGS. - The establishment shall retain the continuous digital images recorded by this system for no less than thirty (30) days for review and reference purposes. After 30 days, the feeds or recordings would be destroyed unless their preservation is required by a court order, the local police, National Bureau of Investigation (NBI), Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG), Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) or the city mayor.

SECTION 6. - ACCESS TO RECORDINGS. - If a crime occurs or an employee believes a crime has occurred, the business establishment shall contact the Cagayan de Oro City Police Office immediately and it shall provide immediate access to the media or CCTV/video recordings containing the recorded event to the police and investigators. Only the investigators and those authorized by the City Police Director, however, shall be allowed to view the video footages.

SECTION 7. - PROHIBITION. - It shall be unlawful for any person to allow the unauthorized or unofficial use or viewing of any saved video-recording and the unauthorized public identification of any person or client seen in the video. The same shall not in any manner be used to infringe with the privacy of individuals, and those found in violation shall be prosecuted for laws violating the right to privacy.

SECTION 8. - PROPER REQUEST FOR FEEDS. - The Feeds may be used at any time to satisfy the written order of any court of competent jurisdiction or any authorized subpoena.

SECTION 9. - NO BROADCASTING. - Subject to Section 6 above, the Feeds shall not be 1) broadcast by the establishment on or through any medium other than the Monitors; 2) viewed by any persons other than employees who are authorized to view the Monitors; 3) transferred to any third

party, whether for profit or not; or 4) recorded or otherwise stored except in accordance with this Ordinance.

SECTION 10. - MINIMUM TECHNOLOGICAL STANDARDS. - The CCTV or video surveillance system must be capable of delineating on playback of the system the activity and physical features of persons or areas within the premises and must be able to record such images on an approved form of media.

For this purpose, it shall have at least met the following specifications:

- a) Have one dedicated channel for each camera in operation;
- b) Shall record at least 640 x 480 recording resolution level;
- c) Shall have the capacity to record at fifteen frames per second, per camera. For example, a system with 10 cameras would need to have a DVR capable of recording at least 150 frames per second.
- d) Shall have enough memory to retain data from all cameras for a period of thirty (30) days. One estimate has been provided that this would equal approximately 40 GB of hard drive memory per camera.
- e) Possess the ability to view and retrieve data while the system remains in operation.
- f) Posses the ability to time stamp and "watermark" the recorded images.
- g) Possess the ability to produce DVD-R copy of desired data for evidentiary purposes in a format playable via Windows Media Player to a standard DVD player.
- h) Shall be places in a locked and secured location to prevent destruction or tampering.

Cameras

- i) Operate with a minimum of 480 Total Vertical Lines (TVL) of resolution.
- j) Shall have the ability to record color images during sufficient lighting and record in black and white during hours of low light.
- k) Each camera shall be matched to each specific application taking into consideration:
 - i. Distance to target image
 - ii. "Lux rating" or compatibility with the amount of light available to include excessive amounts of sunlight.
 - iii. View angle of camera in relation to area of o desired coverage.
- l) Each camera shall have a clear and unobstructed view of the area of desired coverage.
- m) Cameras shall be positioned to capture "Head and Shoulder" images at exits, entrances and point of sale locations.

Digital Video Recorder Monitors

- n) Each system shall have a monitor that may be accessed by the Police Department and other law enforcement agencies for viewing of the recorded images.
- o) The monitor shall be of a Liquid Crystal Display (LCD) design with a screen no smaller than fifteen diagonal inches.

Power Supply

- p) Each system shall have a dedicated power source to prevent intentional or accidental deactivation and preferably provided with Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS).

SECTION 11. - MINIMUM COVERAGE STANDARDS, SITE ASSESSMENT, SIGNAGE. –

- (a) The video surveillance system shall have, at a minimum, separate cameras dedicated to each register/check-out stand, entrance/exit, and parking lot or area designated for customer and/or employee parking use.



- (b) The placement of cameras included in video surveillance systems required under this Ordinance shall be approved by the Police Department.
- (c) The City Police Director or his/her designee will conduct an assessment of each site required to install a video surveillance system prior to installation, and upon approval will issue an approval notice which will be placed in plain view inside the premises. This approval notice will also inform customers and employees of the existence of the video surveillance system. A separate notice of the video surveillance system, in a form acceptable to the City Police Director, shall be placed in the parking area.

SECTION 12. - INSPECTIONS. - The video surveillance system shall be subject to regular inspection by the City Police Director or his/her designee, who is authorized to inspect at reasonable times any video surveillance system to determine if the system conforms with this Ordinance. If the video surveillance system does not so conform, establishments must take immediate steps to bring the system back into conformance.

section 13. - ENFORCEMENT; CIVIL PENALTIES -

- A. Establishments subject to the mandatory requirements of this Ordinance shall have six (6) months from its effective date to comply with the regulations set forth in this Ordinance.
- B. The violation of any provision of this Ordinance by any owner or principal operator of establishments subject to this Ordinance shall result in a notice of violation from the City Police Director or his designee. The City Police Director is authorized to investigate all alleged violations. Violators shall have 30 days after receipt of the notice to provide proof of compliance to the COCPO. If the violation continues after the 30-day period, the City Police Director or designee shall issue a citation against the violator and the violator shall pay a civil penalty not to exceed ₱5,000. The city legal office is hereby authorized to bring a civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction to recover such civil penalties.
- C. In addition to the foregoing, the violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and contrary to the public interest and shall, at the discretion of the city, create a cause of action for injunctive relief and recommend cancellation or non-renewal of business permit issued.
- D. For purposes of this Ordinance, each day that a violation continues shall be a separate violation.

SECTION 14. - EXEMPTIONS. - A business or agency which is required to install a video surveillance system may, on an annual basis, apply to the City Police Director or his/her designee for exemption from the provisions of this Ordinance. The City Police Director or his/her designee may exempt a business or agency for a period of twelve months if he/she finds that the business has or will undertake alternate security procedures which are substantially equal to or more effective in preventing criminal activity and in assisting in the apprehension of the perpetrators of crime or for the protection of employees. Such an exemption shall carry a maximum duration of twelve months, and a business or agency must reapply for an exemption at the end of the exemption period or bring the system into conformance with this Ordinance. The City Police Director or his/her designee may also authorize temporary extensions of time for installation when a business or agency demonstrates that it is temporarily unable to comply for good cause shown.

SECTION 15. - APPEAL PROCESS.

- A. Any establishment or agency found to be in violation of this Ordinance by the City Police Director or his/her designee shall have the right to a hearing before the City Mayor or his/her designee.
- B. The City Police Director or his/her designee shall give the applicant written notice of the violation. The notice shall set forth the grounds for the violation, and shall inform the owner or principal business operator of the establishment or agency head that he/she has ten (10) days from the date of mailing of the notice to file a written request for a hearing.
- C. Within ten (10) days of mailing of the written notice of violation by the City Police Director or his/her designee, the owner or principal business operator or agency head may appeal by requesting a hearing before the City Mayor. Such a request must be made in writing and must set forth the specific grounds for the appeal. If the applicant files a timely request for a hearing, the City Mayor or his/her designee.
- D. He/she shall set a time and place for the hearing within ten days thereafter. All parties involved shall have the right to offer testimonial, documentary and tangible evidence bearing on the issues, to be represented by counsel, and to confront and cross-examine any witness against them. The decision of the City Mayor or his/her designee to deny the application shall be in writing and shall be rendered within one week of the hearing.

SECTION 16. - SEVERABILITY. - If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 17. - EFFECTIVITY. - This ordinance shall take effect after fifteen (15) days following its publication in a local newspaper of general circulation.

ORDINANCE NO. 12841-2014

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING ALL HIGH RISK BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT, AS DEFINED, TO HIRE OR ENGAGE THE SERVICES OF DULY LICENSED SECURITY GUARDS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Whereas, data showed that robbery incidents in the City of Cagayan de Oro occurred more often in those establishments with no security guards;

Whereas, hiring security guards will provide every establishment with twenty-four/seven (24/7) protection from criminals;

Whereas, companies can contribute to the City's peace and order campaign by hiring security guards who will assist the Cagayan de Oro Police within their perimeter;

Whereas, security guards serve as force multiplier within their area of responsibility and adjoining places in terms of visibility to preempt the commission of crime as well as contribute to the intelligence network of the police;

Whereas, in fact in Cebu City, the City Mayor thereat ordered the closure of an establishment following the spate of robberies involving its outlets after not heeding the warning to invest in its security;

Whereas, the approval of this Ordinance will give the City Mayor absolute legal basis for the purpose and not merely rely on the broad definition of "police power" to address the alarming robbery of high-risk establishments in the City;

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council (*Sangguniang Panlungsod*) of the City of Cagayan de Oro in session assembled that:

SECTION 1. DEFINITION OF TERMS – The definitions and provisions contained in this section shall govern the construction, meaning, and application of the following words and phrases used in this Ordinance, to wit:

- High risk establishments – shall refer to establishments such as but not limited to banks, lending institutions, pawnshops, money changer shops, internet cafes, gasoline stations, lotto outlets, money couriers and remittance centers, convenience/grocery stores, restaurants, shopping malls, schools and entertainment bars, which are prone or susceptible to incidence of robbery and theft per documentation by the Cagayan de Oro City Police Office (COCPO).
- Security Guard – a person employed to protect something, especially a building, against intruders or damage who is a member of the Philippine Association of Detective and Protective Agency Operators (PADPAO) and duly licensed by the Philippine National Police.
- Internet Café – a place or business that provides internet access to the public, usually for a time-based fee and with not less than 40 computer units.
- Convenience Store – a store that stocks a range of everyday items such as groceries, snack foods, candy, toiletries, soft drinks, tobacco products, and newspapers, and are licensed to sell alcohol, typically beer and wine; operating on long shopping hours or open 24 hours.

SECTION 2. HIRING. – All high risk establishments, as defined, are hereby mandated to hire or engage the services of security guards who are members of the Philippine Association of Detective and Protective Agency Operators (PADPAO) and duly licensed by the Philippine National Police.

SECTION 3. ENFORCEMENT. – It shall be the duty of the Cagayan de Oro City Police Director to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance and recommend to the City Mayor the imposition of penalties hereof to establishments in violation of this Ordinance. Establishments subject to the mandatory requirements of this Ordinance shall have one (1) month from its effective date to comply with regulations set forth in this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. – If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY. – This Ordinance shall take effect after fifteen days following its publication in a local newspaper of general circulation.

This is in response to your endorsement dated 10 September 2018 seeking for review and legal opinion relative to the proposed ordinance, entitled: *"an ordinance declaring every June 25th of each year as Arbor Day in the City of Cagayan de Oro, and for other purposes"*.

In this connection, kindly be informed that this Office has thoroughly reviewed the above-mentioned proposed Ordinance and the following observation is respectfully forwarded:

1. Sec. 5. Arbor Day Committee

Sec. 3 of Republic Act No. 10176¹ (R.A. No. 10176) provides for the preferred members of the Arbor Day Committee, which were not included in the Ordinance, without prejudice to the authority given to the City Mayor to expand the membership of the Arbor Day Committee.

The following government agencies not included in the proposed ordinance, but provided by R.A. No. 10176 are the

following (with their corresponding functions provided in the footnotes as provided by the IRR of R.A. No. 10176):

- A. Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR);²
- B. Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR);³
- C. Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH);⁴
- D. Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP);⁵ and
- E. Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA).⁶

Aside from the foregoing observation, kindly be informed that this Office has thoroughly reviewed the above-mentioned document and finds the application legally sound and thus pose no legal objection to the same.

Thus, should the City Government find the terms and conditions in the Agreement amenable and for the best interests of the City Government, and assuming that the City can fully comply with it, then this Office recommends that the Agreement be duly endorsed to the Honorable Members of the City Council for their favorable consideration, with a request for an Ordinance authorizing the City Mayor to enter into and sign the same, pursuant to Sec. 455 (1) (vi)⁷ of

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 2018-185

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING EVERY 4TH OF JULY OF EACH YEAR AS ARBOR DAY OR DAY FOR TREE PLANTING IN THE CITY OF CAGAYAN DE ORO, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Introduced by Councilor Edna M. Dahino

~~WHEREAS~~, Republic Act no. 10176, entitled: “An Act Reviving the Observance of Arbor Day by Authorizing the Local Government Units the Responsibilities for Celebrating the Day for Tree Planting as an Annual Event”, mandates that LGUs declare or proclaim an Arbor Day or Tree Planting Day at a fixed date every calendar year as shall be deemed conducive to the proper tune and season for planting trees within their respective localities;

~~WHEREAS~~, it behooves the City Government of Cagayan de Oro to declare its own Arbor Day or Tree Planting Day;

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED by the 18th City Council (*Sangguniang Panlungsod*) in session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. TITLE – This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the Arbor Day Ordinance of Cagayan de Oro City.

SECTION 2. DECLARATION – Every 4th of July of each year is hereby declared as Arbor Day or Tree Planting Day in the City of Cagayan de Oro.

SECTION 3. PUBLIC WORKING HOLIDAY – To ensure the participation of the different sectors of society, the City Mayor is hereby authorized to proclaim Arbor Day as a public working holiday, pursuant to Section 4 of Republic Act No. 10176, otherwise known as the Arbor Day Act of 2012.

SECTION 4. REQUIREMENT – All able-bodied residents of the City, who are at least twelve (12) years of age, shall be required to plant one (1) tree every year.

SECTION 5. ARBOR DAY COMMITTEE – There is hereby created the Cagayan de Oro City Arbor Day Celebration Committee, which shall be composed as follows:

- a) Chairperson of the City Council Committee on Environment and Natural Resources;
- b) City SK Federation President;
- c) Liga ng mga Barangay President;
- d) Department Head of the City Local Environment and Natural Resources Office (CLENRO);
- e) City Agriculturist;
- f) City Engineer;
- g) City Tourism Officer;
- h) City Information Officer;
- i) City Administrator.
- j) Representative of the Cagayan de Oro City Schools Division;
- k) City DILG Officer;
- l) Representative of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED)-10;
- m) Representative of the Department of Agriculture-10;
- n) Representative of the Bureau of Plant Industry-10;
- o) City Police Director of COCPO;
- p) Representative of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources Office-Regional Office No. 10;
- q) Representative of the Department of Agrarian Reform-Regional Office No. 10;
- r) Representative of the Department of Public Works and Highways-Regional Office No. 10;
- s) Representative of the 4th Infantry Division, Philippine Army;
- t) Representative of the Philippine Coconut Authority-Regional Office No. 10.

The City Mayor in his Executive Order for the constitution of the Arbor Day Committee may expand the membership thereof by including representatives from other government agencies, civic organizations engaged in environmental protection, and media associations in the city.

SECTION 6. FUNCTIONS OF THE ARBOR DAY COMMITTEE – To ensure the successful implementation of this Ordinance, the Arbor Day Committee shall:

- a) Specify the area within the City to be planted or reforested, which shall include but not limited to the following:
 - i. Public school grounds, gardens or other available areas within the school premises;
 - ii. Idle or vacant public lands;
 - iii. Public parks or Eco parks in urban and rural areas;
 - iv. Private schools, parks and lands with consent of the owner thereof;
 - v. Watershed Areas;
 - vi. Riverbanks; and
 - vii. Road shoulders.
- b) Prepare the budget for the tree planting activity;
- c) Conduct information dissemination activities.

SECTION 7. BARANGAY ARBOR DAYS - Notwithstanding the participation of the city's barangays in the City Arbor Day, the barangay councils in the City may declare their respective barangay arbor day celebration on different dates to afford flexibility in planning and implementing tree planting programs to adjust to the proper time and period of the year most suited to the trees selected to be planted in their respective areas, or to coincide with barangay occasions like fiesta or barangay day, and as their budgetary allotments may allow.

SECTION 8. DUTIES OF BARANGAY OFFICIALS – It shall be the duty and responsibility of barangay officials to maintain the trees planted during the Arbor Day Celebration within their respective areas of jurisdiction.

SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION – There shall be allocated in the Annual Budget of the City Local Environment and Natural Resources Office (CLENRO) so much amount necessary, as will be recommended by the Arbor Day Committee, for the effective implementation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 10. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS – The Arbor Day Celebration Committee shall formulate the Implementing Rules and Regulations to effectively implement the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 11. SEVERABILITY – If any provision of this Ordinance or any part thereof be declared, invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 12. SEPARABILITY – All ordinances, local orders and other issuances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby modified, amended or repealed accordingly.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVITY – This Ordinance shall take effect after fifteen (150 days following its publication in a local newspaper of general circulation and posting in conspicuous public places in the City.

REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10176

AN ACT REVIVING THE OBSERVANCE OF ARBOR DAY BY AUTHORIZING THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS THE RESPONSIBILITIES FOR CELEBRATING THE DAY FOR TREE PLANTING AS AN ANNUAL EVENT

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Arbor Day Act of 2012".

Section 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature. Towards this end, the vital role and importance of trees in ecological stability is recognized. Hence, there is a need for a collaborated effort between the State and its citizenry to combat the loss of our natural resources and rejuvenate our environment by undertaking nationwide tree planting activities and providing effective measures for their maintenance and sustainability.

It is hereby mandated that all provinces, cities and municipalities with their component barangays shall be required to revive, by appropriate proclamation of their respective local chief executives, an Arbor Day at an appropriate fixed date every calendar year as shall be deemed suitable according to the proper time and season for planting trees in the respective provinces and their respective component municipalities or cities concerned. Although adoption of uniform dates for every province and its component municipalities and cities shall be encouraged, varying dates for Arbor Day celebrations may be permitted in order to afford flexibility in planning and in implementing tree planting programs to adjust to the proper time and period of the year most suited to the trees selected to be planted, and as local budgetary allotments shall allow.

Section 3. Creation of Arbor Day Committee. – In implementing the intents of this Act, there shall be created in every province, city and municipality in the country an Arbor Day Celebration Committee the composition of which shall be selected by the concerned local chief executive. The members shall preferably, composed of field officers of various government agencies, based in the locality, but not limited to the following:

- (a) Local sanggunian;
- (b) Local Environment and Natural Resources Office;
- (c) Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR);
- (d) Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI);
- (e) Department of Education (DepED);

- (f) Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG);
- (g) Commission on Higher Education (CHED);
- (h) Department of Agriculture (DA);
- (i) Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR);
- (j) Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH);
- (k) Department of Tourism (DOT);
- (l) Philippine National Police (PNP);
- (m) Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP);
- (n) Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA);
- (o) Civic organizations;
- (p) Sangguniang Kabataan (SK);
- (q) Liga ng mga Barangay (LnB); and
- (r) Media associations.

Section 4. *Proclamation of Arbor Day.* – All provinces, cities and municipalities with their component barangays shall be required to declare an Arbor Day or Tree Planting Day, by appropriate proclamation of their respective local chief executive through an ordinance passed by the respective local sanggunian, at a fixed date every calendar year as shall be deemed conducive to the proper time and season for planting trees in the respective localities. Although adoption of uniform dates for its celebration shall be encouraged, varying dates may be allowed in order to afford flexibility in the planning and implementing of the programs for tree planting: *Provided, That* the Arbor Day designated shall be declared as a public working holiday in order to ensure the participation of the different sectors of society and such declaration may be embodied in the proclamation that local chief executives are authorized to do under this Act.

Section 5. *Funding.* – The local sanggunian shall provide for the allocation of resources pertinent to the implementation of this Act at their respective local government level.

Section 6. *Information and Monitoring.* – For information and monitoring purposes, all local government units (LGUs) shall submit to the DILG the actual date of the Arbor Day Celebration in their respective locality.

Section 7. *Supply and Distribution of Seedlings.* – The BPI, in coordination with the PCA, shall supply and distribute the seedlings to the LGUs for the Tree Planting Program.

Section 8. *Planting of Trees.* – All able-bodied citizens of the Philippines, who are at least twelve (12) years of age, shall be required to plant one (1) tree every year.

Section 9. *Areas Covered by Tree Planting.* – The local Arbor Day Celebrations Committee shall specify the area within the LGU to be planted or reforested. If the area to be planted or reforested is a protected area or a protection forest, the Committee shall encourage the use of endemic or indigenous species during the observance of the Arbor Day designated by the LGU.

The tree planting activities shall be done in any of the following areas:

- (a) Public school grounds, gardens or other available areas within the school premises;
- (b) Idle or vacant public lands;
- (c) Public parks in urban and rural areas; and
- (d) Private schools, parks and lands with the consent of the owner thereof.

Section 10. *Maintenance of Trees.* – The barangay officials and deputized nongovernmental organizations shall be responsible for the maintenance of such trees.

Section 11. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The DILG, in coordination with the LGUs, the DENR and the DA shall promulgate the rules and regulations to effectively implement the provisions of this Act.

Section 12. *Separability Clause.* – If any provision of this Act or any part thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions not affected thereby shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 13. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, presidential decrees, proclamations, executive orders or regulations and other issuances inconsistent with the provisions and/or purposes of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

Section 14. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days following its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 129-15

An order adopting the Program on Awards and Incentives for Service Excellence (PRAISE) of the City Government of Cagayan de Oro and providing policies and guidelines, thereto.

WHEREAS, Art. II, Sec. provides that "the State shall maintain honesty and integrity in the public service and take positive and effective measure against graft and corruption";

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that "every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefore, as well as the powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare";

WHEREAS, the city government under the present administration is committed to professionalize the bureaucracy;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Rule X of the Omnibus Rules Implementing Book V of Executive Order 292 and CSC MC No. 01 s., 2001 as revised under CSC Resolution No. 010112 there is a need for the city government to adopt the Program on Awards and Incentives for Service Excellence (PRAISE).

NOW, THEREFORE, I, OSCAR S. MORENO, by the virtue of the powers vested in me as City Mayor of Cagayan de Oro City, do hereby adopt the Program on Awards and Incentives for Service Excellence (PRAISE) of the City Government of Cagayan de Oro.

I. Objectives

A. General:

To recognize and award officials and employees of the City Government of Cagayan de Oro, individually or in groups for their suggestions, innovative ideas, inventions, discoveries, superior accomplishments, heroic deeds, exemplary behavior, extraordinary acts or services in the public interest and other personal efforts which contribute to the efficiency, economy, and improvement in government operations, which lead to organizational productivity.

B. Specific

1. To establish a mechanism for identifying, selecting, rewarding and providing incentives to deserving employees at the start of each year;
2. To identify outstanding accomplishments, best practices or employees on a continuing basis;

3. To recognize and reward accomplishments and innovations periodically or as the need arises;
4. To encourage creativity, innovativeness, efficiency, economy, or other improvements in government operations, or for other extraordinary acts or services in the public interest;
5. To provide both monetary and non-monetary awards and incentives to recognize, acknowledge and reward productive, creative, innovative, and ethical behavior of employees through formal and informal mode;
6. To foster among the officials and employees in the different departments of the city government, awareness and desire to maintain exemplary performance and superior accomplishments.

II. Scope

The system shall apply to all officials and employees in the career or non-career service of the city government whether or not they receive compensation, regardless of amount.

III. Policies

1. The program shall adhere to the principle of providing incentives and awards based on performance, innovative ideas and exemplary behavior.
2. The program shall give emphasis on the timeliness or giving awards or recognition. Aside from the conferment of awards during the traditional or planned awarding ceremonies, the spirit of on-the-spot grant of recognition shall be institutionalized.
3. The program shall provide both monetary and non monetary awards and incentives to recognize, acknowledge and reward productive, creative, innovative, and ethical behavior or employees through formal and informal mode.

IV. Definition of Terms

Award - recognition which may be monetary or non-monetary conferred on individual or group of individuals for ideas, suggestions, inventions, discoveries, superior accomplishments, exemplary behavior, heroic deeds, extraordinary acts or services in the public interest which contribute to the efficiency, economy, improvement in government operations which lead to organizational productivity.

Career - positions in the civil service characterized by (1) entrance based on merit and fitness to be determined as far as practicable by competitive examination, or based on highly technical qualifications; (2) opportunity for advancement to higher career positions; and (3) security of tenure.

Contribution - any input which can be in the form of an idea or performance.

Discovery - is the uncovering of something previously existing but found or learned for the first time which will improve public service delivery.

Idea type contribution - refers to an idea, a suggestion or an invention or discovery for improvement to effect economy in operation, to increase production and improve working conditions.



Incentive - monetary or non-monetary motivation or privilege given to an official or employee for contributions, suggestions, inventions, ideas, satisfactory accomplishment or demonstration of exemplary behavior based on agreed performance standards and norms or behavior.

Invention - the creation of something previously non-existent which will benefit the government.

Non-career - positions expressly declared by law to be in the non-career service; or those whose entrance in the service is characterized by (1) entrance on bases other than those of the usual tests of merit and fitness utilized for the career service and (2) tenure which is limited to the duration of a particular project for which purpose employment was made.

Performance type contribution - refers to the performance of an extraordinary act or service in the public interest in connection with, or related to one's official employment; or outstanding community service or heroic acts in the public interest; or sustained work performance for a minimum period of one year which is over and above the normal position requirement of the individual or group.

Suggestion - idea or proposal which improves work performance, systems and procedures and economy in operations that benefit the government.

System - the awards and incentives program for employees of the city government.

Group - two or more individuals bound by a common objective, a task force, a technical group or a special working team, formed/created/organized formally or informally to undertake certain projects/programs. Maximum membership for both Presidential Lingkod Bayan and Civil Service Commission or Pagasa Awards group/team shall not exceed 10 employees.

The group/team should have demonstrated teamwork/camaraderie shown by constant communication, coordination, cooperation, and cohesiveness among its members. Each group/team member should have verifiable/actual contribution in the attainment of the group/team's accomplishment.

Productivity Incentive - is given to employees who have performed at least satisfactorily for the year covered in accordance with the agency's CSC-approved SPMS. This incentive shall follow relevant existing guidelines.

V. Categories of Awards

Initially, the following awards shall be given due consideration. The PRAISE Committee shall develop and propose policies and guidelines in the selection or screening of the candidates:

A. Awards for Outstanding Work Performance

Presidential Lingkod Bayan (PLB) Award - conferred to an individual or group of individuals for exceptional or extraordinary contributions resulting from an idea or performance that had nationwide impact on public interest, security and patrimony. The contribution may be a suggestion, innovation, invention or superior accomplishment.



Civil Service Commission Pagasa (Pagasa) Award - conferred to an individual or group of individuals for outstanding contribution/s resulting from an idea or performance that directly benefit more than one department of the government.

B. Award for Exemplary Conduct and Ethical Behavior

Outstanding Public Officials and Employees Award or Dangal ng Bayan (DnB) - conferred to an individual for performance of an extraordinary act or public service and consistent demonstration of exemplary ethical behavior on the basis of his/her observance of the eight norms of behavior provided under RA No. 6713.

VI. Types of Rewards and Incentives

The following types of incentives shall be regularly awarded to deserving employees:

1. Length of Service Incentive
2. Productivity Incentive
3. Career and Self-Development Incentive
5. Personnel Motivation Incentive

Length of Service Incentive - shall be given to an employee who has rendered at least three years of continuous satisfactory service in a particular position and which shall consist of step-increments in accordance with the provisions of Joint CSC-DBM Circular No. 1, s. 1990.

Productivity Incentive - shall be given to regular, casual and contractual employees having a employee-employer relationship which salaries are charged to the lump sum appropriation under PS, or occupying position in the DBM-approved contractual Staffing Pattern with Satisfactory Performance Rating based on the Civil Service Commission (CSC) approved Strategic Performance System (SPMS).

Career and Self-Development Incentive - shall be granted in recognition of an individual who satisfactorily completed a course or degree within or outside the country at one's own expense. A plaque of recognition may be given to qualified individuals during the City Charter Day.

Personnel Motivation Incentive - shall be granted to all officials and employees in recognition for the improvement in the quality of public service rendered, which has become more responsive and client oriented. The recognition of employees is based on individual performance rating.

VII. Forms of Awards and Incentives

Compensatory Time-off - shall be granted to employees who rendered services beyond regular working hours due to the exigency of the service determined by the Head of Office and supported with an issuance of an Office Order specifying the date and time of rendition of overtime, and it's purpose.

Personal Growth Opportunities - relevant scholarships and training granted to government employees for career growth and organizational development.



Trophics, Plaques and Certificates - shall be granted to employee in the government in recognition of his/her exemplary work performance and accomplishments that contributed to the growth of the organization and community.

Monetary Award - shall be granted to employee/s whose contribution in terms of suggestions and invention or performance of functions results in monetary savings. When an employee's contribution cannot be quantified in terms of monetary savings, or results in combined monetary savings and intangible benefits, the amount of cash award shall be determined in terms of a certain percentage of its estimated total value or benefit but not to exceed twenty percent (20%).

Monetary Award for Service - shall be granted to an employee who has completed at least ten (10) years of continuous and satisfactory service in the government. This service award shall consist of cash bonus and lapel emblem or loyalty pin differentiated as follow:

- 10 and 15 years - bronze service pin
- 20 and 25 years - silver service pin
- 30, 35 and 40 years - gold service pin

Other Incentives, as maybe recommended by the PRAISE Committee

VIII. PRAISE Committee

The PRAISE Committee is hereby created and shall be composed of the following:

1. The City Mayor
2. Ms. Ma. Dulce C. Baculio, OIC HRMO
3. Engr. Isidro R. Borja, City Planning & Development Coordinator
4. Atty. Percy G. Salazar, City Budget Officer
5. Atty. Beda Joy B. Elot, City Accountant
6. Two representatives of the career rank and file employees to be designated or elected by the assembly

The Committee shall perform the following tasks:

1. Formulate, adopt and amend internal rules, policies and procedures to govern the conduct of its activities which shall include the guidelines in evaluating the nominees and the mechanism for recognizing the awardees;
2. Monitor and review existing system of incentives and awards and recommends other forms of incentives and awards as maybe necessary;
3. Monitor implementation of approved suggestions and ideas through feedback and reports;
4. Prepare plans, identify resources and propose budget for the system on an annual basis;
5. Develop, produce, distribute a system policy manual and orient the employees on the same;
6. Document best practices, innovative ideas and success stories which will serve as promotional materials to sustain interest and enthusiasm;
7. Submit an annual report on the awards and incentives system to the Civil Service Commission on or before the thirtieth of January;



8. Monitor and evaluate the system's implementation every year and make essential improvements to ensure its suitability to the city government;
9. Address issues and concerns relative to awards and incentives within fifteen (15) days from the date of submission

The Human Resource Management Officer shall serve as the Secretariat of the Committee. The HRMO, however, must see to it that contents of this Executive Order be implemented.

IX. Funding

As mandated, the city shall allocate at least 5% of the Human Resource funds for the PRAISE and incorporate the same in their annual budget.

XI Effectivity

This order shall be effective immediately and subject to the action of the Civil Service Commission.

XI. Commitment

I hereby commit to implement and abide by the provisions of this AGENCY PRAISE which shall be the basis for the grant of awards and incentives including Productivity Incentive Bonus.

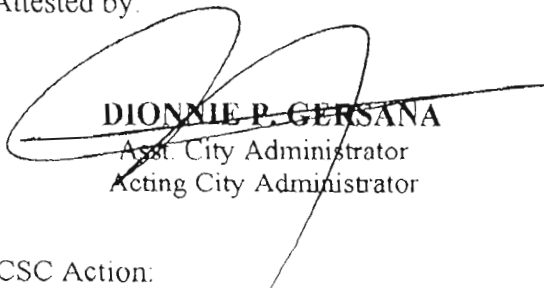
